MR. HAZEN'S GERRYMANDER

A thorough redistribution of electoral districts—Dominion, provincial and municipal—has long been needed, not only in New Brunswick but in the other provinces as well. The successful rearrangements heretofore made have not resulted in anything like an equitable division. In Counties, each parish has generally the same number of Councilors, utterly regardless of the disparity of population among those parishes. This should be remedied by allowing more representation to the more populous districts and less to the thinly-peopled sections. For Dominion elections, the number of members allowed to each province is fairly apportioned after each decennial census; but there rarely is any honest attempt made to have each province divided into constituencies of equal population. By the census of 1901, the unit of representation in the House of Commons was fixed at about 25,000 and New Brunswick's contingent was accordingly reduced to thirteen. But within the province, there is a very great difference between some of the constituencies. For example the 11,000 people of Beauséjour, the 12,000 of Queens-Sunbury; the 5,000 of Kings-Albert; and the 4,000 of Westmorland, were each allotted one member of parliament. In all cases this inequality could have been rectified. In the case of Queens-Sunbury and Kings-Albert, which together had just the right population for two members, all that was required was to annex enough of Western Kings to Queens-Sunbury to make the two districts equal. For provincial elections, the unit of representation is about 12,500. The 21,000 people of Victoria and Madawaska however, have four members between them instead of three; the 1,500 of Sunbury have two members instead of one, while the 4,000 of Westmorland have four representatives instead of five; and the 4,000 of St. John City have four legislators instead of five. Any redistribution of provincial seats made before the census of 1911 should take two members off Victoria-Madawaska and Sunbury and add them to St. John City and Westmorland. Now, Mr. Hazen's Redistribution bill does not propose a fair and impartial division of the whole province, but merely proposes to separate Moncton City from the rest of Westmorland and give it the member allowing the County of Charlotte. The setting apart of Moncton, as was done by the late Premier Bligh, to St. John City, is a proper move; but so also would be the separation of Fredericton from York and of Charlottetown and its environs from Northumberland, neither of which is to be done however. But Moncton, which is growing much more rapidly in population than the rest of Westmorland County, having now about 12,000 is entitled to two members and the rest of the County to three; the increase of one member for these two districts is equalized by the popping out of one member from the Premier's own constituency of Sunbury. But no such equalization and justice is contemplated. Mr. Hazen has not at all concerned with the fairness of the present method of electoral division. He knows that, while Westmorland County may be dependent upon to elect a full Liberal ticket, the Liberal majority usually comes in, firstly from the city of Moncton, the parishes outside the city being so equally divided in sentiment that sometimes one party wins and sometimes the other, the majority in either case being very small. By his new scheme Mr. Hazen hopes to fix Westmorland so that the Conservatives can elect the three members allotted to that county, completing the Liberals to the one city seat. But in York where four Conservatives hold the Provincial seats, and the city of Fredericton is fit apt to elect a Liberal as it is to choose a Conservative, nothing is said about dividing the city from the county. This shows Mr. Hazen's hypocrisy, and it shows the Moncton bill to be a gerrymander pure and simple. As there is no likelihood of a provincial election being held before 1912, the fair and honorable way would have been to let the whole matter of representation lie over until after the census of 1911 shows the new figures of population, and then to make a thorough impartial division, setting aside in new constituencies both Moncton

DEPOSED SULTAN NOW A PRISONER

Sent Under Guard to Castle With a Few Wives and Attendants.

LIFE WILL BE SPARED.

CONSTANTINOPLE, April 28.—The former ruler of the empire, Abdul Hamid II. is to be kept a prisoner in a large house with walled grounds on a height overlooking Saloski, which has lately been occupied by the Italian commandant of the International Gendarmes. He is not to be put on trial, as has been widely reported. Constantinople for he is considered to be above the law. It was thought wise to keep the deposed sultan in European Turkey, remote from the capital. His household will be administered for him upon a generous scale and his life will be safeguarded as he earnestly sought when notified of his dethronement. Abdul Hamid II. with four wives, five daughters and two of his younger sons, two eunuchs and a comparatively large number of female servants, was taken from the Yildiz Palace last night and started under an escort to Saloski. The party proceeded by steam launches to the landing near the railway and a special train on which they were lodged left at 2 o'clock in the morning. The constitutionalists would like to get back part of the great sums of money that he former sultan is supposed to have hoarded, not only because the government is in need of money, but because it is desirable that he should be deprived of the resources for another coup d'etat. Speculation places Abdul Hamid's wealth at anything between \$25,000,000 and \$30,000,000. The city is illuminated tonight and general rejoicing continues. Although this was a holiday court marshals were held and several of the principals in the mutiny of the troops were sentenced to death. Later they were taken outside the walls of the city and shot. Prince Salih Edin, the nephew of the sultan, who was arrested on suspicion of being implicated in the rising, has been liberated, and his release has caused a good impression. The streets of the capital are filled with Macedonian volunteers. They are being fed by the citizens at the coffee houses and restaurants which are falling overboard. A brisk business is being done in the sale of pictures of the sultan and miniature flags inscribed "Liberty, fraternity, equality and justice." Hodja Bey, who has not been seen in recent days, are now reappearing in the public places and conditions are assuming a normal aspect. GRAHAM TELLS WHY G.T.R. MUST HURRY More Than 12,000,000 Acres Homesteaded Along The Line BUSINESS INCREASING.

OTTAWA, April 28—With the budget assigned to the custody of history the commons today got back to the question of making a loan to complete the construction of the Transcontinental project. He said that in 1903 the prime minister estimated the cost of the 'Mountain' section to be \$18,000,000 and the latest information was that the cost would be \$27,000,000. While Canada should be backward in dealing with transportation questions it was right to emphasize the position of the Grand Trunk Pacific. Not only must the company get itself into difficulties, but it would not unlikely get the government into difficulties in the near future. He believed the acceptance would ultimately be a success, but there were some risks and the government was assuming nine-tenths of them and the company only one-tenth. The proportion did not seem equitable.

HOUSE PROROGUED THURSDAY NIGHT.

Many Bills Considered and Some Very Important Legislation Passed. THE VALLEY ROAD.

FREDERATION, April 28—House prorogued tonight after considering one hundred and fourteen bills and passing one hundred and two. A discussion today was centered upon the bill providing for the erection of the city of Moncton into a separate electoral district. Robinson, Stoney and Legor spoke against the measure but expressed confidence in their re-election. The bill also provided for the abolition of non-voting members between the city and county of St. John. The bill was carried without division. The House divided on the bill providing for the retirement of factory inspectors at seventy years of age as carried by a vote of 27 to 11. Mr. Bouchard voted with the opposition. The Premier announced negotiations for the construction of the St. John Valley railway would be actively taken up during the recess with a view to have legislators at Ottawa and Fredericton provide for it next session. Palling Dominion assistance he would try and have a company of large financial ability take it up.

MONCTON, April 28—A great deal of fault was found with the police here for not arresting the druggist Mr. Holstead for violation of the Scott Act, at there was a judgment hanging over him. But now they have not a word to say on that score as Holstead has been taken to jail. He has been successful in dodging the police and therefore would not be secured till last Saturday.
