



Sir John Thompson introduced a bill to amend the franchise act, explaining that when the dominion voters' lists were issued revising officers to prepare supplementary lists containing additions or subtractions from the lists as sent to him from the government printing office. When these supplementary lists are printed, they will be returned to the re-vising officers, who are to post them up in prominent places, and fix a day for revision.
