MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN :

THEREAS it appears by Messages from His Excellency Preamble. the Right Honorable Charles Stanley Viscount Monck, Governor General of British North America, and Captain General and Governor in Chief in and over this Province of 5 Canada, and the Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the Civil Government of this Province and of the Public Service thereof, and other purposes, for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three and to make good 10 certain sums expended for the Public Service, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two :---May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of
