# ANATOMY, PHYSIOLOGY, SURGERY AND MEDICINE.

The MEDICAL LIBRARIES of the NEW WORLD are few and meagre, as compared with those of EUROPE, which are numerous and celebrated. The Profession in the United States are deeply indebted to Dr. Billings for his prolonged efforts towards the establishment at Washington of what is now perhaps the Most Complete Medical Library in the World, containing some 116,000 bound volumes, and nearly 200,000 pamphlets; the index comprising some twenty volumes, sixteen of which are completed. The first Medical Library in point of time, is that of the PENNSYLVANIA HOSPITAL, which was commenced as early as 1762, and has now some 15,000 volumes. That of the College of Physicians, at Philadelphia, was begun in 1788, and has been enriched from time to time by the munificence of Dr. S. Lewis. The institution now contains 49,000 volumes, and 28,000 pamphlets. The Library of the New York Hospital was founded in 1776, and contains upwards of 20,000 volumes.

The time has come when the DOCTORS OF DIVINITY should nnite with the DOCTORS OF Physic in the production of some specific for the purification of the moral senses of the inhabitants of the New World, otherwise there may be daager of the whole machine coming to grief by reason of dyspeptic dry rot produced through political corruption.
