Of nature or of art.

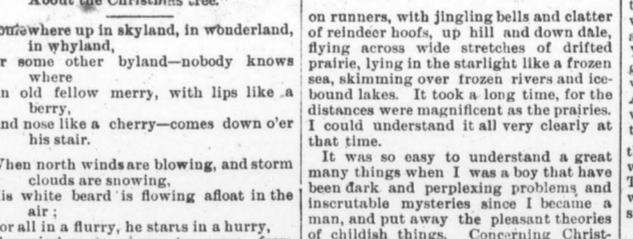
But when to arbor culture

raced from corner to the ground? I
could have proved it, too, if it hadn't
snowed that night and covered all the
tracks of reindeer and sleigh. Did I not
awake one night and hear subdued
laughter in the room where hung all our
clothes? Indeed I did. And so excited
was I that, instead of creeping softly
down the hall, I sprang from bed, and ran
padding to the door of the sitting-
room, and as I pushed it open did I not
hear the hurried rustling of robes and
scampering of feet? By the Sacred
Books of the Sybil and the Great
Pyramid, I do most distinctly remem-
ber that I saw Kris Kringle in the act.
I think one, indeed, I did see him. I
must have seen him, because my concep-
tion of him, indeed, my personal knowl-
