A SANITARY ASSOCIATION FOR TORONTO

At a preliminary meeting of influential residents of Montreal, held some time ago, it was resolved that a sanitary protection association should be formed on the model of those now in operation in London and Edinburgh.

In the first place there is to be no interference with the regular civic authorities. The association will not go beyond endeavoring to give them a good example by showing them what can be done if people like to try.

Not only will the work upon the sewerage be done, it is claimed, but such expense will be saved. "Floors are ripped up," says the circular, "excavations made, and other unnecessary work ordered to be done at the dictum of officials groping in the dark, at a household's expense, to find out a fault which a practical man would discover and remedy at less than half the cost and inconvenience to the proprietor or tenant."

Of course nothing can be done without money, and the privileges of membership of the Montreal association are to be obtained on payment of an entrance fee of five dollars, with a subsequent annual subscription of the same amount for continuing membership.

The engineer, at a convenient day and hour, will inspect his residence and report on its sanitary condition. If repairs are found necessary, an estimate of the probable cost will be furnished and the member can employ whomsoever he pleases to do the work.

Private individuals, either singly or as an association, can carry this work as far as connection with a city sewer, but no farther.
