Dr. H. H. Wright, 275 Sherbourne-street, said to The World yesterday: "Privies are one of the most fertile sources of dissemina-tion of typhoid and other diseases. Typhodi is caused by germs which pass through the body. Those germs are indestructible by any agency known at present except fice. They may be buried for a long time, and if dug up will cause typhoid. If they dry up as dust and are blown about by the wind they will cause typhoid.
