SOULIE MURDER TRIAL.  
THE CASE AGAINST MRS. GRAY FIRST HEARD.

Evidence Given as to the Finding of Scollie's Headless Corpse. The Result of the Post-Mortem and as to Threats to Have Been Entered by the Prisoner's Mother.

Peterboro, Sept. 28.—In an overcrowded courtroom the Peterboro Court Buildings, which overlook the pretty little court house park, Hattie Gray was today placed upon trial for the murder of David Scollie. Thomas Gray, who is also in custody on a charge of murder, was arraigned with his wife, but after pleading not guilty, was taken back to his cell. The Crown prosecutor, Mr. W. A. Stratton, is being defended by Mr. W. A. Stratton and Mr. R. R. Hall.

Story of the Crime. The history and the circumstances leading up to the alleged crime, briefly given by the Crown prosecutor, about the year 1888, David Scollie, an elderly bachelor, lived alone in a little house on a farm on the 11th line of Ontario, about three miles from Peterboro. There his nervous existence and hard labor in the fields, he entered into an agreement with Thomas and Hattie Gray, by which they were to remain in the village of Scollie, the consideration being that he was to allow them the use of his farm during the winter and that he was to be paid until the winter of 1889.

The Crown's theory is that Scollie was drugged by Mrs. Gray, after which she severed his head from the body and fired the house, with the double purpose of obliterating the evidence of her crime and of securing the insurance on an overvalued house.

When the court was called to order at 11:30 a. m., Mr. and Mrs. Gray, the defendant and her mother, were in Florida, were conducted to the prisoners' dock. Both pleaded not guilty, the female insisting that she was a very much clearer and firmer tone than her husband. When Mr. Clute lifted the child from its mother's embrace and taking it in his own arms, was led away back to his cell. Later in the day the babe was brought back by Mrs. Gray, who had a great part of the afternoon playing with it at its mother's feet.

The Engineer's Temporary Scheme to Obviate Another Rupture of the Conduit

Engineer Keating, accompanied by Acting Mayor Shaw, Chairman Lamb, Medical Health Officer Sheard and Prof. Shute, visited the conduit works yesterday.

The work of clearing the conduit from sand has so far progressed that there is a reasonable prospect that the work will be entirely finished this morning.
