QUARTERLY MEETING OF THE CHURCH SOCIETY.

The regular Quarterly Meeting of the Church Society was held in the Board Room on Wednesday, May 8th, 1867, at 11 a.m., the Lord Bishop of Niagara in the chair.

Present:—Ven. Archdeacon Palmer, Ven. Archdeacon Fuller, Very Rev. Dean Grasett, Rev. W. S. Darling, Rev. A. J. Fidler, Rev. J. H. McCollum, Rev. J. Hilton, Rev. F. L. Osler, Rev. Canon Brant, Rev. R. Arnold, Rev. Dr. Greene, Rev. A. J. Broughall, Rev. J. D. Cayley, Rev. E. R. Stimson, Rev. Dr. Lott, Rev. Canon Read, Rev. S. J. Boddy, Rev. S. B. Ardagh, Rev. The Provost of Trinity College, Rev. H. Holland, Rev. Canon Beaven, Rev. Dr. McMurray, Rev. Dr. O'Meara, Rev. S. Givins, Rev. T. P. Hodge, Rev. W. Belt, Rev. Canon Dixon, Rev. W. Grant, Rev. J. Davidson, Rev. T. T. Roberts, Rev. Canon Osler, Rev. J. Langtry, Rev. A. Williams, Professor Kingston, Col. O'Brien, Col. Armstrong, Messrs. J. W. Gamble, S. G. Wood, S. B. Harman, Charles Magrath, E. Hobson, George Moberly, C. J. Campbell, John Crawford, J. W. Brent, F. J. Joseph, John Duggan, Q. C., and G. T. Denison, jr.

After reading of prayers by the Rev. S. Givins, the minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

The resolutions of the Rev. H. Holland, with regard to the rectory lands, being the first order of the day, it was

Moved by Rev. H. Holland, seconded by S. B. Harman, Esq., That the resolutions submitted be referred to a Special Committee with instructions to consider and report on the same, with such amendments or additions as to them may seem meet, to a special meeting of the Society to be called by the President for the purpose of receiving the same, and that the following gentlemen compose such Committee, viz.: Ven. Archdeacon Palmer, Very Rev. Dean Grasett, Rev. Canon Read, Rev. H. Holland, Hon. J. H. Cameron, S. B. Harman, Esq., C. J. Campbell, Esq., R. A. Harrison, Esq.—*Carried.*

The Secretary presented a financial statement for the quarter ending 1st May, 1867—a statement of the returns from the several districts for the Students' Fund collection up to 1st May, 1867—a report of land sales since the last report of the land committee in April, 1866, and the report of the Standing Committee on the state of the work in the Society's office.

The usual Quarterly Report of the Executive Committee to the Clergy Trust Committee, was presented by the Chairman, J. W. Gamble, Esq.

A petition was presented from Mrs. Rothwell, widow of the late Rev. John Rothwell, praying for aid from the Widows and Orphans' Fund. The Standing Committee being of opinion that Mrs. Rothwell's application ought to be made to the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario,

It was moved by Von. Archdeacon Palmer, seconded by Rev. Dr. O'Meara, That the application of Mrs. Rothwell be referred back to the Standing Committee to consider whether a gratuity can be granted to that lady without contravening the rules of the Society.—*Carried.*

A letter was read from Rev. H. B. Wray, of Muskoka, asking when he might expect payment of the \$50 already granted towards the building of one of his churches, and if another \$50 would be allowed for a second church in his mission.

The Standing Committee having recommended that the consideration of Mr. Wray's application be postponed until there are funds, the Society adopted the recommendation.

The Rev. Canon Baldwin having stated that advantage had not been taken of the resolution passed at the last meeting of the Society loaning \$100 to Rev. H. B. Wray for one of his churches, the necessary funds having been procured by private subscription,

It was moved by Col. O'Brien, seconded by Rev. Canon Baldwin, That the order of the Society passed at the last quarterly meeting, authorizing a loan of \$100 to the missionary at Muskoka, out of the Leeming Fund, be rescinded; and that the sum of \$240 (or such sum as there may be) balance of the capital forming the Leeming Fund be invested for that fund—the amount to be taken from the first proceeds of the General Purpose Fund.—*Carried.*

A petition was presented from the vestry of the Church of St. John the Evangelist in Toronto, praying that the two acres of Victoria Square which were granted to the Church Society, and specially set apart for the purpose of having a church erected thereon, may be vested in the Churchwardens in trust for the Incumbent and Parish of said Church, as it is proposed to build a Parsonage on said land; and praying the Society to execute a Declaration of Trust to the Churchwardens to that effect, or grant the same by way of lease to them for a long period for the above mentioned purpose.

The Standing Committee having recommended that the petition be granted by making such conveyance or lease for the benefit of the Incumbent and Parish of St. John the Evangelist, as the Solicitor may approve:

The Society adopted the recommendation.

A letter was read from Rev. C. J. S. Bethune, Incumbent of St. Peter's Church, Springfield, Credit, applying on behalf of the Vestry of that Church for leave to sell the Globe lot for the benefit of the Parish:

Consideration of the application was postponed.

It having been stated to the meeting that certain lots in the Town of Barrie, which were granted by the Crown to the Church Society for the purpose of a burial ground, had been sold for taxes, and that an opportunity was offered of getting them back again; and the Standing Committee having recommended that the Solicitor's opinion be obtained as to whether land granted by the Crown for a burial ground is liable to sale for taxes (the case being that the land in question has never been occupied or enclosed either for that or any other purpose):

The Society adopted the recommendation.

A letter was read from Rev. T. P. Hodge, Rector of York Mills, and the Churchwardens of Davisville congregation, enclosing an offer for the purchase of an acre of ground and the school-house on the corner of Lot No. 2, concession 2, York, and recommending the sale of the lot, the proceeds to be applied to the erection of a Church on Yonge Street.

The Standing Committee having recommended that the Solicitor's opinion be obtained as to whether the land in question can be sold:

The Society adopted the recommendation.

A letter was read from Rev. I. Middleton of Streetsville, asking for a grant of Bibles and catechisms.

The Standing Committee having recommended that as Mr. Middleton has already this year received books to the amount of \$3, he be allowed \$7 additional:

The Society adopted the recommendation.

Mr. Rowse's account for the *Church Chronicle* for the year ending April, 1st 1867, amounting to \$107 20, having been presented.

It was moved by Ven. Archdeacon Palmer, seconded by Rev. Canon Brent, That the account of Mr. Rowse for the *Church Chronicle* be paid by the Secretary, and the Society looks to the Synod and the corporation of Trinity College to pay each a reasonable proportion of the amount.—*Carried.*

Mr. Rowse's account for books granted to Rev. J. Pentland, in October, 1864, amounting to \$8.71, was ordered to be paid.

The Standing Committee having recommended that one half of the grants to Churches be paid :

The Society adopted the recommendation.

The Meeting having adjourned for a short time, business was resumed at 2.20 p.m.

The Ven. Archdeacon Palmer in the Chair.

The Rev. H. C. Cooper, having obtained leave, presented the Report of the Committee on the list of the Non-Commuting Clergy. After some discussion, it was

Moved by the Provost of Trinity College, seconded by Rev. Canon Beaven,

That the Report of the Committee appointed to revise the list of the Non-Commuting Clergy be printed in the *Church Chronicle*, and be referred again to the Committee, with a view to their receiving objections against, it and correcting it so far as may be necessary, in order that it may be finally adopted at the August meeting.—*Carried.*

Moved by Ven. Archdeacon Fuller, seconded by Rev. A. J. Fidler,

That the Rev. Canon Beaven, D.D., Rev. the Provost of Trinity College, Rev. Dr. O'Meara, Rev. Canon Read, D.D., Rev. Canon Baldwin, M.A., Rev. Wm. Belt, and Rev. Alexander Williams, B.A., be the Book and Tract Committee for the present year.—*Carried.*

The Rev. Canon Baldwin having, in pursuance of notice given at the last meeting, moved,

That the 5th section of the by-law regulating the W. & O. Fund be amended, by adding after the words "five shillings" the words "or £10 in the sum before the expiration of the eight years, with interest thereon at six per cent. per annum from the time of his entering the Diocese;"—and a letter having been read from the Lord Bishop of Toronto, requesting the Society to re-consider the case of the Rev. Mr. Checkley; it was

Moved by Ven. Archdeacon Fuller, seconded by Rev. Canon Beaven,

That the Revs. H. C. Cooper, Canon Baldwin, and W. Belt, and Messrs. Harman and Magrath, be a Committee on the Widows and Orphans' By-Law, in accordance with the resolution passed at the last meeting of the Society, and that Mr. Cooper be the convener of said Committee.—*Carried.*

It was further moved by Col. O'Brien, seconded by Col. Armstrong,

That the Resolution proposed by the Rev. Canon Baldwin, together with his Lordship's letter on the subject of the Rev. Mr. Checkley, and any other papers on the subject, be referred to the Committee on the Widows and Orphans' Fund for their report thereon; also, the cases of the Rev. Messrs. Arnold and Morgan, as well as all other special cases to which the attention of the Committee may be called.—*Carried.*

The Rev. F. L. Osler having, in pursuance of notice given at the last meeting, moved, seconded by Rev. S. B. Ardagh,—That the opinion of the Solicitor of the Society, to whom the matter was referred, being that the proceeds of the Globe in Nottawasaga may be appropriated "to any Church erected in the township, or for the incumbent thereof," the resolution passed at the May Meeting of 1866 be rescinded, there being no Church in that village, and that the rents and proceeds of the said globe be appropriated to the Church of Cremore, and for the benefit of the incumbent thereof—it was

Moved in amendment by Geo. Moberly, Esq., seconded by John Duggan, Esq., Q.C.,

That all words from "rescinded" be omitted, and that the following words be substituted—"be carried out in its spirit, by appropriating the rents and proceeds of said globe to the incumbent of Collingwood, in whose mission the village of Nottawa is situated."

After much discussion, Mr. Moberly's amendment was put to the meeting, and carried on a division of 16 to 12.

In pursuance of notice given at the last meeting by A. Gaviller, Esq., it was moved by Col. O'Brien, seconded by Rev. Canon Beaven,

That the Mission Board be instructed to report to the Society, as to the mission work of the year, at its November meeting, that the said report may be printed. —*Carried.*

Rev. Canon Baldwin gave notice that he will, at the next meeting of the Society, move the adoption of his resolution respecting the amendment of the by-law for the guidance of the Clergy Trust Committee, which was to have been brought up in June last.

The Rev. S. Baker, of Toronto, was proposed by the Rev. Canon Baldwin and the Rev. J. D. Gibson, of Bröok, by the Secretary, as incorporated members, to be ballotted for at the next meeting.

The following gentlemen, proposed at the last meeting, were elected incorporated members, viz.: Skeeler Hallen, Esq., Newmarket; W. J. Simcoo Kerr, Esq., Wellington Square; and F. W. Kingston, Esq., Toronto.

The meeting then adjourned.

LIST OF NON-COMMUTING CLERGY.

The Committee appointed to revise the list of Non-Commuting Clergy, published in the *Church Chronicle*, of June, 1866, beg to report as follows:—

The list contains the names of sixty-eight clergymen, whose dates of ordination or of entrance into the diocese have been carefully ascertained, and it is believed are in every case correct.

One name only, that of the Rev. JOHN DAVIDSON, was omitted by oversight when transcribing the list for the press. His name as now inserted comes in between those of the Rev. Messrs. J. Carry and S. Briggs, his entrance dating from December 24, 1857.

The standing of the Rev. J. SIMS, was dated from 1st October, 1804, when his stipend as missionary at Manitowaning commenced; but it has since been ascertained that his license bears date September 22; and the Committee have changed the date of his standing accordingly.

The Committee retain Dr. O'MEARA's name as in the list, but do not consider that they are required, or are competent, to decide whether he is entitled to participate in the surplus, or not.

The same remark applies to Dr. BEAVER's case also.

The Committee, acting according to their judgment, decided upon leaving the name of the Rev. W. STENNETT where it stands in the list on the ground stated in the memorandum of special cases thereto appended.

They are of opinion that the standing of the Rev. J. AMBERY should not date from his first entrance into the diocese in March, 1856, but should be affected and determined by the circumstance of his having performed parochial duty only for one year, as Curate at Carlton, and also by the fact of his being a Professor in Trinity College, in which capacity he is virtually in receipt of stipend accruing from commutation grant made to Trinity College.

The Rev. C. BETHUNE was absent from the diocese subsequent to his taking orders in July, 1861, and doing duty in England, but the Committee have not yet ascertained the exact period of the intermission.

Some of the clergymen on the list are absent from the diocese,—as the Rev. Messrs. CARRUTHERS, HIGGINSON, STRINGFELLOW, and probably some others, whose periods of absence, should they return, must be taken into consideration by the Committee to whom is assigned the duty of apportioning the surplus of the Commutation Fund.

The names of the Clergymen ordained since November 1st, 1865, are not yet attached to the list.

In conclusion, the Committee would observe, that the final authoritative list by which claims will be adjudicated upon, must, according to the By-Law, be furnished by the Bishop of the Diocese; they considered that their only duty was to compile a list for the information of the Church Society, and of the Clergy generally, making the deductions for intermission of duty specifically prescribed by the By-Law relating to the surplus of the Commutation Fund.

SPECIAL CASES.

The Rev. W. STENNETT, M.A., was ordained Deacon on the 22nd of August, 1847, and did duty as Assistant at the Holy Trinity, and at Carlton, from that date to the end (?) of 1855. "Subsequently to this, being made Principal of Upper Canada College, he gave up parochial work till his retirement in the spring of 1851, when he took charge of his present parish." This was an intermission of five years and three months, and brings the date of his standing to November 22nd, 1852.

The Rev. A. WILLEMS, was ordained Deacon on the 21st of October, 1856, and appointed to the mission of Sarnia, which he served till he removed to Toronto in August 10th, 1859, having been one year and ten months in the Diocese of Huron. The new diocese, however, having been set off subsequent to his appointment to Sarnia, and there having been no intermission of duty on his part, the Committee are of opinion that his standing is not affected by his having been for that period outside the new boundary line of this Diocese.

The Rev. A. STEWART, M.A., entered upon duty in this Diocese on the 20th of April, 1856, as Assistant at St. James's, Toronto. In 1857 he removed to Kingston, and remained there till 1862, when he was licensed to Orillia, having been for a short time in the new Diocese of Ontario. The Committee do not consider that this circumstance should affect his standing; his duties having been continuous since April, 1856.

The Rev. R. C. BOYER was ordained Deacon in August, 1849, by the Bishop of Toronto, and appointed to the mission of Mersea, which he served for two years and seven months, resigning in March, 1852. After an intermission of six years and nine months, he was appointed to, and resumed duty at, Hillier, in January, 1859, serving there till removed to Brighton on the 1st of March, 1865. His standing will, therefore, date from the 1st of June, 1856.

The Rev. JOHN ANDREY came into the Diocese in Deacon's orders, in March, 1856, taking office as Professor in Trinity College; was ordained Priest on the 6th of January, 1857. Did duty only for one year as licensed Curate of Carlton, previous to 1863.

The Rev. W. F. CHECKLEY entered this Diocese and was licensed to Barrie on the 27th of February, 1857. He left Barrie, and was Master of the Model Grammar School in Toronto, from September, 1861, to December, 1862, one year and nine months. For the first fourteen months of this period he had no stated ministerial engagement, but generally assisted in the Sunday services in some of the city churches. During the last seven months he was regularly engaged as Assistant at the Cemetery Church, conducting the whole service in the morning, and part of it in the afternoon. The committee have considered that in Mr. Checkley's case there was an intermission of fourteen months; and that his standing should date from April 27th, 1858.

The Rev. H. HAYWARD, ordained Deacon by the Bishop of Toronto, October 10th, 1852, and Priest, October 2nd, 1863, did duty in London till the end of March, 1856. An intermission then succeeded of nine years and five months, when he was appointed to the Mission of Fenelon Falls on the 30th August, 1865, having commenced duty on the 27th. The Committee, therefore, taking into account three years and twenty days' service in London, have dated his standing from the 7th of March, 1862.

The Rev. R. SANDARS, after ordination, was absent in England with permission of the Bishop, about ten months; which the Committee think should be deducted from his time of service.

* These are special cases affected by intermission of duty, and are not to be considered as determinate till examined and decided by the Bishop.

The Rev. J. D. CATLEY, M.A., ordained Deacon June 29th, 1860, left immediately for England, returning in October, 1863, and was licensed to Whitby about the middle of November in that year.

The Rev. S. L. ARTHURTON, ordained Deacon the 30th of July, 1848, and Priest on the 26th of April, 1866, and appointed to Grantham.

The Rev. VINCENT CLEMENTI, licensed to North Douro October 14th, 1863. He came to Canada in June, 1865, and with the approbation of the Bishop, but without any specific appointment, or cure, commenced assisting the Rev. M. Burnham in Peterborough and the neighbourhood, continuing his service till appointed to North Douro. He furnishes the details of his service previous to his being licensed and requests that they may be taken into account in assigning his standing in the Diocese. The Committee deem this a case which can only be decided by the Bishop; but they would express their opinion that Mr. Clementi's standing should date from the period of his being licensed to North Douro, namely, October 14th, 1863.

The Rev. W. STRINGFELLOW was instructed by a letter from the Bishop, dated March 25th, 1866, to take temporary charge of Waterdown during Mr. Higginson's absence. The committee presume that should Mr. Stringfellow continue to do duty in this Diocese his standing will date from the above day, or from the 17th of April, the actual commencement of his duty at Waterdown.

The Rev. H. AUSTON left this Diocese immediately after his ordination.
