SAVINGS BANKS

Annual Report Will Show a Steady Growth.

Over Eight Million Dollars Deposited During the Last Fiscal Year.

Yankee Fishermen Secure Spawns From Our Hatchery - Movements to Induce Immigration - Another Deputy Minister in Prospect - Warning to Business Men Who See Private Postcard - The Financial Statement for the Past Year Shows a Small Deficit - General News From Ottawa.

Ottawa, Oct. 22.-(Special.)-The statement of the business of the Post-office Savings Bank, which will appear in the forthcoming annual report, is in the fourth year of its history.

The number of postoffice savings banks on July 1 was 755, an increase of 24 in the year. On July 1, 1886, the number was 322. The total amount deposited last year was \$3,183,847, while the withdrawal amounted to \$7,406,065.

The total number of accounts remaining open on July 1 was 126,442. The total amount standing to the credit of depositors was \$28,932,933, the average of each account being \$228. The cost of managing this branch of the service was \$53,350, the average cost of each transaction, that is withdrawals and deposits, being 24c.

THEY GET OUR SPAWN. Permission has been granted by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries to take whitefish spawn in the Bay of Quinte in order to supply the hatchery at Belknap, Ontario.

The spawn will be taken under the supervision of our overseer at Belknap. The hatchery has undertaken to deposit a considerable portion of the fry in Canadian waters directly to the benefit of the fishermen.

The Department of Fisheries has been asked to permit of hoop net fishing in that portion of the St. Lawrence basin, inasmuch as the Americans are strictly carrying out the agreement with Canada in the matter of reserving the fisheries in British Columbia and the Northwest.

INDUCING IMMIGRATION. A. C. Swanson, a Scandinavian, who has been employed by the Department of the Interior in promoting immigration, has been detailed to proceed to the new English States, with the object of inducing his fellow-countrymen to migrate to Canada.

HORNER CHARGED WITH FRAUD.

Mr. A. Wachtel of Troy, N.Y., Secures the Arrest of a Former Wall-Street Banker in Montreal.

Montreal, Oct. 23.—(Special)—There was a good deal of interest at the Police Court this morning when Ed. H. Horner, formerly a Wall-street banker, appeared before Judge Dismore to answer to a charge entered under a clause of the Lottery Act.

The cause for the arrest goes very far back. Horner has been doing business here for over a year, through the recreational investment Co., the German-American Banking Co., the European-American Banking Co., and similar institutions. The principal business he did as banker was that of selling on the installment plan almost unknown European lottery bonds.

A number of people from the States claim to have been misled in sums running all the way from \$5 to \$200. The following information was sworn to by Mr. A. Wachtel of Troy, N.Y.

"I live at 68 St. Lawrence-street; at present I reside in Troy, in the State of New York, United States of America; from the 15th of July last to the 7th of October last I was in Montreal, Canada, and during that time I was in possession of the person and property of Ed. H. H. Horner, and that I have signed, sealed and that a search warrant may issue to search for and seize the same."

Mr. N. S. St. John will defend the accused, who pleaded "not guilty" and was admitted to bail.

TORONTO V. C. P. RAILWAY.

The Disput: as to the King-Street Subway Expenses Thruashed Out in the Supreme Court.

Ottawa, Oct. 23.—(Special)—The argument in Kingston v. Brennan was concluded this morning in the Supreme Court and judgment reserved.

The City of Toronto v. the C. P. R. Co. was next taken up. The dispute arose in connection with the subway in King-street west, in Toronto. In 1887 the city proposed to construct the works necessary for the bridge and subway to carry King-street over the tracks of the G.T.R., C.P.R., Northern and Northwestern Railways, the cost being estimated at about \$100,000, provided the railway companies paid their fair proportion. On application to the Railway Committee and that of the Privy Council the proportions payable by the railways were adjusted and the contribution of the city settled at \$80,000, such other sum in excess or below that as might be necessary to cover the expenditure. The city passed bylaws providing for the works as local improvements and obtained from the C.P.R. a release from any claim they might have for damages caused by the works, and also of adjusting the works being cut off by the subway. The cost of the work including necessary expenditure on the approaches, pavements, etc., considerably exceeded the estimate. The C.P.R. paid only the \$15,000 apportioned by the Order-in-Council as their contributory share towards the expenses. The city assessed the C.P.R. Co. under the bylaws for a share of the extra cost, as local improvement taxes, and the company took proceedings to have the bylaws quashed so far as they were concerned, claiming that they could not be called upon for any further contribution in the matter than the amount fixed by the Railway Committee and that the approaches and all other necessary works in connection with the subway and the bridge over it were covered by the original agreements, which had been submitted to the committee. The bylaws were quashed, as prayed, by Mr. Justice Macdonnell, who heard the application, and his judgment was affirmed on appeal. The city now asks to have the judgments of both the lower courts reversed and the assessment maintained against the railway company. Judgment reserved. Robinson, O.C., and MacIntyre for respondents. Lake Erie & Detroit River Railway v. Sales is next on the list.


