HOW THE CANADIANS SPENT AN AWFUL DAY ON THE BATTLEFIELD

The Terrific Hall of Bullets Did Not Bother Them so Much as the Thirst and the Burning Sun—They Would Drink Even Liquid Mud.

London, March 31.—(Correspondence.)—Everybody remembers the famous picture of Thirst, which portrays the gallant, half-starved men in the midst of the desert plain, lapping up the few remaining drops of moisture from an impoverished pool.

But a correspondent in The Morning Post tells us that, the British soldier "in the globe," he admits the verdict to be a fresh experience. There was Aden, India, Egypt, the Sudan, but here is something, not hot, not dry, not dusty, but less endurable, for some reason. Men who have lived in Kimberley, Johannesburg, Bloemfontein and Natal are only now, while campaigning, acquiring the experience in the army, with its incessant tramping and the ceaseless flow of dust that hangs about its camps.

A Dream of Paradise. "Here, where one knows by tired limbs the weight of what one drinks, the thought of water flowing through pipes seems a dream of Paradise. And such water! Water that which one could see, which left no mud at the bottom of the mug and did not leave what it was split on. One remembers that in England they analyze that kind of water. At Bantam there was a big pond—what was left of Moultrie dam. The water was clear and sparkling, and the water was deep. One sank to the knees if one tried to walk, and so sat gently half in and half out of the water. One thanked God for water. One rose from it with the green of seaweed, and with a sprinkling of other less desirable things.

Woman's World...

Devoted Specially to the Interests of our Women Readers.

One has to glance at the windows of the florist, the bootmaker, the confectioner, to see this week to realize how the custom of giving and exchanging Easter greetings by means of flowers, cards or bonn bonn gifts has grown amongst us. Not costly or substantial gifts such as one gives at Christmas, but little graceful things full of subtle suggestion of the season that brings with it promise of another life. First in favor with most people at this season is the gift of flowers—flowers that tell of the life and beauty lying hid in the apparently dead seed that falls to earth only to bloom with renewed life and fragrance. The long melancholy Lenten season ends abruptly in a festival of flowers, and the beautiful daisy, the simple little pansy, and the home of rich or poor all have on Easter Sunday their decorations of blooming plants to typify the resurrection. White flowers are most favored at this season, hence there is a more than usual demand for tall Easter lilies, white gladioli, feathery spiraea, lilies of the valley, and snowy anemones. HAGUE CONVENTION RATIFIED.

President McKinley Has Taken the Necessary Steps to Adopt the Principles of Arbitration.

Washington, April 9.—The President has just ratified the Hague convention, providing for universal arbitration of international disputes, and for the regulation of the use of warlike instruments. The ratification will be immediately sent to the Hague through United States Minister Newell. So far as it is known here, the United States Senate was the first legislative body to approve of the two conventions agreed upon at the conference. The Dutch Parliament itself did not ratify the treaties until a few days ago.

YORK COUNTY AND SUBURBS

Isolation Hospital at Junction is Now Closed and the Town Has a Clean Bill.

PRESENTATION TO MR. W. B. CLOSE
