

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Pastoral Letter.

TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS
OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

My Dear Friends,

I take advantage of the issuing of the printed Annual Report to address to you a few words by way of preface.

I trust you will all read the Report from the first page to the last, and take full note of its contents. It will repay the perusal. Every one of you ought to feel that it is the report of your church, and that in the exhibit it makes of work done, you have had a share. In both the successes and failures which it records you have a responsibility; and it pays congregations to have all their operations brought deliberately under the eye of every member and adherent, just because it helps to impress all with the idea that they are accountable, as parties to the church's undertakings.

Advantage has been taken in St. Gabriel's of every plan that has been found anywhere to work for the good of the church. Every inducement is held out to old and young, male and female, to associate themselves in such work for the Master, as they are specially fitted or have time and opportunities for. No one can validly excuse himself that there is no place for him or work for him to do in St. Gabriel's; and I would urge all to consider which of our numerous organizations can afford him or her the best facilities for aiding the great business of the church.

Again let me urge all to remember that the church does not exist merely to be a pleasure resort,—and that its main design is not so much doing good to its members as affording them opportunities of doing good. Very many make a mistake here. In choosing a church connection and in church attendance, the question they put to themselves, is not where am I most needed? or where can I be of most service? but where is the greatest crowd seen? what church do

rich and fashionable people attend? or where shall I find most excitement? Now, these are all unholy and mischievous views, and the cherishing of them will greatly hinder vital godliness and the growth of the true christian spirit which is one of unselfishness and cross-bearing for the Master. We think we need you all, and can give scope to your utmost devotion and efforts in Christ's cause, and have a first claim on your best services.

Again, let me also urge how much each of you have it in your power to do, in the way of promoting the church's prosperity, by using your influence with strangers and non-churchgoing neighbours to induce them to attend our services. If each of you will become a champion of St. Gabriel's, you can do much to further its best interests. Remember the words of the psalmist and make them your own in this connection :

“ Pray for the peace of Jerusalem .
They shall prosper that love thee.
Peace be within thy walls,
And prosperity within thy palaces.
For my brethren and companions' sakes
I will now say, ' Peace be within thee,'
Because of the house of the Lord our God
I will seek thy good.”

From Cadieux Street, north of Sherbrooke Street, west to St. Urbain Street, excluded.

DISTRICT NO. V.—JAMES ROBERTSON, *Elder*.
From St. Urbain Street, all included, west to Park Avenue, above Sherbrooke Street.

DISTRICT NO. VI.—THOMAS GRAHAM AND WM. J. MUNDELL, *Elders*.
From St. Denis Street, to Bleury Street, and from Sherbrooke Street to St. Catherine Street.

DISTRICT NO. VII.—JOHN S. LOUGHEAD, *Elders*.
From St. Denis and Bonsecours Streets, to McGill and Beaver Hall Streets, south of St. Catherine Street.

DISTRICT NO. VIII.—CHARLES BYRD AND WILLIAM DARLING, *Elders*.
From Park Avenue and Bleury Street to University Street, north of St. Catherine Street, but west of Phillips Place, south to St. Antoine Street.

DISTRICT NO. IX.—WILLIAM S. LOWE, *Elder*.
From St. Antoine Street, excluded, north to city limits, and from University Street, westwards.

DISTRICT NO. X.—JOHN M. FARQUHAR, *Elder*.
From McGill Street, westward, to St. Antoine Street, included.

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION
OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

January 12th and 19th, 1898.

The annual meeting of the congregation of St. Gabriel Church was held, in accordance with the constitution and by-laws, in the Lecture Room on the evening of Wednesday, January 12th, 1898.

On motion by Mr. Loughead, seconded by Mr. J. Internoscia, the Rev. Dr. Campbell was called to the chair, and Mr. J. M. Farquhar was appointed Secretary.

As this date was found too early for everything to be in readiness for the meeting, it was moved, seconded and agreed to:—

“That the meeting be adjourned until the evening of Wednesday, January 19th.”

The adjourned annual meeting of the congregation of St. Gabriel Church, was held in the Lecture Room, on the evening of Wednesday, January 19th, 1898.

It was moved by Mr. John MacTavish, seconded by Mr. James Robertson, and agreed to:—

“That Mr. Charles Byrd be Chairman of this meeting, and that Mr. Wm. Clelland, Jr., act as Secretary.”

The annual report and statements of the Treasurer of the Building Fund committee having been read, it was moved by Mr. Andrew McAllister, seconded by Mr. T. Sonne, and carried:

“That the reports and financial statements as now read be received and adopted, and that the same be printed and distributed among the members and adherents of the congregation.”

Moved by Mr. W. Clelland, Jr., seconded by Mr. J. M. Farquhar, and agreed to:—

“That the congregation has much to be thankful for at the close of another year's history, as during 1897 all departments of the church's work was prosecuted with vigour and success, and everything gave evidence of peace and prosperity.”

Moved by Mr. James Harper, seconded by Mr. John MacTavish, and carried:—

“That this meeting desires to express a due appreciation of the kind efforts of the Ladies' Aid Society, who devote much time and work to the christian duty of providing timely aid and comfort for those in adversity, and by visiting the sick,—and passes a cordial vote of thanks to the Ladies' Aid Society and Lady Visitors for their faithful attention to these benevolent offices.”

Moved by Mr. Geo. A. Campbell, seconded by Mr. A. E. Taylor, and agreed to :—

“That as the efficient assistance of the Choir in leading the praise services of the church requires much training and assiduity on the part of its members, the thanks of this meeting are now tendered to all the members of the Choir for their continued devotion to the praise services of the church during the past year.”

Moved by Mr. J. M. Farquhar, seconded by Mr. A. McNaughton, and agreed to :—

“That whereas the thorough education of the children and young people of the congregation in Bible knowledge and in the privileges of the religious life is one of the utmost importance to the welfare of the church, therefore this congregation would encourage the Superintendent and Teachers of our Sabbath School by a vote of thanks for their valuable services, and further requests the Board of Trustees to provide for the usual necessary expenses of the Sabbath School during the current year.”

Moved by Mr. John Loughead, seconded by Mr. Thomas Stewart, and carried :—

“That this meeting records its appreciation of the onerousness of the duties of the Treasurer and of the Secretary, and passes a hearty vote of thanks to the Treasurer, Mr. John Henderson, and the Secretary, Mr. Andrew McAllister, for their careful fulfillment of their respective duties during the year 1897.”

Moved by Mr. J. D. MacIntosh, seconded by Mr. A. E. Taylor, and carried :—

“That in accordance with Article III of the By-Laws this meeting does now elect John Henderson, Thomas Sonne, John MacTavish and J. M. Farquhar to be members of the Board of Trustees to fill the vacancies occurring by rotation at this time.”

Moved by Mr. J. Henderson, seconded by Mr. Andrew McAllister, and agreed to :—

“That the Purchase and Interest Fund Committee be continued in the same members as during the past year, and that they are specially requested to call up the balance of the original subscriptions, as the nine years limit of time for this fund has now expired.”

On motion of Mr. Farquhar, a special vote of thanks was passed to Mr. McNaughton, chairman of the committee.

On motion of Mr. J. MacTavish, duly seconded, Messrs. Alex. C. Abernethy and Jas. Henry were appointed Auditors for the year 1898.

At this stage in the proceedings, Mr. Byrd, on behalf of the Session and Trustees, presented Mr. J. R. Bain with a bible and new book of praise all bound together, to commemorate his having been Choir Master for twenty-five years. Mr. Bain made a suitable reply.

Moved by Mr. J. R. Bain, seconded by Mr. Geo. A. Campbell, and carried :

“That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered to the Trustees for the able manner in which they have done their duty, as well as for the successful statement submitted, shewing a balance on the correct side, and that the names of the Board of Trustees for 1897 be inserted in the minutes in honour of the event.” The names are as follows :—W. Arnott, J. Beckingham, C. Byrd, J. M. Farquhar, J. Harper,

J. Henderson, J. MacTavish, A. McAllister, A. McNaughton, T. Sonne, A. E. Taylor and R. S. Weir.

Moved by Mr. J. Harper, seconded by Mr. Andrew McAllister, and unanimously carried :—

“That the chairman and secretary be instructed to convey to our beloved pastor our love and sympathy, and sincere prayers to Almighty God for his speedy recovery.”

Moved by Mr. J. Henderson, seconded by Mr. J. M. Farquhar, and carried :—

“That the chairman, Mr. Byrd, vacate the chair and that the same be filled by Mr. John MacTavish.”

Moved by Mr. Andrew McAllister, seconded by Mr. J. Henderson, and carried :—

“That this meeting tender a hearty vote of thanks to the Chairman, Mr. Chas. Byrd, and the Secretary, Mr. W. Clelland, Jr., for their efficient services during the evening.”

The business meeting was then closed with the singing of the hymn “*Blest be the tie that binds.*”

Refreshments were afterwards served to all present by the ladies of the congregation, interspersed with music given by friends.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

For the year ending 31st December, 1898.

Having now arrived at the end of another year, it is the duty of the Board to lay before the congregation a statement of their labours during the same. In the first place we would ask each member and adherent to pay strict attention to the reading of the Treasurer's Statement.

As you are all aware at the close of last year and the beginning of this one, a special effort was put forth to pay off all the old outstanding accounts, and start with a clean sheet, and we take pleasure in stating that this has been accomplished. We are greatly thankful for this, as it was much easier to meet our responsibilities when they became due.

The collections this year in the way of weekly offerings, have been very regularly kept up, which is easily seen by the small amount of

arrears at the close of the year; we regret to report, however, that the open plate collections seem to be falling off.

As the system of financing in our congregation is solely maintained by voluntary offerings, it behooves every one to ask himself or herself am I doing my duty? As a people we have much to be thankful for, and there is no better way in which we can show our appreciation than by each one placing a certain amount every week to the support of ordinances in old St. Gabriel's. It is far from the desire of the Board to make it a burden on any one, but in order to make it light on all, each should give as the Lord has prospered him, and by so doing relieve the Treasurer of much anxiety.

The Purchase and Interest Fund account has as usual been made out in detail and will be submitted. As the limit fixed for the payment of all subscriptions terminates this year, the Trustees hope that all those who have not as yet fulfilled their obligation will see to it at their earliest convenience.

As the year was drawing to a close it was thought advisable to make a special appeal to the congregation for assistance in order to enable the Board to close the year without carrying over any liabilities which had accumulated during the past year. In this we were very successful, the desired result being achieved by the generous donations of a few, and we trust that the congregation will fully appreciate and follow their good example.

In conclusion we would return our thanks to the members who so generously responded to the special appeal, also to Mr. Bain and the committee who carried out the Scotch Concert so successfully on St. Andrew's Night. It is hoped that the congregation will make it a subject for serious consideration and devise some way of showing more generous and regular interest in the welfare of the cause of Christ, so that it will be unnecessary to have to appeal at the end of each year for a special effort.

The retiring Trustees at this time are Messrs. John Henderson, Thomas Sonne, John M. Farquhar and John MacTavish, all of whom are eligible for re-election.
