SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

Eighteen hundred and ninety has been an important year in the history of the Library, and has been the most successful. In the matter of the circulation of books, with the exception of 1885, the per centage has been the largest. This is best shown by the following comparison of the circulation for the past seven years :—

In order to accommodate the increased number of readers applying for books, it has been found necessary to rearrange and enlarge the space in front of the receiving and delivery desks by reducing that set aside for ordinary readers. Additional shelving room had also to be provided to hold the new books so rapidly accumulating. The Library now contains 65,846 volumes,—a net increase of 8,014 over the number reported in 1889.

Two important Library events mark the year: The abolition of the Customs duty upon two copies of all books imported for the use of Free Libraries; and the visit of the Chief Librarian to England to purchase books. It will be remembered that for two or three years past the Board has been agitating unceasingly for this change in the Customs law. The Government were memorialized, and deputations from the Board waited upon the Minister of Customs to urge their views on this subject. In these efforts they were warmly supported by the City representatives in the House of Commons,—Messrs. Small, Cockburn and Denison; and ultimately this important concession to Free Libraries was embodied in the tariff of 1890. The sending of the Chief Librarian to England to purchase books was also a wise and profitable step in the

right direction. A very large and valuable collection of books at reasonable prices was secured ; and the commission to agents saved by buying directly, paid the expenses connected with his visit twice over. The special knowledge of the English book market possessed by the Librarian, owing to his having been actively engaged in the book trade in London for some years before he became an Officer of the Board, contributed largely to this successful result. As will be seen by the catalogue now in the printer's hands, most of his purchases were of books not obtainable in this country. It would be a prudent policy on the part of the Board, it is submitted, to have the Chief Librarian make a purchasing trip to England every three or four years. The opportunity thus afforded of personally inspecting the treasures on the shelves of English booksellers,—the certainty of much closer buying,—the saving in commissions and other charges, will repay many times the outlay for travelling expenses. It is becoming every year more the practice of the large Libraries both in England and the United States to send personal representatives to the book markets, and thus hundreds of valuable books are secured by these gentlemen before their existence is chronicled in any sale catalogue, and even when catalogued, they are frequently snapped up long before the catalogues reach this country. So well known is the necessity for prompt action that on several occasions we have barely secured some of our most valued purchases by the use of the cable.

The circulation of books in the various Branch Libraries has improved during the year, but the success of the Dundas street Branch has far exceeded the most sanguine expectations. It promises soon to become one of the most successful of the Branches.

During the year the question of providing better and safer quarters for the books in the Reference Department has been considered, and a set of plans were prepared for a Reference Library building, which would serve not only as a repository for the books, but also provide suitable and quiet reading rooms for students and others requiring to consult the books in that department. Again, owing to the large annual additions to the books in the Circulating Library, our space for satisfactorily shelving these, is becoming more and more contracted, and the only solution of the increasing difficulty will be the removal of the books in the Reference Department, and the giving up of the space at present

occupied by them, to the Circulating Library. In the lurid light of the recent conflagration at Toronto University, it will surely be the duty of this Board to continually urge the necessity of securing a fire proof building to shelter and protect their present collection of valuable books and documents, many of them incapable of being duplicated at any cost. The Board owns the land suitable for the site for such a building adjoining their present premises. It needs only the support of the 40,000 or 50,000 readers who so freely avail themselves of the Library to secure for the Board the funds necessary to erect such a building, and thus guard against a second like calamity, possible to occur at any moment under present conditions.
