

Coolidge Sworn In.

Washington, 'Aug. 3.—Calvin Coolidge took the oath as President of the U. S. at Plymouth, Vermont, at 2.47 a.m. today.

The new President was sworn in by his father, who is a notary public and at whose home he was visiting. The text of the pledge as prescribed by the constitution was telephoned to him by the White House.

At the request of President Harding, the man on whose shoulders destiny has flung the mantle of high authority, Calvin Coolidge, also has been a memer of the cabinet family. He sat agularly in the bi-weekly councils in the White House cabinet room ever since the inauguration. ### Presidents Of United States

Warren G. Harding was the twenty-ninth President of the United States and he was the seventh to die in office. Of this seven, Lincoln, Garfield and McKinley were shot while in office and died as a result of wounds. Roosevelt was also shot, but died later and years after he completed his term.
