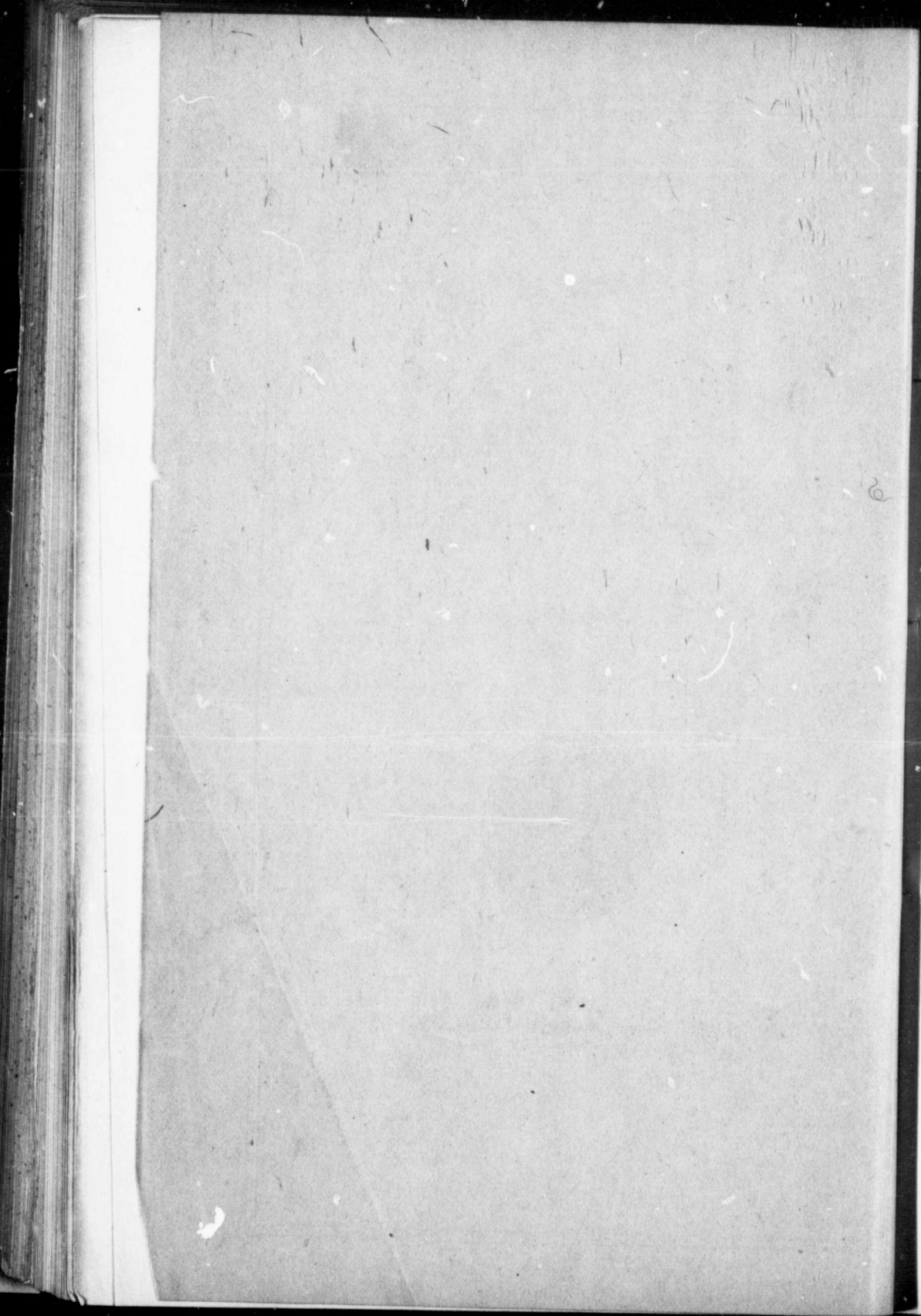

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

The Council of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association has the honor to submit the Twelfth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Association during the past year.

1. The grant made by the Government enabled the Council to defray the expenses of the Team to Wimbledon, and to form a programme for the Annual Meeting of the Association, offering prizes greater in number and value than on any previous occasion. The competition commenced on the 16th September, 1879, and was held on the Rideau Rifle Range.

2. The Council desires to acknowledge the liberal aid continued by the Government, which has tended so much to foster rifle shooting generally throughout the Dominion, in granting as in past years to the several Provincial Rifle Associations the following amounts, viz :

3. County and other local Rifle Associations also received grants through the Department of Militia and Defence for the year ended 30th June, 1879.

4. It is with great satisfaction the Council is enabled to state that the several matches were contested by representatives from every Province of the Dominion, (except British Columbia), and that the number of competitors greatly exceeded that of any previous meeting held at Ottawa.

5. Anticipating a large increase in the number of competitors, the Council deemed it advisable to provide additional target accommodation, and availed itself of the opportunity thus

afforded to test the merits of several systems having local reputations in the Dominion. Accordingly two targets on the "Carrall" system, two on the "Bacon" and one on the "Beer," were erected in addition to the nine targets already in use on the range.

6. Communication by telephone between the firing points and the butts was established and found to work satisfactorily, the instruments being kindly furnished by Mr. Bethune of the Montreal Telegraph Company.

7. A General Meeting of the Association was held at the Rideau Rifle Range during the Annual Competition in accordance with Clause 19 of the Constitution, the proceedings of which will be found in the Appendix.

8. The competition for places in the Wimbledon Team for 1880 was carried out during the meeting, and the selection will be made of the team from the thirty qualified competitors.

9. The Detachment composing the Wimbledon Team for 1879, under the command of Lt.-Col. the Hon. J. G. Blanchet, M.P., 17th Battalion, with Capt. Boyd, 54th Battalion as second officer, sailed from Quebec on the 28th June. The report of the commanding officer—which is published herewith, contains full details of the proceedings of the Team.

The Council, while regretting the loss of the Kolapore Cups, refers with pride to the score made in this match by the Canadian eight, as being higher than any made in previous contests for this coveted prize; and is also gratified in being able to draw attention not only to the satisfactory record of the shooting of the Team as a whole, but especially to the success achieved by Lt.-Col. Gibson, 13th Battalion, in winning the Prince of Wales prize, which is considered as second only to the "Queen's;" this result was hailed with scarcely less satisfaction at Wimbledon than in Canada.

The Council also refer with satisfaction to the success achieved by Corporal Gray, of the Governor General's Foot Guards, and Lieutenant Ewan, of the 35th Battalion, both of whom won places in the "Grand Aggregate" at Wimbledon.

10. With a view of marking their appreciation of the untiring attention and kindness of Captain Mildmay, Secretary of the National Rifle Association, to Canadian Teams at Wimbledon

and in accordance with the resolution passed on 6th March last, the Council forwarded a testimonial consisting of a writing desk made from Canadian woods and mounted in silver, which was duly presented to Capt. Mildmay by the President at Wimbledon during the meeting of 1879.

11. During the past year Medals of the Association have been issued to affiliating Associations, a list of which is published in the Appendix.

12. The munificent gift by His Excellency the Governor General of £50 stg., was placed at the disposal of the Association under conditions approved by His Excellency, and formed the basis for the competition for places on the Wimbledon Team for 1880.

His Excellency was also pleased to present through the medium of the Dominion Rifle Association, a Silver and Bronze Medal to each of the Provincial Rifle Associations in the Dominion.

The conditions for these competitions were, at the request of His Excellency, prepared by the Executive Committee of the Dominion Rifle Association and received His Excellency's approval.

13. The Council has also the pleasure of referring to the generous donation of \$200.00 by Lt.-Col. the Hon. L. R. Masson, M.P., Minister of Militia and Defence, for competition by non-commissioned officers and men of the Active Militia, and a special match was therefore included in the Annual Prize List, being designated "The Minister of Militia's Prize."

14. The Council refers with much gratification to the handsome gift of £100 stg., offered by the Hon. Sir John Rose, Bart., G.C.M.G. towards the prize list for 1880. This sum has been disposed of by the following resolution passed at the General Meeting, held on the 18th September, 1879.

Moved by Capt. Mason of Hamilton, Ont., seconded by Colonel Laurie, D.A.G., of Halifax, N. S.,

"That the prize of £100 stg. offered by the Hon. Sir John Rose, Bart., be divided equally between the members of the Wimbledon Team of 1881, and that the prize be specially designated in the prize list for 1880 under the above title."—
Carried.

15. Her Royal Highness the Princess Louise was graciously pleased to present the prizes won during the competition to the winners, in the Senate Chamber—in the presence of His Excellency the Governor-General and staff, the friends of the competitors, and a large assembly of spectators, adding much *eclat* to the proceedings—which was most gratifying to the Riflemen and their friends, as tending to show that their efforts were appreciated.

16. In view of the increase in the numbers attending the annual competitions of the Association, and the limited accommodation afforded by the Rideau Range, the Council begs to submit for the consideration of its successors, the question of procuring a site for a new range in the vicinity of Ottawa, capable of affording the increased facilities required.

17. The Council has to express its satisfaction with the success of the competition of 1879, which was carried through in spite of the bad weather which prevailed nearly the whole of the Meeting. The shooting as a rule was not up to the average, but this was affected by the changes and variations in the weather which were experienced.

The Council is of opinion that the time chosen for the competitions of last year, was too late in the season, and would recommend that for the future the first week in September should be selected.

18. With the advent of so greatly an increased number of competitors at the last Annual Meeting, the Council believes that the arrangements for the management of the matches proved to be satisfactory, but it expresses the hope that greater efficiency may be obtained. To this end, all future prize meetings should be under the control and management of a Chief Executive Officer.

19. The Council would submit for the consideration of its successors, the desirability of establishing a system of entries in the matches of the Association, whereby the whole may be closed before the commencement of the Meeting, so as to save delay and ensure a prompt carrying out of the prize programme.

20. The thanks of the Association are due to the Department of Militia and Defence, for placing at the disposal of the

Council of the Association, Camp equipage and stores required for use during the meeting.

21. The Council desires to record its appreciation of the attendance of Surgeon Malloch of the Governor-General's Foot Guards during the meeting.

22. To the several Railway and Steamboat Companies, the Council would express its acknowledgments for affording transport to competitors to and from their homes at reduced rates.

FINANCE.

23. The Council refer to the Treasurer's Statement for a full account of the Finances, duly audited, for the period from the 27th January, 1879 to the 29th January, 1880.

24. The total receipts from all sources for that period have been \$11,882.81; balance carried forward from last year's statement, \$2,222.50; total amount, \$14,105.31; while the expenditure amounted to \$12,669.61, leaving a balance of \$1,435.70 to the credit of the Association.

25. The amount received from annual subscribers is \$166 as against \$162 in 1878. The receipts of "Affiliation Fees" from Rifle Associations were \$780, an increase of \$60 over the previous year,—

26. The amount of "Special Donations" received this year being \$500 as against \$100 received in 1878.

27. The "Entrance Fees" to matches in 1879, including sight-shots, &c., amounted to \$2,156.80 as against \$877.37 received in 1878, an increase of \$1,279.43, which is accounted for by the large increase of the number of competitors.

28. A detailed statement of disbursements made by Lt.-Col. The Hon. J. G. Blanchet, commanding the Wimbledon Team of 1879, will be found in the appendix.

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY

OF THE

Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

1. The Annual Prize Meeting of 1879 commenced on Tuesday the 16th September, and was brought to a conclusion on Monday the 22nd September.

The necessary arrangements for the meeting were carried out as on former occasions by the Executive Committee of the Council.

In order to afford increased target accommodation, five additional ones were provided, embracing those invented by Lieut.-Colonels Beer and Bacon, and Mr. Carrol.

The MacDougall Cup was won on its 10th anniversary by Pte. Anderson, Gov. General's Foot Guards, with a score of 47 points.

The Team representing the Province of Nova Scotia carried off the London Merchants' Cup with a score of 384 points.

The Quebec Provincial Team was second also with 384 points.

In accordance with the desire expressed by competitors at the Prize Meeting of 1878, an extra series match at 200 yards formed an attractive addition to the Prize List of 1879.

All the provinces with the exception of British Columbia were represented at the meeting.

The result of the competition in British Columbia for a place upon the Wimbledon Team for 1880 will be found in the appendix.

The names and scores of the successful competitors for the Silver and Bronze Medals presented by His Excellency the Governor General for competition by the several Provincial Associations, will also be found in the appendix.

The weather during the meeting was very much against good shooting, high winds and occasional showers of rain prevailing during the greater part of the time.

The marking was carried out by men selected principally from local corps of the Active Militia, under charge of Sergeant Major Conroy, G. G. Foot Guards, and on the whole proved satisfactory.

The meeting passed off without any accident occurring.

Report of Lt.-Col. the Hon. J. G. Blanchet, M. P.

WIMBLEDON TEAM, 1879.

OTTAWA, December, 1879.

SIR,—

The President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, Colonel Gzowski, having honored me with the command of the Canadian team for 1879, I at once placed myself at his disposal for instructions.

In conformity with those instructions, I met the members of the team at the Militia Brigade Office in Quebec, the 20th of June, last. We were courteously assisted by Lt.-Col. T. Duchesnay, D.A.G.M., for the 7th Military District, and Lt.-Col. E. Lemontague, Brigade Major of the same district.

We left Quebec in the steamer "Circassian" on the 21st June, and after a rather stormy passage, we arrived in Liverpool the 30th of the same month. I must thank Captain Wylie and his officers for their courtesy and attention during the whole voyage across the Atlantic.

We met at Liverpool Mr. Dyke, agent of the Canadian Government at that port. That gentleman had kindly prepared everything for us, ammunition, board at Hightown, &c.

The practice at Altcar, under the direction of Capt. Boyd, was carried on with success, though under great disadvantage on account of the strong wind and bad weather. The men remained there for twelve days. During that time a friendly match took place between the Canadian Team and the Liverpool Volunteers. Our men carried the day by 21 points.

I thank most cordially the officers in charge of the Altcar Ranges, Col. Tinley and brother officers for their kind attention and generous hospitality.

The Team arrived at Wimbledon in the afternoon of the 12th July. They found everything in the same good condition as in previous years, through the kind attention of Colonel Gzowski. Unfortunately the weather was very bad for the first week, and our men suffered a good deal from it. In spite of that, they were always cheerful and good-humored, and took a great interest in all the matches. They were determined to do honor to Canada, and we may safely say that their patriotic efforts were crowned with success. They carried off many prizes. The Prince of Wales prize, the principal one, being won by Lt.-Col. Gibson of the 13th Battalion, Hamilton, Ontario, created the

greatest enthusiasm for the Canadians in the Camp. Col. Gibson became the hero of the hour. He received from all sides congratulations for his great success. His compatriots and brother riflemen gave him an ovation. As Canadians, we rejoiced over that victory.

The Team failed again this year in the contest for the Kolapore Cups, after the most gallant fight. Our eight men made the highest score ever made in the previous contests. But to quote the words of my predecessor, Lt.-Col. Beer, I may say that there is no approach towards equality, under such circumstances, and Canada must feel proud if she wins these cups once in ten years. During the whole time Wimbledon was visited every day by many distinguished persons from the Colonies, the United Kingdom and the Continent of Europe.

The Canadian Camp was the point of attraction to every one. The Canadian Team, upon the invitation of Col. Gzowski, was inspected by His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, who was accompanied by The Secretary for the Colonies, the Right Hon. Sir Michael Hicks Beach, Bart, Sir Patrick McDougall, Sir John Rose, Sir L. S. Tilley, and many others. His Royal Highness complimented the Canadians upon their soldier-like appearance and upon their success. He expressed the hope that they would be present every year at Wimbledon.

Col. Gzowski, president of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, during the whole time, dispensed most cordial and large hospitality. The fine appearance of the Canadian Camp, the arrangements, decorations, &c., were due to his good and well known taste in everything.

I owe a debt of gratitude to Col. Gzowski for his kind personal attentions to members of the Team and myself, and his experience and good advice compensated my want of knowledge in all the details of the important duties I had to perform.

The prizes were distributed by Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Connaught, in the afternoon of the 26th July. His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught graciously addressed a few words of congratulations to the Canadians, principally to Lt.-Col. Gibson, upon their success.

My personal thanks are due to Capt. Boyd, the second in command, and to all the Members of the Team for their kindness to me on all occasions. They made the duties I had to perform most agreeable and easy.

During the whole voyage they behaved like gentlemen who understood they had the good name of Canada confided to them.

I desire also to express my gratitude to Earl Wharncliffe, chairman of the Executive Committee of the National Rifle Association, to the Secretary, Capt. St. John Mildmay and officers of the Executive Committee, also to the Commandant of the Camp, Colonel Phillips, for their uniform courtesy and attention to the Canadians.

In conclusion, I may be allowed to express the hope that the public men of Canada will encourage the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association in its efforts to have Canada represented in England every year. Rifle practice cannot be encouraged too much, because it is proved by the lessons of experience that trained and skilful riflemen are the best defense to the country.

I have transmitted to Lt.-Col. Macpherson, Treasurer of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association accounts of expenditure of the Team, with Acquittance Roll and vouchers.

DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

We, the undersigned, agree to the following Regulations:

1. The Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates selected by the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association from the Active Militia of the Dominion of Canada to represent the said Dominion at the Meeting of the National Rifle Association, to be held at Wimbledon, in July, 1879, are, from the date of signing this agreement until discharged from duty at Wimbledon, to be under the immediate command of Lieutenant-Colonel the Hon. J. G. Blanchet, M.P., commanding 17th Battalion Active Militia of Levis, Quebec, Canada; and to be subject to such orders and regulations as he may, from time to time, issue for their guidance.
2. No Member of the Team to be absent from the headquarters of the Team from the day of landing in England, and until released from duty after the conclusion of the matches at Wimbledon, on any pretence whatever, without the permission of the officer in command.
3. Any Member of the Team disobeying the order of the officer commanding, or contravening any of the orders made for the regulation of the force assembled at Wimbledon, or be under the influence of drink, shall forfeit his return tickets.
4. The Members of the Team shall have their steamship and railway fares paid, as well as their ordinary board on the steamship, and at such places after landing in England, and until the conclusion of the matches at Wimbledon, as the officer commanding may select. All such allowances to be stopped from any member of the Team guilty of a breach of this agreement.
5. No Member of the Team shall send communications to the Press for publication with respect to the shooting or any other matter connected with the Team.
6. The Officer Commanding will provide the necessary ammunition, pay entrance fees and sighting shots for the matches open to the Team as a Team, or as individuals; and all prizes in *money* won by the Team, or by individuals, in such matches, shall be divided *equally among the Members of the Team*.
7. *Prizes in Kind* won by the Team as a Team, or by the aggregate shooting of the whole or any number of the Team, are not to be considered the property of the Team collectively or individually; but, such prizes are to be handed over to the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association for such subsequent disposition as the Council of the Association may determine upon.
8. *Prizes in Kind* won by any member of the Team, individually in matches open to individual competition, to become the property of the winner, if not inconsistent with the Wimbledon conditions under which such competition is held.
9. At the conclusion of the matches at Wimbledon, and when relieved from duty by the officer in command, Return Tickets will be furnished to each member of the Team from Wimbledon to the port of embarkation, thence by the Allan Line of Steamships to Canada. Such members, after being so discharged from duty, may suit their own convenience as to time for returning to Canada; but, no expenses will be paid on account of any member of the Team beyond the period necessary to complete the duty at Wimbledon, and the time of sailing

of the first steamer of the Allan Line from Liverpool to Quebec, after discharge.

10. The Officer Commanding will make requisite arrangements for the transport of the members of the Team, on their return, from Quebec to their homes.

11. Should any member of the Team from the Provinces of Nova Scotia or New Brunswick elect to return direct to Halifax, and in the event of any of the Allan Line of Steamships sailing from Liverpool to that port about the time, the officer commanding may authorize such arrangement, provided no further charge is made for the passage by the steamship company than that included in the Return Tickets to Quebec.

12. Each Member of the Team, on his being released from duty at Wimbiedom, will sign an Acquittance Roll, to the effect that he has been properly settled with in accordance with these regulations.

13. The Officer in Command will, on the completion of the duty, forward a report to the President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on the manner in which the same has been carried out, accompanied by the Acquittance Roll and Statement of Accounts of all expenditure connected therewith, full details of shooting and conduct of the members of the Team.

A challenge from 47th Lancashire to shoot a match at St. Helen's Junction, on Friday 17th, the last day at Altcar, was declined on account of leaving early next morning.

It is but fair to Assist-Surgeon McConkey, who was shooting steadily and well at Altcar, to state that his Snider Rifle got so damaged in going from Altcar to Wimbledon that it became perfectly useless and having to use a new Rifle seemed to put him off his shooting altogether.

That the Executive Committee be authorized to make the requisite arrangements for assembling the Wimbledon Team, and to fix the time they shall embark for England, and incur the necessary expense connected with sending the Team to England; and that the Secretary notify the 20 highest scores, omitting Private Wymer, 5th Battalion, (Fuseliers) reported as disqualified by the Quebec Provincial Rifle Association, that they have been selected; and that such competitors shall notify the Secretary whether they can go, such notice to be sent to the Executive Committee on or before the 15th April; and in failure to send such notice, the Committee be authorized to fill any vacant places.—Carried.

Moved by Col Laurie, seconded by Lt-Col Kirkpatrick, M P,
That the President do name the officer in command, and the second in command, of the Wimbledon Team for 1879.—Carried.

Moved by Col Lawrie, seconded by Capt Perley,
That the Executive Committee be empowered to open the matches of the Dominion Association to any of H M regular forces, under such regulations as they may deem suitable.—Carried.

Moved by Lt-Col Scoble, seconded by Capt Mason,
That the rifles supplied by the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association for the use of the Wimbledon Team be allowed to remain in the hands of the Ontario members of that Team after the date of the International Match at Creedmore, in order that they may take a part in such match, should they so decide.—Carried.

Moved by Major Macpherson, seconded by Capt Perley,
That the Annual Prize Meeting be held at Ottawa on the 16th September, and that the Executive Committee be empowered to prepare the necessary Prize Lists, and in doing so to take into consideration the principles suggested at the General Meeting held at the last Annual Match, and that the Chairman of the Executive Committee be authorized to certify to the amount necessary to meet the engagements entered into by the Executive Committee for the prize lists and expenses of the the meeting.

Moved by Captain Mason, seconded by Lt.-Col. Scoble,
Resolved that the Wimbledon Team for 1880 be selected from the

following Provinces and in the following proportions, namely, Ontario, 7; Quebec, 5; Nova Scotia, 3; New Brunswick, 3; Prince Edward Island, 1; Manitoba, 1; it being understood that should a selection by Provinces prevail in 1880 a representative should be selected from British Columbia instead of Manitoba.

Resolved further that the Rifle Associations of the Provinces above named be permitted and authorized to make their respective selections in such manner as they may deem most advisable and that they be directed to forward the names of those selected to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association not later than the 1st day of December, 1879.

And resolved further that the question of substitutes and all other matters of detail which may arise out of this resolution be referred to and be settled by the Executive Committee, subject to approval by the Council of the Association at its first meeting held after the regular annual meeting of the Association in 1880.

Moved by Lt-Col Kirkpatrick, M P, seconded by Col Laurie, D A G, In amendment to resolution moved by Captain Mason, after the word "that,"

That the Wimbledon Team for 1880 be selected by competition at the annual meeting to be held at Ottawa next autumn, and that two places on the Team be reserved, one for Manitoba and one for British Columbia, if at competitions to be held in those Provinces any eligible competitor makes a score sufficient to obtain a place among the first twenty in the competition at Ottawa, and that rules for the competitions at Ottawa and in Manitoba and British Columbia be framed by the Executive Committee.—Carried.

The President having drawn attention to the untiring attention and kindness shown to the members of the several Wimbledon Teams by Captain Mildmay, Secretary of the National Rifle Association, suggested the desirability of marking the same by presenting him on the part of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association with a testimonial which it was proposed should take the form of an inkstand made of Canadian woods, &c.

The above proposal was approved and the matter decided to be left in the hands of the Executive Committee to be carried out.

It was decided that a resolution of thanks be conveyed to Messrs. Langton and Harrington, late auditors.

Considered it would be desirable for the future that competitors be called upon to make their entries in Matches at the Annual Prize Meeting in advance of the date at which the Meeting is held, instead of during the progress of the Meeting.

This suggestion met with general approval.

The President addressed the meeting on the subject of the presentation of the Prizes to successful competitors by H. R. H. The Princess Louise who had generously signified her willingness to do so, and urged all winners to be present on the occasion.

The President having expressed his views on the "Back Position" in favor of its abolition introduced to the meeting Capt. Costin, late Chief Executive Officer of the National Rifle Association, England, who had been present at the competitions during the meeting.

CONSTITUTION

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING,
1877.

- 1.—That th's Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."
- 2.—Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the 1st day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.
- 3.—Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a Prize of not less value to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.
- 4.—Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$40.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion not less than \$20.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, for competition only, in the proportion of one to every dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to select from its members the persons to hold such memberships, and return their names and addresses, when selected, to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, to be registered by him previous to the Annual Prize Meeting. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an Officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of all entrance fees in the Dominion of Canada and Affiliated Association Matches, at the First Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at which he is present after he wins the Medal. Provided name of the winner and details of the match at which it is won shall be communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such Prize Meeting.
- 5.—There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons to be named by the Council.

The Governor General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
- 6.—There shall be a President to be elected at the annual business meeting of the Association.

7.—There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8.—There shall be a Council composed of Forty-eight Members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions :

Fourteen,	[14]	from Ontario,
Ten,	[10]	“ Quebec,
Six,	[6]	“ New Brunswick.
Six,	[6]	“ Nova Scotia,
Four,	[4]	“ Manitoba,
Four,	[4]	“ British Columbia,
Four,	[4]	“ P. Edward Island,

one half in each case to be elected at the annual business meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their annual meetings; the names of those elected by the Provincial Associations to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, on or before the day of the annual business meeting in each year. Six members of the Council shall form the quorum.

9.—The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10.—The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee consisting of fifteen (15) of its members. Five (5) to be a quorum.

11.—The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with this Association, and the Deputy Adjutants General commanding districts, being members of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12.—There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13.—The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do, all such acts and deeds, as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14.—The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may, from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15.—The Council may, from time to time, make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16.—The Annual Prize Meetings shall be held at Ottawa at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council.

- 17.—An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent by mail to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.
- 18.—The Annual Business Meeting of the members of the Association for the election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business shall be held at Ottawa on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the general session of the Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or any adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.
- 19.—A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any member or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.
- 20.—No alterations in the constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month at least previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments.
- 21.—The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

Clauses 2 and 17 revised 1878.

General By-Laws of the Association.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING,
1877.

- Meetings of Council. There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held on the day after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.
- Extraordinary Meetings. Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by the Chairman or by any four of the members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct,—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such Meeting,—and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meeting.
- The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings. The Council shall keep Minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to the inspection of any member of the Council.
- Finance Committee. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council to be chosen at the first meeting.
- Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered Bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.
- Expenditure of sums for current expenses. All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.
- Expenditures of a general nature. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.
- Annual Accounts. A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.
