With this, our second issue of Church Tidings, we take pleasure in publishing the

Financial Report of Bluevale Circuit, for the information of the members and adherents of the church. The year past has been marked with a measure of prosperity—the Connexional Funds show an increase, some debts have been removed, and a much healthier tone pervades all our services.

We hereby tender thanks to the members and friends for the prompt and cheerful manner in which the claims of the church have been met, and respectfully request your continued co-operation for the coming year.

THE WORK.

Three preaching services have been conducted each Sabbath and three even-

ing meetings held each week, during the year. The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper has been observed eight times. We report 4 marriages, 7 burials, 16 baptisms. 325 copies of Church Tidings and over 300 copies of other religious papers (not including those of the Sunday Schools) have been circulated. Our aim has been to visit all the families twice during the year, also extra calls

where deemed necessary. The Choirs, Leagues and Sunday Schools have greatly helped in the work, and the Quarterly Board has been pleased to recognize the Pastor's ministrations and labors by a suitable resolution. We feel our greatest need is a baptism of the Spirit to equip us for more efficient service. Let us ask and receive. Matt. 7:11.
