He pointed out many of the difficulties in the way of enforcing the present law, which he showed was antiquated and unworkable and not adapted to the needs of the present. Professor Balcom suggested, and the Council agreed, that the best method of precedure would be to ask the co-operation of the municipalities and incorporated towns of the province in memorialising the government, asking for such a revision of the law as will make possible as equitable taxation. make possible an equitable taxation.
