For nearly two hours these bundles lay on the sidewalk until notified by the passing crowds, and guarded by a 14-year-old boy, who had been employed to watch them by an unidentified man, who promised to give him five cents on his return. Yet each package wrapped in black oil cloth was marked "Black Hand" in bold letters, one in blue chalk and the other in white.

MANY FRENCH TOWNS SHAKEN UP BY QUAKE

In the Riviera Buildings Collapsed, Entombing Occupants in the Ruins.

Marseilles, June 11.—Two earthquake shocks running from northeast to southwest were felt throughout the Riviera between nine and ten o'clock tonight. While the damage done here was not great, reports from smaller cities show that the effects of the second shock were serious.

The village of Egulles, ten kilometers from Aix, suffered greatly. Several houses collapsed and the village is practically destroyed. At Cannes and Perpignan, where the same shocks were felt, the oscillations lasted some seconds, but did not do any damage.
