We therefore, say without qualification that the work should proceed as soon as possible. There is one condition that must be attached to the work and made as binding as the law of the Medes and Persians, which is that no camp work be done. Everything should be done in first-class style and beyond suspicion. If the public is assured that a reliable and permanent connection between the intake and the city can be constructed on a permanent basis as soon as possible, the Engineer then amounts to pretty certain that they will sanction the expenditure.

Moreover, there should be little difficulty in financing the work. The public will not object to paying slightly increased rates provided they are assured of water that does not involve doctors' bills for typhoid fever and other diseases. A slightly increased rate for a few years will meet the cost of the work.

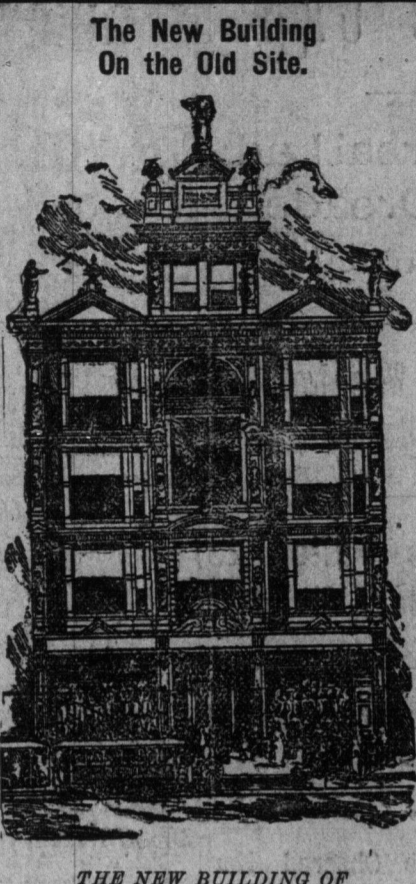

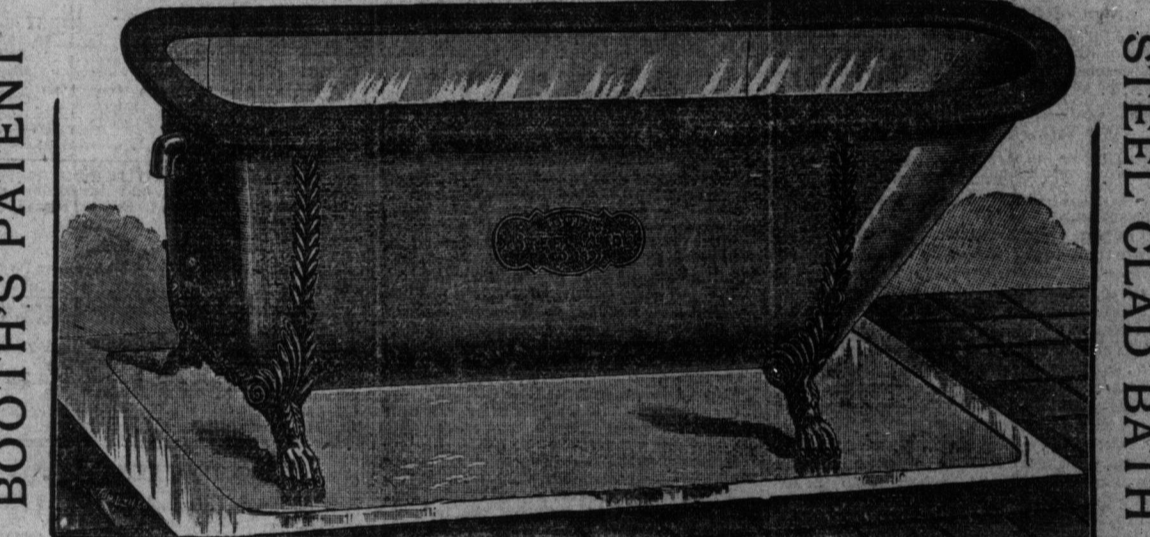
