WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

The weekly meetings held on Mondays during January have been well attended. Sewing members are preparing for the summer bales, to be sent off early in May. Letters have been received from the clergy to whom the winter bales were sent; they desire sincere thanks for the contents which gladdened the hearts of many poor people and brightened their homes. A resolution of sympathy has been passed to Mrs. Hagarty on the death of her sister, Mrs. McLaren, of Hamilton, who for many years was the able and beloved President of the Woman's Auxiliary, Niagara diocese.

St. Agatha's Guild held their annual meeting for the election of officers on Monday evening, January 28th. The following officers were elected:—Miss Cayley, President; Miss Biggar, Vice-President; Miss J. Cable, Corres. Sec.; Miss Godard, Rec. Sec., and Miss Winsor, Treas.

Parish Aotes

Out of respect to the memory of the Queen, the Christmas decorations were taken down on the 22nd, and on the following Sunday memorial sermons were preached. In common with other city churches, a memorial service was also held on Saturday, Feb. 2nd.

The usual Epiphany appeal for Foreign Missions was read on Sunday, Jan. 13th, and on the following Sunday, in the Rector's absence, the Rev. Carey Ward preached an admirable sermon on behalf of the Church's Foreign Missions. The offerings amounted to \$87.55, from twenty-two members of the congregation.

On Thursday afternoon, 3rd January, the Infant Class treat was held at which 48 children were given tea and afterwards presents from the Christmas tree. The entertainment was got up by the Misses E. and H. Boulton and Miss E. M. Cayley, and they desire to thank, through the medium of this paper, those ladies who kindly provided cake for the tea.

On Tuesday, 22nd ult., the senior portion of the Sunday School had its annual Christmas treat. The children had tea, provided by the kindness of the teachers, at 6.30 o'clock. After the boys had their usual romp, Mr. Whittemore gave an exhibition of pictures of scenery in the Rocky Mountains, and also of places and important people in China. Christmas carols were also sung under the management of Mr. Phillips. Altogether the children had a very enjoyable evening. But the expenses (small as they are) greatly exceed the receipts!

The Sunday School has sustained a great loss by the marriage of Miss Turner, now Mrs. Chas. Ireland, who was married on the 17th Jan., and will live in Berlin. Seven years of faithful work have endeared Mrs. Ireland to her class, always a full class, to St. Agatha's Guild, of which she was a most useful member, and to all her fellowworkers in the Parish. The scholars of her class joined together in a useful wedding gift, and Miss Cayley, on behalf of St. Agatha's Guild, presented her with a set of carvers as a slight token of their appreciation of her interest in the work of the Guild.
