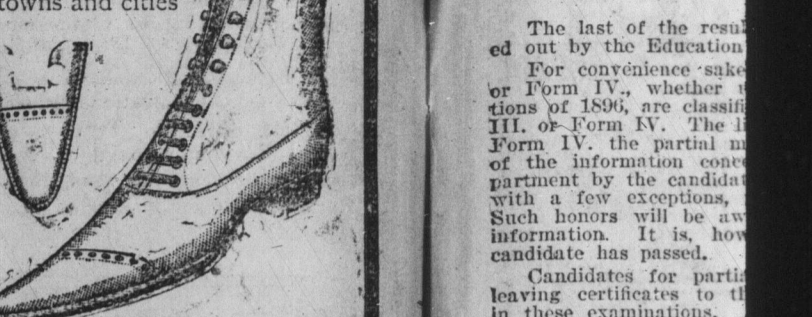

PRICES FELL WITH A CRASH

Disastrous Operations of the Bulls in New York. MARKET WAS TOP HEAVY

And in Spite of Bull Efforts Broke Through All Restraint.

December Wheat Dropped to 95 1/2 - A Pretty Heavy Decline in Liverpool and a Stamp in Both Wheat and Flour in French Markets - A Break in Chicago Also - And Yet It is Claimed There is a Shortage in Europe Which Indicates a Grave Situation.

New York, Aug. 24.-The disastrous result of operations by 11th-hour bulls was demonstrated in the actions of the wheat market to-day.

These related holders punctured the bull bubble and prices fell with a crash to a point over 8c a bushel below the top notch for the year.

The bull leaders endeavored to arrest the threatened deluge by pointing out the comparative steadiness of Liverpool and the frosty weather connotation and the frosty weather connotation and the frosty weather connotation.

For a time these influences had some effect, but the market was unmistakably top heavy, and soon broke through all restraints, and reached the lowest figure in the early afternoon.

The Liverpool decline for the day was 2 1/2 to 4 1/4 on futures, and 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 on spot wheat.

The news was followed by a quick rise of a cent a bushel, after which values again yielded to the pressure of long wheat, which continued more or less freely all the afternoon.

Spring wheat reports were offered by the southwest. The market closed unsettled at 5 3/4 to 6 1/8 net, and 17,000,000, giving some idea of the enormous dumping of long wheat.

Some of the afternoon reports made expert purchases upwards of 60 loads at New York and exports, but this could not all be confirmed.

The range on September wheat was from 97 1/2 to 1.04, closing 97 3/4. December sold from 95 1/2 to 1.01 3/4, and closed at 95 3/4.

No. 1 Northern New York was nominally worth 1.05 3/4, and No. 2 red 1.02 3/4.

Break of Five Cents in Chicago. Chicago, Aug. 24.-Wheat broke 5c a bushel to-day, and closed with 5c of the lowest figure of the session.

Weakness in Liverpool and selling here by Cuddeby were largely responsible for the slump, although the market was in shape to break when Cuddeby began a rally.

The price was given no support, and standing stop loss orders were reached for over an hour after the decline was started.

People with so-called pyramid trades and others with profits were in haste to get out. The market, however, was not broad.
