TWENTY-TWO YEAR

ADDITIONAL REMOUT SCANDAL

Inspector-General Truman - Makes a Request for a Court of Inquiry and It Will be Granted—Earl of Munster Killed in South Africa.

London, Feb. 3.—In the House of Commons to-day, A. J. Balfour, the government leader, announced that he hoped the Dutch communication regarding South Africa and the British reply would be laid on the table Tuesday.

The scandal arising from the charges brought against British officers by Sir John Blundell Maple, M. P., in connection with the purchasing of horses for the army, caused further acrimonious comment to-day.

It was announced that Major-General W. R. Truman, inspector-general of the Remount Department, asked for the appointment of a court of inquiry.

The War Secretary, Mr. Brodrick, replying, said he agreed it was desirable that a thorough investigation should be made of the whole subject, and promised that the inquiry would be opened without delay.

FOUR PROVINCES DECREASE

Figures of Rural Population Show Largest Falling Off in Ontario.

NOVA SCOTIA IS A CLOSE SECOND

All the Agricultural Immigrants for Last Ten Years Not in Country.

Ottawa, Feb. 3.—The third census bulletin which completes the record of the population of the Dominion for 1901 by urban and rural classes has been issued by Mr. Elze, the special census commissioner. Bulletin No. 2 dealt with Ontario and Manitoba only. Bulletin No. 3 gives the figures for the other provinces of the Dominion except British Columbia and the Territories.

The figures for 1901, with the increases or decreases, as compared with the census of 1891, by provinces, are as follows:

In the Territories, and British Columbia has increased in rural population, and in the Dominion as a whole the increase in the rural population is equal to the number of agricultural immigrants added to the population of Canada during the ten years.

SOVEREIGNS AND STATESMEN FEAR FOR EUROPE

EUROPE IS ANXIOUS TO HAVE BRITAIN FOOT-LOOSE OF CREW OF TWENTY-TWO

Help From the Lion Wanted to Restore the Equilibrium on the Continent Shattered by Rivalry.

Chicago, Feb. 3.—The Record-Herald's correspondent in London writes: Special reasons just now cause the rulers and statesmen of Europe to desire a speedy ending of the war in South Africa. The stalling horse of intervention is no longer in evidence, but from the capitals of all the great powers indirect pressure is being brought to bear upon the Boer representatives in Holland and Belgium to avail themselves of the only terms of peace the British government will grant.

The motive is not so much a wish to help the burghers as a wish—which is especially strong in Vienna and Rome—to free Britain's hands, so that her voice may be more potent in the councils of Europe. This view of the situation is entertained in influential quarters in London.

CAN'T COMBAT WITH FORCE

REV. DR. KUYPER PRIME MINISTER OF HOLLAND.

Peril in Many Sections—Both Triple and Dual Alliance Being Strained Close to Breaking Point.

London, Feb. 3.—The first officer of the French ship Chamant was landed at Falmouth to-day. He and the mate are the sole survivors of the crew of 22 men of the vessel, which was captured off Ushant.

The mate was picked up from a small boat which had capsized several times but which he had succeeded in righting each time. He is in a critical condition.

The barque wrecked off the Scilly Islands yesterday evening, which was supposed to be German vessel, turned out to have been the Italian barque Logar.

News has just been received here that the steam trawler Anahy, with a crew of twelve men, belonging to Hull, has been lost in a snowstorm off Iceland.

After testing helplessly in the English Channel for several days, the Ostend passenger steamer Marie Henrietta was towed into Ostend this morning.

The gale is abating. In view of the severity of the weather, the number of casualties this far is reported as comparatively small.

Reports of damage caused by the wind and snowstorms on the Continent and in Great Britain continue to be received. Carriage and street car traffic in Madrid has been stopped, and railroad trains are delayed. Some of the towns in Spain are almost isolated, and fruit trees have been destroyed.

In Switzerland, many villages have been cut off from communication. The telegraphic communication with Italy is interrupted. There is now more snow in Venice than at any time during the last 25 years. The Riva di Brenta rose 35 feet. The lower portion of the Riva di Brenta, as well as the Riva di Brenta, has been washed away. The water of the Tiber is now rising.

City of Mexico, Feb. 3.—El Popular, a penny daily, argues for Latin-American unity, "in order that the southern nations of the world may present a strong and compact front to their great neighbor, the United States, which is more powerful, if not more valiant, than the Latin-American nations, and may yet, under the pretext of bestowing the blessings of peace on these countries, impose its rule by force, and thus destroy the Latin-American liberties. The famous Monroe Doctrine is simply a means of preserving the equilibrium between the United States and Europe. The two powers, Europe and the United States, stand opposed to each other, and they pray desire a Spanish-American, while these hungry beasts of prey are disputing, the United States, for our common defence."

Canada Storm Struck

Snow Impedes Traffic

Not an Extraordinary Day for Toronto, But Montreal and Ottawa Suffered Considerably—Trains Stalled for Hours and Appointments Not Kept—What of the Future?

The storm is dispersing over the Gulf of St. Lawrence, but the outlook is splendid for several days of severe cold weather. The Observatory reported a temperature of 12 degrees at 10 o'clock last night, with the indications that the mercury would go near to the zero mark during the night. To-day, it will be milder, and to-night, the zero mark will be approached, or even touched, while, on Wednesday, it will be still colder. Just how many days the cold snap will last, it was impossible to say last night, but it would be safe to have the bins well stocked with coal. "Several days" was the most definite announcement the Weatherman would make, when asked for the probable duration of the present weather conditions, upon which British duties are now chargeable. EXORBITANT RAILWAY CHARGES. Mr. A. F. MacLaren's recent exposure of the exorbitant charges of the Canadian railways ought to form the basis of parliamentary action of some kind. He finds, after close investigation, that the rate paid Canadian railways for the transportation of cheese, butter, bacon, apples, etc., is more than 25 per cent. higher than for a relative rail haul in the United States.

Ontario farmers last year have expended \$175,000 on the cheese they exported; \$40,000 on butter; \$150,000 on bacon and hams; \$108,000 on apples, and \$184,000 on cattle—a total of \$657,000. But this is only a partial statement of the loss to Ontario producers thru railway discrimination. For want of proper shipping facilities and despatch from Montreal, a large portion of the produce shipped to that port had to be reshipped to Boston or Portland, thereby incurring the total loss to quite one million dollars. In the matter of wheat, Mr. MacLaren shows that while the rate from Buffalo to Liverpool is 11 1/2 cents, the rate from Western Ontario points is 21 cents. Ontario to Portland the rate is the same, and from Chicago to Montreal 25 cents.

ABRIDGMENT IN AUSTRALIA. New South Wales is closely following New Zealand in the attempt to substitute a compulsory system of arbitration in place of strikes and lock-outs. A carload of cattle from Liverpool to Kincardine to Montreal would cost \$1.25 per head more than from Chicago. Mr. MacLaren thinks a remedy is to be found in the encouragement of steamships to handle the traffic from the lakes to the St. Lawrence ports. He attributes the disparity between the rates in the United States and the Canadian railways to the fact that the former are subjected to effective competition from the many steamship lines which are engaged in the inland traffic to Buffalo. "If this great problem of transportation," says Mr. MacLaren, "is solved upon true commercial lines, we will have two cows where there is now one, we will have two families where there is now one, we will double our farm land values, and railways will have two cars of freight for one they have now."

THE AUTOMATIC TELEPHONE EXCHANGE. The next radical departure in the telephone business is the elimination of the so-called "hello" girls. They have already started to make their exit, and their ultimate finish is in sight. Automatic telephone systems have been in successful operation in several cities of the United States for a sufficiently long time to demonstrate their practicability. Among other places where they are in daily use may be mentioned Fall River and New Bedford, Mass.; Augusta, Ga.; Geneva, Auburn and Ithaca, N. Y.; Princeton, N. J.; Albert Lea, Minn., and Madison, Wis. But the best indication of the efficiency of the automatic telephone system is its introduction in the City of Chicago. Here will be established the first central-less telephone system of the first rank. Under the direction of the general manager of the company, the work of constructing underground conduits for the cables has been pushed, and it is so far advanced that the company authorizes the statement that the first exchange will be opened next July. The district covered by this exchange will be the downtown business centre, and there will be 5000 subscribers connected with it when it is opened next July. This district embraces the commercial life of Chicago, and the Inter Ocean says that practically every building in the city will have one or more of the new telephones in at the date of the opening of the exchange. It is expected the 5000 phones to be in operation in July will be increased to 15,000 within a few months. This company will be placing the phones in all business houses and offices without fixed charge. There will be no rental. Attached to each phone will be an automatic meter, that will register each call made at the rate of 5 cents. There is no nickel-the-dial device, simply a meter that registers the call. When these calls number 1700 in one year, the charges cease, making the maximum rental for an annual use of a phone \$5. This is to be the rate for phones for business houses. The same system will be followed in the installation of instruments in private dwellings, except that the rate for these will be guaranteed not to exceed \$5, and when a phone has earned that sum it will be free for the rest of the year. If phones fail to earn either \$5 or \$10 according to their class, the owner has to pay only what they have earned, and the company stands the deficit. Before the meter registers, the called person has to answer.
