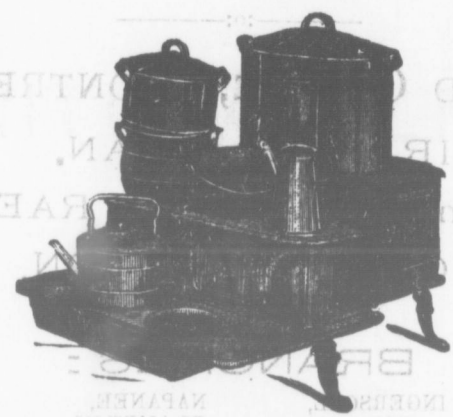

Mail Routes.

Mails for England are despatched from Canada as follows:
 Once per week by Canadian steamer, sailing every Saturday from Quebec in summer, and from Portland in winter; and a special mail for the Maritime Provinces is sent once per fortnight by Canadian steamers sailing from Halifax every alternate Tuesday.

Once a week by Cunard steamers sailing from New York every Wednesday.

With Manitoba the Postal Communication is daily, all the year round.

Rates of Postage.

ON LETTERS WITHIN THE DOMINION OF CANADA:

And so on, 3 cents being charged for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., or fraction of a $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. On letters left at a Post Office for delivery from the same office one cent is charged.

BETWEEN CANADA AND NEWFOUNDLAND.

Letters to Newfoundland are charged at the rate of 6 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and must in all cases be prepaid.

BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

The same rates are charged upon letters passing by mail to the United States, and must in all cases be prepaid by postage stamp.

BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The rates charged on letters sent from Canada for delivery in the United Kingdom are 5 cents for a letter weighing not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and an additional 5 cents for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. over.

POST OFFICE TIME TABLE.

Mails are delivered and closed at Fort Garry, (Winnipeg) Post Office as follows ;—

SOUTHERN.—St. Norbert, St. Agathe, Scratching River, West Lynne, Windsor, Ont., and Pembina, U. S., close every evening at 7 p. m., and are open for delivery every morning at 8 a. m.

NORTHERN.—Eagle's Nest, St. Peter's, Mapleton, Lower Fort Garry, St. Andrew's, Park's Creek, Middle Church, Kildonan, Rockwood, Springfield, and Cook's Creek, close every Monday and Friday, at 7 p. m. (waybag open till 7 a. m. on Sundays), and are due for delivery every Tuesday and Saturday at 7 p. m.

WESTERN.—Palestine, Westbourne, Burnside, Portage la Prairie, High

POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT.

Bluff, Poplar Point, St. Laurent, Oak Point, Baie St. Paul, Pigeon Lake, St. Francois Xavier, Headingly, St. Charles, and St. James, close every Wednesday and Saturday, 7 p.m. (waybag open till 7 a. m. on Thursdays, and 7 p. m. on Sundays), and are due for delivery every Wednesday and Saturday at 5 p. m.

EASTERN.—St. Boniface closes every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, at 7 p. m., and is due for delivery every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, at 6 p. m.; St. Anne closes every Saturday at 10 a. m., and is due for delivery every Saturday at 12 noon; St. Vital closes every Monday at 10 a. m., and is due for delivery every Monday at 12 noon.

Letters intended for Registration must be posted a quarter of an hour previous to the closing of the mail by which they are to be forwarded, and both the postage and Registration fee must be prepaid.

OFFICE HOURS.—Daily, Sundays excepted, from 8 a. m. till 7 p. m.
Money Orders issued and paid from 10 a. m. till 4 p. m.

British and Foreign Postage—Via England.

Showing the amount of Postage to be collected in the Dominion of Canada, upon Letters, Newspapers, Book Packets, and Patterns, forwarded by Canadian Mail Steamers, to the United Kingdom, and through the United Kingdom to the undermentioned Colonies and Foreign Countries.

Mem. 1.—In all cases the postage must be prepaid. Letters for the United Kingdom, if in sufficiently prepaid, will be forwarded,—but they will be charged on delivery with double the amount of deficient postage.

2.—The postage to be collected upon letters for France or Algeria is 10 cents per $\frac{1}{4}$ oz., 16 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., 26 cents per $\frac{3}{4}$ oz., 32 cents per oz., and so on, adding 6 or 10 cents as the weight exceeds $\frac{1}{4}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. additional.

A, § 3.—The Registration Fee on letters and other articles to the United Kingdom is 8 cents each. No letter or other article can be registered to places marked (A), and to places marked (§) only letters can be registered. Upon registered letters for France, double the ordinary postage must be collected, in addition to a further sum of 8 cents each. In all other cases the registration fee is 20 cents from Canada to the place of destination.

* 4.—An additional postage of 6 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., must be collected on Letters, 4 cents on each Newspaper, and 6 cents per 4 oz. on Book Packets and Patterns for the places marked thus (*) when addressed to be sent *via* Brindisi.

† 5.—No Book Packet, or packet of Newspapers, addressed to the places marked (†), must exceed 2 lbs. in weight; and the weight of a Packet of Patterns for these places is limited to 8 oz. The weight of a Book packet, or packet of Patterns, addressed to New South Wales or Queensland is limited to 3 lbs. In all other cases the weight is limited to 5 lbs.

6.—In addition to all kinds of printed matter, legal and commercial documents and music in manuscript may be sent as book packets.

7.—On book packets for the United Kingdom, not exceeding 2 ozs. in weight, the postage is 4 cen's. On book packets, weighing more than 5 ozs., the progressive rates of postage will be found on the next page.

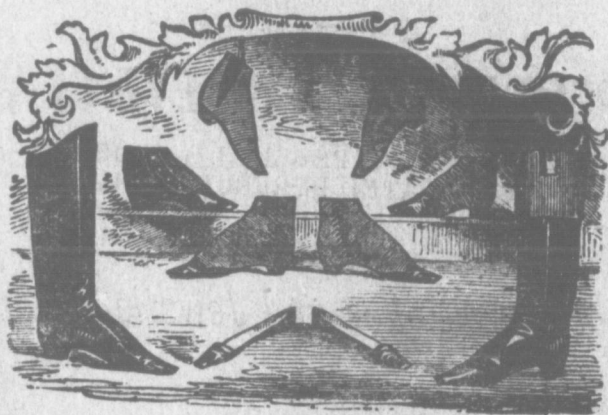

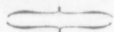

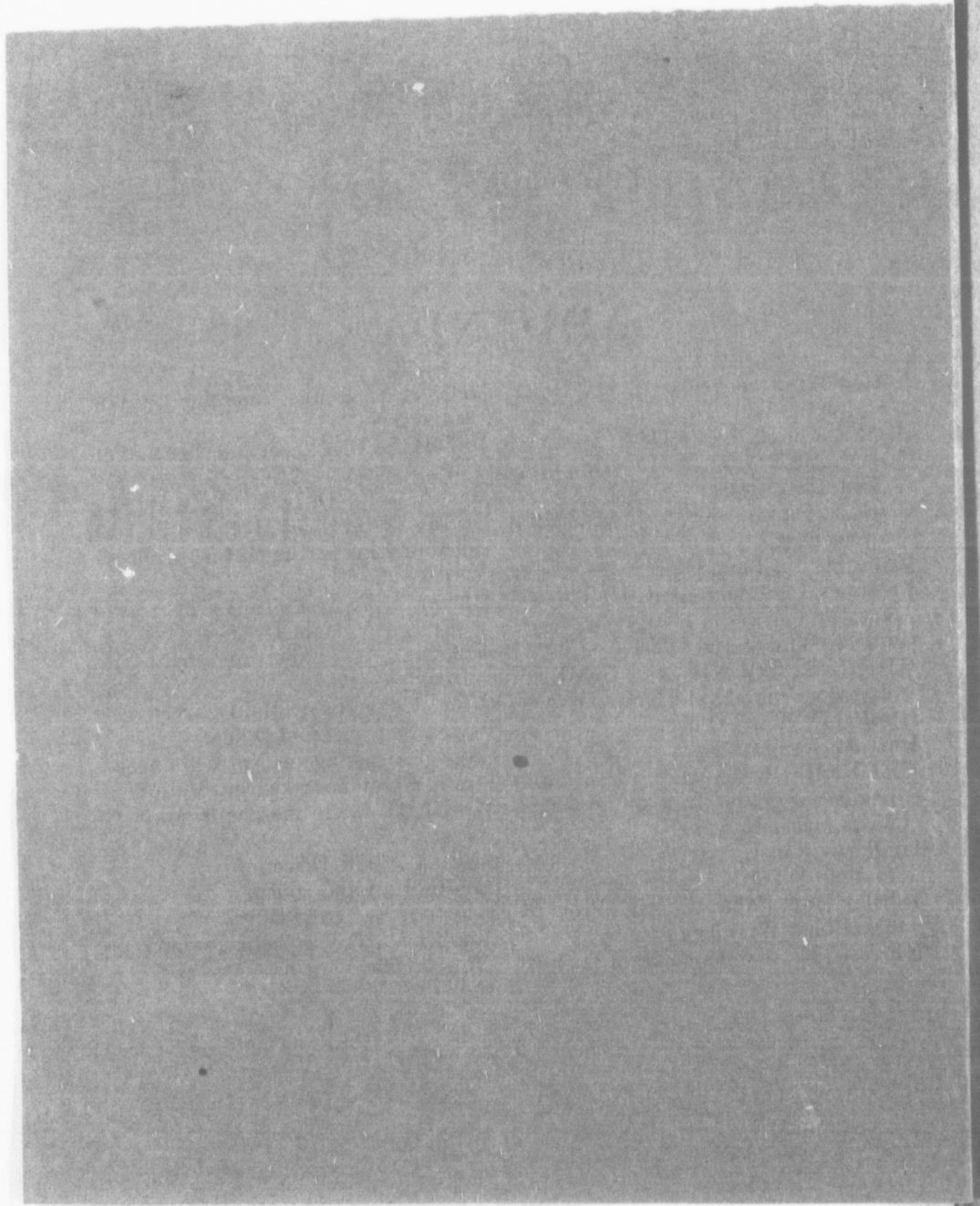
