Report of the Committee on Certificates and Assessments.

THE REV. FREDERICK ROBERT GHENT was admitted to the Diaconate on Trinity Sunday, June 1st, 1890 in St. George's church, Goderich, and was priested on the same festival in the following year. His first charge was the united Parish of Paisley and Pinkerton, where he labored with much acceptance to the people. In 1892 he was appointed to the Parish of Granton, Biddulph and Prospect Hill. In 1894 he accepted the Parish of Walkerville, where he remained till his premature and much lamented death in the month of September last. He was a young man of considerable ability and gave promise of future success. We extend our sympathies to his bereaved widow.

THE LAMBETH CONFERENCE.

As the Conference held in the Archbishopal Palace of Lambeth in the month of July last was unquestionably the largest as to the number of Bishops attending, and the most important as to decisions arrived at, ever witnessed by the Church of England, I feel it my duty to draw your respectful attention to the position taken by the Conference on some of the burning questions of the day, affecting not only the interests of our Church, but the peace and happiness of the world.

The preliminary services began by a BISHOP'S DEVOTIONAL DAY, held on Wednesday, June 30th, in the Parish Church of Lambeth. A number of very spiritual addresses were delivered on that occasion by the Right Rev. Dr. King, Bishop of Lincoln, who was listened to with profound attention and respect.

On Thursday evening, July 1st, there was public service in Westminster Abbey, the sermon being preached by the Archbishop of York.

On Friday, July 2nd, a visit was paid by all the Bishops to the landing place of Augustine in the Isle of Thanet.

On Saturday, July 3rd, a solemn and imposing service was held in Canterbury Cathedral, when a formal address of welcome was given to the Assembled Bishops by the Rt. Hon. and most Rev. F. Temple, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury.

On Monday, July 5th, after celebration of the Holy Communion in Westminster Abbey, the first session of the Conference was held at 11 a.m. in Lambeth Palace.

Taking these up in order, I shall, if the Lord will, consider first the action of the Lambeth Conference with reference to the Churches of the East.

The Churches of the East may be arranged as follows :

1. The Greek Church.
2. The Russian Church.
3. Churches holding a creed divergent to the Councils of Ephesus and Chalcedon.

Generally speaking, since the year of our Lord 1054 the Greek and Latin Communions have ceased all friendly relations with each other. That anterior to this date, angry passages occurred between them, and that subsequently to it attempts at reconciliation have been made is undoubtedly true, but in the year above mentioned the most serious and far-reaching breach took place, the consequences of which remain to this very day.

Pope Leo IX had despatched three legates to Constantinople, Humbert, Cardinal-Bishop of Sylvia Candida, Frederick of Lorraine, Chancellor of the Roman Church, and Peter, Archbishop of Amalfi. They bore a letter entreating the Emperor Constantine Monomachus to join in an alliance against the Normans, and one to Cerularius, Patriarch of Constantinople. The deputation was received with honor by the emperor, who was anxious to secure the Pope's interest, but the Patriarch absolutely declined to meet them. On the 16th of July the legates entered the church of St Sophia and laid on the holy table a document in which, after acknowledging the orthodoxy of the people of Constantinople in general, they charged the Patriarch and his party with likeness to the most infamous heresies and solemnly anathematised them with all heretics. Having left the church, they shook off the dust from their feet, exclaiming, "Let God see and judge."

The Greek Church is reputed to contain within its Communion some 70,000,000 of souls ; it has altogether some 300 Bishops, and is grouped under the five Patriarchates of Alexandria, Antioch, Jerusalem, Constantinople and Moscow. These Patriarchates are unequally divided as to the extent of their jurisdiction, and also to the number of souls under their care.

Thus the Patriarchate of

Moscow	has some 50,000,000
Constantinople	" 11,000,000
Antioch	" 50,000
Jerusalem	" 25,000
Alexandria	" 5,000

The remaining 9,000,000 would appear to be made up of the Independent Churches of Cyprus, Austria, Serbia, Montenegro, Greece, and the Islands of the Archipelago. The Greek Church, or "Orthodox Imperial Church," includes the widespread races which speak the Greek language. It comprehends the old Apostolic Churches of Asia Minor, while its southermost outpost is the convent in the desert of Mount Sinai. It is said to be the only living representative of the Hellenic race.

2. The Russian Church is by far the largest branch of the Eastern Church, having, as has already been stated, a membership of some 50,000,000 souls. It is, however, a comparatively modern church, having received its Christianity in the 10th century with the conversion of the Emperor Vladimir through the Patriarch of Constantinople, to whom it was originally subject, and with whom it is still in communion. It is now an independent national church, having its own Patriarchate of Moscow, and governed by a Synod sitting at St. Petersburg.

3. The Eastern Churches holding creeds divergent to the Councils of Ephesus and Chalcedon are:

(a) THE CHALDEAN OR NESTORIAN CHURCH, which is now co-extensive with the country of Kurdistan. It is called Nestorian because identified with Nestorius, who was condemned at the Council of Ephesus. It has been pre-eminently a missionary church, sending forth its missionaries as far as China and Ceylon. The celebrated stone of Singau Fu on the extreme limits of farthest China contains a Nestorian inscription relating the progress of Christianity.

(b) THE ARMENIAN CHURCH occupies the mountain tract around Mount Ararat. The chief city is Kars, famous for its siege in the Russo-Turkish war. Christianity was introduced into Armenia in the 4th Century by the Apostolic labors of Gregory the Enlightener, who was its first Bishop. The Armenian church rejects the Council of Chalcedon, and is therefore monophysite, and indeed, if we except the Greek Church, all the Oriental churches are divided between the errors of Nestorius and Eutyches, and at this day, the Armenian, Jacobite or Syrian, Coptic or Egyptian, and Abyssinian churches hold, contrary to the 4th General Council, that there is in Christ but one nature, His humanity being absorbed in His Deity. For this reason they are denominated schismatics by both the Greek and Roman churches, as well as by our own.

(c) THE CHURCH OF SYRIA (which must not be confounded with the Church of Palestine, which has its Patriarchate of Jerusalem) is undoubtedly the oldest of the Gentile churches, for Antioch was certainly the Mother Church of Gentile Christendom. Ignatius the Martyr, Chrysostom and Ephrem Syrus were all of this church.

(d) The old CHURCH OF ALEXANDRIA, known as the Coptic Church, is reputed to have been founded by St. Mark. At ordination the Coptic Church alone uses not the imposition of hands, but the act of breathing, founding their authority for this upon St. John xx : 22. The Patriarch of Alexandria resides in Cairo.

(e) The Abyssinian Church of Ethiopia is regarded as the most corrupt of the Eastern Churches. Its chief characteristics are that it practices the rite of circumcision ; keeps the Jewish Sabbath, as well as the Christian Sunday, permits polygamy, regards dancing as an adjunct of Religious worship, and retains the likeness of the Jewish Ark as its central object of religious worship.

On the subject of Unity the following formal resolution was arrived at by the Conference :

"That the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, and the Bishop of London be requested to act as a Committee, with power to add to their number, to confer personally or by correspondence with the orthodox Eastern Patriarchs, the Holy Governing Synod of the Church of Russia, and the chief authorities of the various Eastern Churches, with a view to consider the possibility of securing a better understanding, and of establishing closer relations between the churches of the East and the Anglican Communion ; and that under the direction of the said Committee arrangements be made for the translation of books and documents setting forth the relative positions of the various churches, and also of such catechisms and forms of service as may be helpful to mutual understanding."

Let us now briefly consider what success former efforts in this direction have had :

1. "The first attempt was made by Lutheran Divines in the Sixteenth Century, and ended in the condemnation of the Augsburg Confession."
2. The correspondence of the Anglican Non-Jurors with Russia and the East, A.D. 1717-1723 had no effect whatever.
3. The Convocation of Canterbury and the General Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States in 1862 appointed each a committee to consider such ecclesiastical inter-communion with the orthodox East as should enable the laity and clergy of either church to join in the sacraments and offices of the other without forfeiting the communion of their own church.

The result so far has been : The magnanimous Easterns were willing to grant nothing, except the high privilege of burial to Anglicans in the consecrated ground of the orthodox. They expressed

serious scruples about the validity of Anglican orders, could not recognize Anglican Baptism and found strange novelties in the xxxix Articles. The Russo-Greeks insisted on the expulsion of the "Filioque," which is their main objection to Rome: the recognition of the seventh Œcumenical Council; the invocation of the Holy Virgin and the Saints; the veneration of icons; prayers for the departed; seven sacramental mysteries; trine immersion; a mysterious transformation of the Eucharistic elements; the Eucharistic sacrifice for the living and the dead.

From the above we gather that no corporate union with the orthodox Greek church can possibly take place without two most serious results issuing therefrom: First, the absolute recasting of our glorious xxxix Articles, and Secondly, a terrible and hopeless division in the ranks of the church itself. It is only fair to say that no such expression as "corporate union" was made use of; only the improvement of relationships: but roads ought to lead somewhere and therefore, to build at great cost and sacrifice a magnificent pathway to end in the cold, grey, gateless wall of the Eastern Communion seems hardly compatible with the dignity of an historic church.

I cannot do better than end this subject with a quotation from the learned and most highly honored Bishop of Gloucester, Dr. Ellicott, who on the 5th of December, 1875, delivered himself as follows: "The attempt, as it will be deemed by many, to pass toward Rome by way of Greece will create among us dissensions more serious and threatening than we have yet experienced, even in these sad times of anarchy and division. Let us not be carried away by feelings and sympathies into positions that are spiritually untenable. If there be so much of vital and fundamental doctrine that is substantially identical in the teaching of the Eastern Church and the teaching of the church of Rome, then if we seek an inter-communion in offices and sacraments with the former church, we must be prepared to go further, and at least tolerate the thought in reference to the latter.

Let us then, as a church, make no compromising overtures; let us stand distinctly apart from all doctrinal complications; let us not modify our formularies, nor make alterations in our creeds. Yet let us fail not, as individuals, to extend every brotherly sympathy to our fellow-Christians in a church that may have before it a blessed and eventful future."

2. As regards the great Latin Communion, the Lambeth Conference took no action with reference to a "nearer approach," and therefore I shall immediately pass on to a consideration of the third subject, namely: "The Church's position with regard to our non-conforming brethren."

We are ever to bear in mind that our church has never looked upon the breach with the various bodies of Trinitarian Nonconformists as irreparable or hopeless. On the contrary she has made several efforts looking towards peace and final union. I may mention as proofs of the above her action in the reign of James I., when she sent Bishop Hall, then Dean of Worcester, Bishop Carleton, Dr. Davenant and Dr. Ward to attend the Synod of Dort. Since then both the Lambeth Conference and the General Convention of the Protestant Episcopal church of the United States have held out the olive branch of peace, in the presentation of what is now known as the Quadrilateral, namely:

1. The All Sufficiency of the Word of God.
2. The Two Sacraments.
3. The Apostles' and Nicene Creeds.
4. The Historic Episcopate.

Uniformity is not possible, and if possible it is not desirable. In nature nothing charms us more than the endless variety which exists everywhere. No two faces in the 150,000,000 people who inhabit the world are exactly alike, nor two leaves of the forest identical. The glory of God's creation is not endless sameness, but endless diversity, and our world is only one of the bewildering millions that move in illimitable space. Unity, however, is God's eternal plan: in the world always desirable; in the church essentially necessary, that is, if our Lord's desire is to be carried to completion. Principle, however, must not be sacrificed, be the temptations what they may. I am persuaded the only solution to this vexed question lies in Christian Communions drawing nearer to the common Centre of all unity, and that Centre is Christ. For as the spokes of a wheel only meet in the centre, and are farther apart at the circumference, so the fact and reality of union with each other will not be accomplished by a motion toward each other, but by a direct motion towards the Lord Jesus Christ Himself, who is alone the Fount and Centre of all unity.

THE CRITICAL STUDY OF THE HOLY SCRIPTURES.

In the report which the special committee on this subject brought in for the consideration of the Conference, it is stated:

"They deem it, therefore, the more important to lay emphasis upon the duty, which is unchanged by critical results, of humble and prayerful use of Scripture in its separate parts. The example of our Blessed Lord, and the use of the Old Testament in the New, strongly enforce this duty. Our Lord appeals to the Old Testament as witnessing to Himself. He teaches His disciples that all things written in the land of Moses, and in the Prophets, and in the Psalms

concerning Him are to be fulfilled. He dwells, moreover, upon details of type and phrase. He declares that not one jot or tittle shall pass from the Law until all be fulfilled."

"Your Committee express their conviction with regard to the New Testament that the results of critical study have confirmed the Christian faith. . . . They are confident that wherever men humbly and trustfully use the Bible, it will commend itself more and more clearly to their hearts and consciences as indeed the Word of God."

It is impossible for any one at all conversant with the religious opinions of his age to be ignorant of the fact that on every side men are advancing to assail the great citadel of truth, the inspired word of God. In comparison with this contest all other controversies sink into utter insignificance. Ordinary matters of dispute in the church are CONCERNING the faith, this is, whether there is any faith at all; others affect the superstructure, this the foundation itself, and if the foundation be destroyed what can the righteous do? The school, therefore, of destructive criticism which has arisen in our day is one which demands more than a passing notice from the Bishops and chief pastors of the flock. Proceeding on the blasphemous assumption that the Bible is only human and fallible, and that criticism is unassailable truth, this school seeks to subvert in one dire overthrow the faith of multitudes, and leave them hopeless in a shoreless sea of doubt.

Most earnestly do I desire to impress you, the Clergy and Laity of this important Diocese, that if you wish to carry out the principles of your holy religion, and I am confident you do wish to carry them out, men high up in a place by itself, invested with the awful holiness of God, place the inspired word of Truth. Thus God honored it in the past, thus you must honor it now. Under the wings of the cherubim, by the side of the Ark itself, in the very Holy of Holies, God commanded the copy of His Law to be placed and kept. There too, our Blessed Lord revered it, for He made it the guide of His life and the arbiter of all his ways. He, not man, has said: "The Scripture cannot be broken."

In conclusion, I may say, I cannot too strongly urge upon you all an implicit faith in the Book of God. The fiercest wars have been waged against it in the past; it has been hunted for as an enemy, torn to pieces and burnt. Kings, emperors and nations have been leagued together against it to destroy it, yet it has lived on. Heathen, like Porphyry, and infidels like Voltaire have laughed it to scorn; so-called modern scientists have waived it aside as interfering with their ephemeral and roomy speculations, but it has lived on, for God Himself is in it. Like the brow of the Matterhorn, "visited all night with troops of stars," it seems to belong more to heaven than

It cannot be that in the revelation of the Infinite to man there are not heights that we cannot scale and depths that we cannot plumb—that there are not mysteries too deep and difficulties too great for human intellects to solve, but we say, give us time, we only see now through a glass darkly, but by and by, when the day dawns and the shadows disappear, we shall see clearly and know even as we are known. Of this I am sure, that, when in the last day, God awakens the dead of all ages and bids them stand before His Throne, it will not be to vindicate the writings of Hegel and Straus among the Germans, of Herbert Spencer and Huxley among the English, or of that great host in all lands who are writing to-day against Moses, against David, against Daniel, yea even against our blessed Lord Himself, but it will be to vindicate every jot and every tittle of that inspired Book, which either in whole or in part, has guided the feet and cheered the heart of God's great church for more than three thousand weary years. Stake therefore time and eternity on its awful truthfulness; believe in its full verbal plenary inspiration, and having done so, be assured you have not exceeded, you have not equalled, the sublime dignity ascribed to it by the Lord of truth Himself.

INTERNATIONAL ARBITRATION.

On this most important subject, so necessary for the peace of the world, the following resolutions were passed:

Resolution I.

Resolved—

"That this Committee, while disclaiming any purpose of laying down rules for the conduct of International Arbitration, or of suggesting the special methods by means of which it should proceed, desires to affirm its profound conviction of the value of the principle of International Arbitration, and its essential consistency with the religion of Jesus Christ."

Resolution II.

"That this Committee welcomes the indications of a more enlightened public conscience on the subject of Arbitration, and desires to call the attention of all Christian people to the indications of this healthier state of feeling in the action of Legislatures, and the increasing literature on the subject."

Resolution III.

"That this Committee is of opinion that the progress of International Arbitration may be greatly advanced by the subject being further pressed on the attention of the faithful by the agency of the Pulpit and the Press."

Some of you are doubtless aware how loudly the Psalmists of Commerce and social progress sang the praise of intellectual advancement when the first international fair was held in Hyde Park in the year 1851. Commerce they said had buried the animosities of centuries, made war a forgotten horror of the past, and brought the weary world into a new era of peace and glory. The history of the forty-eight years that have rolled away since then have been a rude awakening from that dream; wars have followed wars, and bloodshed and violence have marked more or less the course of all the nations of the earth. I rejoice to say that the voice of Christianity is now being heard among some of the Cabinets of nations, and that this principle of Arbitration is the outcome alone of that Gospel whose mission is: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace and good will to man."

GENERAL FINANCES.

Owing to the reductions which the Executive Committee have felt it necessary to make in their grants to the Missionary Clergy, a circumstance which we all deeply deplore, a calm and dispassionate view of the Finances of the Diocese may not be out of place.

The *First* fact I wish to emphasize is, that the Diocese is steadily advancing in the total amount it contributes to all objects yearly. This is clearly demonstrated by the following table:

Thus we see that the general offertory for all purposes has risen from \$13,995 in 1884 to \$27,097.90 in 1897, or, in other words, nearly doubled itself. This year the total is not quite so great owing to the fact that last year we had a collection for the Indian Famine Relief Fund, which amounted to \$3,073, and of course this year has no item to balance it.

The *Second* matter I wish to notice is that the internal financial

power of the Diocese has been diminished by the following adverse circumstances:

(a) Shrinkage in Interest. This is proven by the following figures: In the year 1886 the interest from the Commutation Fund amounted to \$17,595.38; in the year 1897 it had fallen to \$14,025.99, a difference of \$3,569.39. If however, we strike an average for the years '86, '87 and '88 we will find that the yearly interest from this Fund was \$17,464.65, shewing a loss in 1897 of \$3,438.66.

(b) Annuities. The amount paid by the Diocese to superannuated men in 1887 was \$5,190.90; in 1898 it was \$8,258, being an increase of \$3,067.10. Hence between the decrease of interest from the Commutation Fund, and increase of Superannuation Annuities, there is a difference in the available income of the Diocese in 1898 compared with 1887 of \$3,438.66 and \$3,067.10, or \$6,505.76. This is a most serious fact, because it goes a great way to explain the present stringency, and clearly demonstrates that by two wholly unavoidable circumstances we have lost a large part of the working income of the church.

DIOCESAN FUNDS.

(c) An examination of the four funds available for Diocesan work will shew the following results:

Synod Assessment Fund.—This Fund, which is a somewhat fair index of the general state of the Diocese, inasmuch as it exhibits the increase both in the number and prosperity of Parishes having representation in Synod, has nearly doubled itself since 1887, being then only \$696, while in 1898 it is \$1,199.81, or only 19 cents short of \$1200.

The Widows and Orphans' Fund.—This Fund, which certainly appeals to the Christian Sympathies of all, has not grown with the rapidity which its benevolent nature would have led us to expect Looking back for some years we find that in the year

Thus since 1887, when the amount contributed was \$1077, there has been an increase of nearly \$800, though I cannot but think it might have been more.

The General Purpose and Mission Funds.—Up till about three years ago the contributions to these funds have been regular, and fairly good, but of late there has been a falling off in both which calls for some explanation. The reason I assign for this falling off in the above mentioned Funds is three-fold. *First*, about three years ago a very serious financial depression occurred throughout the whole of Western Canada. Not only was there a general stagnation of business, but in some places, especially in the north, owing to want of rain, there was a failure of crops which greatly embarrassed the farmers, and rendered them incapable of giving, as otherwise they would gladly have done. That depression, I am most thankful to say, is now rolling away, and brighter prospects lie before us. Let us therefore believe that with God's blessing, this year will bring not only a renewal, but an increase of liberality.

Secondly.—After the experience of the last few years, I am compelled to admit that the dollar a family system has not in all cases worked advantageously to the best interests of the Synod. In some instances, where the plan has been earnestly and persistently worked there has been an undoubted increase in the amount given, but in other places, where the system has only been languidly and feebly followed, I cannot but think the Synod has lost seventy-five per cent. of the former offertory. Under the old plan, when there were four collections in the year, a parishioner might reasonably have given at each a twenty-five cent piece, so that at the close he had contributed his dollar, now he only gives a quarter at the close, thus diminishing his contributions by seventy-five cents a year. This is so serious a fact that it demands the careful attention of our Finance Committee. I cannot but think in many instances it would be far better to return to the old plan of quarterly collections.

Thirdly.—It is with extreme reluctance, and only because I feel compelled to speak, that I have to draw your attention to the large number of blanks in our statistical returns. Some parishes figuring with every call of the Diocese neglected, and nothing after their names to evince their loyalty to the general cause. I cannot but think that the Clergymen of these Parishes make a mistake in ignoring the claims which the Diocese has upon them, and above all the vital principle that we are all parts of the common whole. A single collection omitted by the Clergyman is a wrong to some who would like to give toward the object in need, and a wrong to others who require the help that contribution would have been. The Diocese is not unreasonable, it does not demand that the offertories shall be large, it only asks that they shall be regularly made. I shall say

no more because the subject is painful, only remarking that wherever Parishes are found without a single offertory from them, some kind of official enquiry should be made, not only to understand the cause but if possible to remove it.

Recapitulating therefore what has been said, we find, *first*, that though the total receipts of the Diocese are to-day nearly double what they were in 1884, yet the internal working income is not sufficient for the demands made upon it. *Secondly*, that our internal income from the Commutation Fund has been diminished by the loss of interest to the extent of \$3,438.66. and the draft on income increased by the use of Annuities to the extent of \$3,067.10, so that we have to work with a diminished income, less, through these two above mentioned causes, by \$6505.76 than what it was a few years before.

MISSION FUND DEBT.

I have much pleasure in saying that substantial progress has been made in the way of reducing the debt of the Diocese, and our sincere thanks are due to those Clergymen who often at great inconvenience to themselves have so far canvassed the Diocese on its behalf.

Up to the 1st of June there had been paid in to the office on behalf of the debt the sum of \$9,908.02. Deducting the expenses of the collectors, amounting to \$410.33 we had for actual payment \$9497.69. By the action of the Executive Committee this amount was distributed as follows :

Transferred to General Purpose Fund, \$888.42.

“ “ See House Debt, \$3885.46.

“ “ Mission Fund, \$4723.81.

When we commenced collecting, the Mission Fund Debt stood at \$16,665.08 ; it now stands at \$12,553.32.

THE HURON ANGLICAN LAY WORKERS' AND SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHERS' CONVENTION.

The Huron Lay Workers' Association and the Sunday School teachers of the Diocese held their Seventh Annual Convention in Bishop Cronyn Hall in this city in October last. The session began on the 28th and lasted until the evening of the 30th.

The convention was very largely attended by both the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese. Among those present were the following invited guests : The Revs. Dr. Langtry, Rector of St. Luke's Church ; A. H. Baldwin, Rector of All Saints' ; Gustave Kuhring, Rector of the "Ascension" ; and H. C. Dixon, all of Toronto. General Trowbridge, of Detroit ; Hon. S. H. Blake, Q. C., N. W. Hoyles, Q. C., of Toronto ; His Honor Judge McDonald, of Brockville ; Mr. James Morgan, of Barrie and Miss Osler, of Toronto.

Great praise is due to the untiring zeal and constant energy of Mr. A. H. Dymond, who from the first day of his initiation has been unremitting in his efforts to make all its sessions a success. He never seems to know what weariness is in connection with the development of the work, and every year applies fresh enthusiasm to the cause.

I wish also to mention the invaluable services of our earnest friend, the Rev. John Downie in connection with this movement, ever ready as he is to do all in his power to advance and stimulate the work. The convention was considered helpful and beneficial to all present.

WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

I would again draw the attention of the Synod to this noble Association, and say that I cannot too highly recommend it to the cordial support and loving sympathy of the whole Diocese. And this I do, not merely because it has helped enormously the cause of Domestic and Foreign Missions, but because it has conferred a great spiritual blessing on those who are engaged in its service. All honor I say, to the women who expend their time, their labor and their means on the extension of the Blessed Redeemer's cause, and who are ever willing to deny themselves that they may help those in lands less favored than their own. I note with thankfulness that the Society has given a renewed pledge for Lion's Head of \$400, and is now evincing a steady desire to do what it can for the internal finances of the Diocese, and if it shall happen that through their zeal and devotion in this the hour of our need, substantial help shall come to our somewhat exhausted exchequer, it will only be in accordance with that which I have all along said, that the Women's Auxiliary will not deplete, but rather increase your financial strength, that it will build up, and not pull down the fabric of your prosperity, and while advancing the cause of the Redeemer abroad, will develop His work at home.

THE TEMPERANCE CAUSE.

Most strongly would I urge upon all the members of this Synod to do all in their power to advance the interests of temperance reform. I do not wish to speak on this subject from a political standpoint, but only as a question affecting the deepest and most vital interests of the community at large. The last thing, the most expensive thing we can afford to do, is to do nothing. We must either go forward, and be first, or fall behind and be choked by the dust of those who tramp ahead of us. My own advice is, in the face of all the moral shipwrecks caused by the inordinate love of strong drink, in the face of the fact, that as Christian men we ought to be whole-some examples to the flock, we cannot possibly do better than accept

the inspired dictum of St. Paul, that it is good neither to eat flesh, nor to drink wine, nor anything whereby a brother stumbleth, or is offended, or is made weak. Self-sacrifice was the absorbing principle manifested by all the life and teaching of our blessed Lord. He gave Himself for us. Therefore greater than liberty itself, coveted highly though it may be, is the pure law of self-sacrifice which has led some to forego for Christ's sake even liberty, that by denying self they might save the lost. If, however, there are some who do not see their way to assuming so strong a position, I would recommend to them the Church of England Temperance Society, which was established in England some years ago, and which, while allowing liberty, binds its members to do all they can to alleviate one of the greatest evils of the day.

In conclusion, I would recommend the whole cause to your most earnest and prayerful attention, urging for the education of the young, the formation of Bands of Hope and other temperance organizations in order that when they come to the battle of life they may be the better prepared for the forces arranged against them.

CONSECRATIONS.

I have consecrated during the year :

First, St. Andrew's Church, Harrow, in the county of Essex. Great praise is due to this congregation and their energetic and hard working Rector, T. F. Whealen, for their self-denying efforts in buying and paying for this church, which was much needed. There is good lot of land attached to the church.

Secondly, St. George's Church, Samia. This noble edifice was opened in June, 1884 at a cost of about \$24,000, and was consecrated by me on the First Sunday in Advent, November 28th, 1897, a little more than 13 years after. I wish to speak in the highest praise of the noble efforts made by the Rector, the Rev. Canon Davis, and his congregation in effecting the consecration of so costly a building. It has been a long struggle, but now happily all over, so that the congregation can enjoy the luxury of worshipping in a church absolutely free from debt.

Thirdly, Christ Church, Port Albert. This beautiful and commodious church was consecrated by me on the 15th day of December last. The fabric is brick, on a stone foundation, dimensions 52x32 with a porch 9x14. The building is valued at \$3000 and seats 180 people. The Rector, the Rev. Thomas L. Armstrong, and his people deserve great praise for the zeal and self-sacrifice they have shown in effecting this result.

NEW CHURCHES OPENED.

I have opened the following new churches :

First, Trinity Church, Mitchell. This church was opened for

Divine Service on the 3rd Sunday in Advent, 12th of December last. The Clergyman, the Rev. John Kerrin, and congregation are greatly to be congratulated in the erection of this handsome edifice. The material is brick, the seating capacity 450. Liability about \$2000.

Secondly, Church of the Holy Saviour, Waterloo. This church was opened for Divine Service on the 2nd Sunday after Epiphany, 16th of last January. It was erected at a cost of \$3,500; its material is brick, dimensions 46x26, with a chancel 20 feet deep. Seating capacity, 200; indebtedness \$1400. Great praise is due to this earnest and enterprising congregation.

Thirdly, St. Stephen's Church, Courtright. This church was opened for Divine Service on Septuagesima Sunday, February 6th. Fabric, wood; seating capacity, 200; indebtedness, \$700. The Rector, Rev. Roger W. Howard and the congregation are to be congratulated.

RE-OPENING.

On the 19th Sunday after Trinity, October 24th, St. James' Church, London, was re-opened for Divine Service, after having undergone great alterations in the way of enlargement. Its seating capacity has now been increased to 850, and the church in every way beautified and adorned. The congregation and its Rector, Ven. Archdeacon Davis, deserve great praise for their zeal and self-sacrifice.

Before leaving this subject I would impress upon the Clergy the absolute necessity of giving their candidates all the time and instruction which the solemnity of the occasion requires. The discrepancy between the numbers confirmed and the increase of communicants shows how many there are confirmed whose religious convictions are only of the lightest and most ephemeral character.

I would also repeat the suggestion, that all who have been confirmed, whether minors or adults, should at once be asked to contribute toward the support of the church. Let their names at once be entered in a book with the sum opposite which they promise to give and let the authorities see to its fulfilment. In this way you will educate your young people to the great Christian principle of giving.

total amount for the previous year was \$27097.90, which however, included a collection of over three thousand dollars for the India Famine Fund. Omitting this, which was of a special nature, there would be an increase for the past year over the previous year of more than a thousand dollars.

DIOCESAN DEBT.

1 The canvass of the Diocese toward the extinction of Debt has been completed by the Honorary Agents in the counties of Brant, Elgin, Kent, Middlesex, Norfolk, Perth, Waterloo and Lambton, and a sum approaching \$16,000 has been subscribed, of which about \$10,000 has been paid in. The Committee had expected a much larger sum and still hope that when the canvass is completed this amount will be greatly increased.

2. In order to reach this desirable end the committee recommend the appointment of the Rev. F. E. Roy as a special agent to complete the work, such appointment to be for one year with a stipend of \$700 and necessary travelling expenses.

3. In view of the number of parishes failing to comply with the requirements of the Synod in the matter of collections, it is recommended that special Diocesan envelopes be prepared for all Diocesan collections and distributed in the churches and that all such moneys be transmitted to the Synod Office without delay.

There was paid in cash towards the debt during the year the sum of \$5143.57, which added to the sum on hand at the beginning of the year, \$4309.05, and savings bank interest, \$217.14, makes in all \$9669.76. The travelling expenses of the collectors for the year amounted to \$172.07, and the balance, \$9497.69, has been divided among the funds entitled as follows: 4 parts to the General Purpose Fund, 15 parts to the Mission Fund and 15 parts to the See House Debt Account, except in cases where special directions as to appropriation were given by the subscribers. The amounts thus transferred were \$888.42 to the General Purpose Fund; \$4723.81 to the Mission Fund and \$3885.46 to the See House Debt Account.

In view of the discussion that took place at the last meeting of Synod, all moneys received this year have been divided strictly in the proportions directed by the Canon, except where positive instructions were given not to so divide. This will account to some extent for the apparent decrease in the amount credited to the General Purpose Fund and increase in the amount credited to the Mission Fund.

Your Committee regret to have to draw attention to the fact that the above collections show a gradual reduction each year, the collections for the past year being \$319.09 less than the previous year and \$1530.06 below those of three years ago.

The amount of required contributions from the whole Diocese, at the rate of one dollar per family, was \$11666.75, the amount actually received, not including arrears, was \$8104.61, or about 69% the same as last year, according to the number of families returned.

THE MISSION FUND.

The subscriptions, collections and assessments received for this fund amounted to \$3847.93; collections on Bishop's visits, \$80.40; donations, \$60.25; interest from Mission Fund Investments, \$178.42; Sustainment Fund Interest, \$2302.38 and surplus interest from Commutation Fund, \$3803.40. We have also to acknowledge with thanks the receipt of \$308.56 from the Womans' Auxiliary Missionary Association towards the Lion's Head Mission, this being the largest amount raised by them for this purpose in one year.

In consequence of the reduction of 50% in the grants from this fund under the Canon, except those of Deacons and Priests entitled to receive less than \$800 a year; the amount paid last year for grants was \$1749.93 less than the previous year, the figures being \$10113.16 and \$11863.09 for the two years respectively.

There was transferred from the Diocesan Debt Subscriptions \$4723.81, reducing the overdraft, which was \$16665.08 at the beginning of the year, to \$12553.32. The fact, however must not be overlooked, that without this sum of \$4723.81 so transferred, the balance would have been \$17279.13 or \$614.05 more than the balance at the beginning of the year.

Your Committee in March last, caused an estimate to be prepared showing the probable receipts and disbursements of this account for the year, and it having been found that the latter were likely to exceed the former, your committee, in compliance with the directions contained in the provisions of the Mission Fund Canon, passed a resolution directing that in view of the present state of the Mission Fund and of pledges given to subscribers regarding the debt, the *pro rata* reduction enforced last year be now made 100%, and that this take effect from April 1st, 1898.

THE GENERAL PURPOSE FUND.

The amounts credited to this account include subscriptions, assessments and parochial association collections \$3221.56, arrears of Widows' and Orphans' subscriptions, \$25.00, an anonymous subscription of \$50.00 to the Muncey Mission, a donation of \$15.00 and \$888.42 transferred from the Diocesan Debt Subscription Account. There was paid out for Indian Missions School Teacher's Account, \$490.35; Special grants, \$635.00; Widows of Commuted Clergy, \$300.00; Transferred to Widows' and Orphans' Fund as directed by the Canon, \$770.00; Transferred to Episcopal Fund Interest Account, \$711.62; Interest on Overdraft, \$215.66.

The Synod auditors having some time ago recommended that the Synod Expense Account be closed at the end of each fiscal year, we have directed the Sec. Treas. to transfer from the General Purpose Fund such an amount each year as is required to close that account. In accordance therewith, there has been transferred this year the sum of \$4753.31, which overdraws the General Purpose Fund \$4552.18.

INDIAN MISSIONS.

The Missions at the Muncey Indian Reserve and at Walpole Island having become vacant, the former, by the removal of the Incumbent to another Diocese, and the latter, by the death of the Rev. John Jacobs, we were notified by the Department of the Interior of the Dominion Government that they would not, under a rule of their department, be able to continue the yearly grants of \$400.00 made the Incumbents of these Missions.

A strong appeal was sent by his Lordship the Bishop, to the Minister of the Interior, to have the grant allowed at least to one of the Missions, but without success.

As this meant a loss of \$800.00 a year in these two parishes, it seemed almost impossible in the present state of our Mission Fund, to continue our work there as heretofore.

We rejoice, however, to report that upon the matter being brought, by the Bishop's direction, to the notice of the Colonial and Continental Church Society of London, England, this old friend of our Diocese at once made a grant of £50 a year to the Muncey Mission which has enabled us to continue the work there.

The Rev. E. H. Earl, rector of Algonac, Mich., which is immediately across the St. Clair river, also at the Bishop's request, kindly took charge of the Walpole Island Mission with the same grant as was made to the Rev. Mr. Jacobs.

THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The collections for this fund amounted to \$1124.60; entrance fees and subscriptions, \$675.00; donations, \$10.00; transferred from the General Purpose Fund in accordance with the Canon, \$770.00; and interest on W. & O. Fund Capital, \$3194.66.

The sum of \$5866.00 was paid to Widows and Orphans, leaving a small debit balance of \$206.86.

There are now the widows and orphans of 29 clergymen on this fund. During the year one widow remarried, her children remaining on the fund at about the same amount. Two widows, Mrs. Mortimer and Mrs. Elliott, died, and the widow of the late Canon Chance was added to the list.

The Capital Account of this fund is now \$67250.00; a bequest of \$200.00 from the estate of the late Mrs. Labatt having been received.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

Two clergymen, the Rev. F. M. Baldwin and Rev. W. M. Seaborn were placed on this fund during the year, and one name was removed by death, that of the Rev. Canon Chance.

The number on the fund is 18 with one application now pending before us. A special grant equal to what he would be entitled to if superannuated, has been made to him for one year in the hope that he will have recovered his health at the end of that period.

CONSOLIDATED CAPITAL ACCOUNT.

The rate of interest earned for the year was 5% the same as the previous year.

We regret to have to report that the Synod has been assessed by the City of London for the sum of \$10,000 for the year 1899. This, if allowed by the Court of Revision, will require a payment by the Synod next year of over \$200 out of the interest account.

AMENDMENTS TO CANONS.

Several proposals to amend the Canons on the Mission Fund, the Superannuation Fund, and the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, which were suggested at last Synod and referred to us for consideration have engaged our attention during the year. The result of our deliberations will be found in the Convening Circular and will come before you for consideration.

SEE HOUSE DEBT.

The sum of \$3885 46 from the subscriptions received for the Diocesan Debt has been applied towards the amount due herein, which is now reduced from \$14918.37 to \$11032.91.

There are 294 congregations reported in the Synod Journal of 1897. Of these 6 have been closed and 4 have been united with other congregations for S. S. purposes 34 report having no Sunday Schools, and 4 as having Union Schools only.

The Committee have been unable to hear from one congregation in Essex, 10 in Grey and 3 in Kent, 14 in all; none of which have at any time reported having a S. S.

The remaining 232 congregations report 2360 Officers and teachers, 18035 scholars, or a total of 20,395.

Middlesex reports having held quarterly conventions during the past year and for many preceding years and is thoroughly organized, and the effects in their work is most encouraging. The Deaneries of Elgin, Bruce, Lambton, Perth, Huron, Kent and Waterloo report annual conventions, which have been well attended and productive of much good.

The S. S. Committee hope that these gatherings may become a recognized factor in promoting the growth of the church, as they are capable of producing great results. It might stimulate others if the Secretary of the S. S. Committee received reports of all such conventions.

The work of Sunday Schools, not alone in this Diocese, but generally, is much hampered by various impediments. Some of these might be removed. For example:

(a) It is unfortunately too often the case that the clergyman in charge of a mission has three or four appointments for Sunday services, rendering it impossible for him to be able to attend to the various Sunday Schools in his mission. But while the presence, oversight and co-operation of the clergyman in and with the S. S. is of paramount importance, the difficulty may be partially overcome by the plan suggested in clause (d).

(b) Parents are often sadly indifferent to the work of the Sunday School. The Committee think the inauguration of the Home Department system, which will be subsequently referred to, may help to arouse in parents a deeper interest in the teaching provided for their children in spiritual things.

(c) Congregations are apt to consider the Sunday School as a separate organization from the church. If the offerings of the scholars were devoted to missions and charitable purposes, leaving the expenses of the School to be met by the congregation as a part of the regular church expenditure, more interest might perhaps be awakened. Further as to this see clause 6.

(d) Duly qualified Superintendents and Teachers are hard to find. To fill up the vacancies teachers are sometimes pressed into service who are not properly qualified. A remedy suggested is the enlargement of classes. The close personal intercourse of a teacher with a small class is most valuable. The same intercourse with a person unfit to teach may be most hurtful. If enough qualified assistants can be obtained to warrant the division of the school into classes let it be taken as a junior congregation. Let the teachers take different parts of the service. Use selections from the liturgy, with responsive readings and bright hymns, with a talk (not too long) on the S. S. lesson or on the special lesson of the day. This talk will perhaps be the most difficult part of the plan, as it is admittedly hard to interest and instruct a whole S. S.

Home Department. The Committee believe that the Home Department of the S. S., as outlined in the circular sent to the Clergy, though a new feature of the work, is very important and deserves careful consideration. By using this department wisely the great body of our people might be reached and their sympathies aroused and centred on our work.

A decade of earnest concentrated effort in S.S. work by the whole forces of the church would result in a great improvement. Do not let the S. S. be relegated to the background. Let our earnest efforts, our fervent prayers, our liberal offerings, be for the S. S. Let it be thoroughly equipped, well and comfortably housed, and placed in a position to do aggressive work.

We would most earnestly enjoin upon parents the duty of seeing that their children attend the services of the Church.

2. The Report of the Committee on Temperance.

(As amended by the Synod.)

Your Committee, in presenting their Annual Report to the Synod, desire to call especial attention to the very important questions now brought before the Synod.

1. Your Committee thankfully acknowledge that Canada is one of the most temperate countries in the world. They are sure that every true Canadian desires that it may so remain. Yet when they face the fact that notwithstanding all the efforts put forth by the Church in England and by all agencies for the promotion of temperance in the United Kingdom, the drink bill there was last year (1897) the tremendous sum of \$761,408,615, the need of work, vigilance and prayer is apparent.

2. As it is possible that before long the people of Canada may be called on to vote either for or against prohibition your Committee think it eminently desirable that the Synod of the Diocese of Huron should again state its attitude towards this question. Our position is this, that the prevention of drunkenness and of the crime and misery caused by drunkenness must be a part of the work which the Lord has committed to the Church. On this side of the great question the Church must ever be, though our position has often been misrepresented by those opposed to us and sometimes, alas, by those of our own household.

3. We are of opinion that a regulatory law, taking control of the sale of all intoxicants, would be a step in the right direction, since it would take from the sale of liquor the vicious result, inevitable under the present law, that increased consumption brings increased personal gain to the vendor.

4. Your Committee believe that the principle of the Gothenburg system has many commendable features, though the system itself is susceptible of improvement. The Gothenburg plan was introduced to provide a remedy for the ravages made on the constitutions of the citizens of that city by over-indulgence in a strong spirit called "Brauvin," and the Government of Sweden consented to allow the sale of this spirit to be controlled by a Company. But this control did not include any restriction on the sale of beer or wines, which still continued as heretofore. The effect of the new law was to lessen the consumption of spirits about fifty per cent., though the crime of drunkenness did not decrease in proportion, because the beer shops and wine shops were not included in the Company's system and no control was exercised by the Government over the sale of beer and wine.

5. The reform was therefore successful in the desired direction; that is, lessened the consumption of spirits; but to make it of service in Canada such a law should certainly include the control of the sale of all intoxicants.

6. The system in this amended form would offer many advantages undoubtedly tending to promote temperance; and, apart from its regulative effect, it might educate the people to an appreciation of the desirability of

abstaining altogether from the drinking of strong spirits or beer, and substituting therefor wholesome and nutritious beverages.

7. Your Committee recommend the Synod to endorse the principle of a system which would provide for taking the control of the sale of liquor entirely out of the hands of private individuals, putting it under governmental authority for proper administration and effective supervision, and would advance the following reasons why they make this recommendation :—

(a) Such a system would eliminate the element of private profit from liquor selling, as the sale would be carried on by an official whose salary would not be effected by the amount of liquor sold.

(b) It would provide for such supervision that adulteration of liquor would be practically impossible.

(c) It would provide for especial encouragement of the sale of all non-intoxicating drinks, as the salaried officer in charge would receive a commission in addition to his salary on all such drinks which might be sold.

(d) It would make drunkenness in a public house an impossibility, if the salaried officer in charge obeys his orders, as no drunkenness or disorderly conduct would be permitted in such establishments.

(e) It would provide for payment of the same revenue to the Provincial Exchequer from Licenses as is now paid by private individuals.

(f) It is proposed to apply the profits which accrue from the sale of liquor and non-intoxicating drinks in these establishments to the reduction of the taxes, and thus to secure the co-operation of all tax-payers.

(g) Your Committee would strongly recommend further consideration of the details of this system, and that the Committee to be appointed on Temperance be entrusted with full power (a) to watch legislation in this matter and (b) when opportunity may arise to urge upon the Government the adoption of such a system of controlling the liquor traffic; acting whenever possible with the Committees of other Synods or bodies who may be willing to further the adoption of the same or some similar plan.

3. The Report of the Committee on Lord's Day Observance.

1. The observance of the Lord's Day is yearly receiving greater attention by the Church and creating deeper interest among people in general. This arises (a) from the increasing number of those who are led to observe the spirit of the fourth commandment, and (b) from the determined efforts made in many quarters to encroach upon God's share of the week either at the call of pleasure or at the bidding of a greed satisfied only when it has in addition to what God gives to man obtained also what man can take from God.

2. It may be noted that the increasing use of the day for pleasure may not be altogether the result of an increasing love of pleasure for its own sake, but may perhaps be partly caused by the greater pressure of week day work.

3. Greedy and soulless corporations use Sunday (a) to run street cars and steamers and trains for pleasure traffic, and (b) to forward freight trains, because the diminution of passenger traffic leaves a larger opportunity for forwarding freight. Greedy and conscience-seared individuals use Sunday (a) for trade and business of various kinds, and (b) as a receptacle into which to pour the trash and sometimes filth saved up for issue in the Sunday newspapers. Swift express trains scatter the Sunday newspaper into millions of homes, while the quiet of the Sabbath is broken by the cries of the hundreds of men, women and children who sell these questionable publications in the streets of many cities on this continent.

4. In referring to the running of freight trains on Sunday, we have not forgotten that they are said to contain perishable freight. The report of another religious body comments on this by the observed fact that upon such trains had been carried "such perishable goods as cordwood." A member of our Committee draws attention in this connection to the frequent use of Sunday for the running westward of trains of empty cars on the main line of the G. T. R.

5. In the domain of legislation the Ontario Lord's Day Alliance are doing good work. They have achieved much, though not as much as they desired. They will exercise increasing vigilance in this direction, and are deserving not only of thanks for what they have done, but also of our warmest support and our practical sympathy.

6. While we are all agreed as to the observance of the Sunday as a day of rest and worship, a few utterances from various quarters may be of interest. (a) Her Most Gracious Majesty, in the programme of the Jubilee celebration, wrote "June 27.—Repose." That is, in the midst of all the excitement and work incidental to the jubilee, the Queen realized the absolute necessity of rest and worship for herself, and the recognition of the Person and Love of God on his Day. (b) The Synod of Montreal at its last session presented a very lengthy and exhaustive report on Sunday observance. (c) The General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church has also devoted much attention to the same subject, and has made an earnest deliverance. (d) Mr. Gladstone, whose wonderful career has now drawn to a close under such pathetic conditions, has borne testimony to the fact that the Sunday was to him an incalculable boon. The following words from the pen of Mrs. Drew, in an article in "Goodwill," will, we believe, be received with the deepest interest: "Physically, intellectually and spiritually Sunday has been to Mr. Gladstone a priceless blessing. Any one who entered his room in Downing Street on a Sunday, even during the height of the Session, could scarcely fail to be struck by the atmosphere of repose, the devotional books lying open near the armchair, the deserted writing-table, the absence of papers and newspapers. From Saturday night to Monday morning he put away all business of a secular nature and kept to his special Sunday books and thoughts, and never dined out on that day, unless to cheer a sick or sorrowful friend; nor would he ever travel on Sunday."

7. Much criticism has been made concerning some druggists and amusement mongers for their disregard of Sunday. We note as to this two facts: (a) A leading druggist says "My drug store is closed all day Sunday." His reason is not religious. He says, "I want rest; my clerks want rest; in the end I expect it to pay me, or I would not do it." (b) Barnum & Bailey, who employ 1200 hands, have always, they say, refused to exhibit on Sunday. Their declaration is: "Under no circumstances have we ever permitted an exhibition on the Sabbath, even in those cities of the United States where all theatres are open on that day, and where the people seek amusements of all kinds." Surely testimony of such a kind, and from such varied sources, is valuable.

We may sum up the whole matter of the observance of the Lord's Day thus: When God instituted the Sabbath it was intended by Him to be a special blessing to man; that its rest might restore a healthy tone to his body and mind; that its sacred duties might keep alive in him those religious feelings which constant contact with the world would destroy; that, being free from business occupations he might draw near to Him in prayer and praise, and thus become better fitted to fight the battle of life, until at last, the victory being won, he would exchange this scene of trial and probation for a heavenly welcome and an eternal rest.

4. The Report of the Committee on Religious Instruction in the Public Schools.

(As amended by the Synod.)

The Committee on Religious Instruction in the Public Schools beg to report:

1. That it is essential both for the community and the children that there should be religious instruction in the primary schools.
2. That a half hour each school day, and if possible the first half hour, should be given to such religious instruction.
3. That reasonable arrangements should be made for such religious instruction being given by the Clergy or their deputies to the children of their own communion, or by the teacher in the case of communions agreeable to this.
4. That where the above cannot be carried out we shall rejoice at the introduction into the school "Course of Studies" of such religious instruction as shall include the teaching of (1) Selections from the Old and New Testament, and (2) The Apostles' Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments.
5. That the Synod continue the appointment of a Committee on Religious Instruction in the Public Schools and authorize such committee to communicate with any Committees of other Synods upon the subject.

5. The Report of the Committee on Provincial Reorganization:

The Committee on Provincial Reorganization beg to report:

1. Your Committee finds that it is absolutely necessary (and your Committee desires) to maintain, and if possible improve the good management of the affairs of the Church in Canada, and at the same time to reduce the expenses thereof, and your Committee finds also that the most practicable and desirable means to that end is to so amend the Constitution of the Provincial Synod at the next two concurrent sessions thereof, that as far as practicable the General Synod should supersede the Provincial Synod of Canada, and the latter should meet (if at all) only when necessity may require a session thereof; and your Committee recommends that the various Diocesan Synods in this Province be respectfully requested to unite in the endeavor to procure such amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Provincial Synod as will abolish or materially reduce the number of sessions and expense of the Provincial Synod, and as will conduce to the strength, usefulness and efficiency of the General Synod.
2. Your Committee recommends that a memorial be sent to both houses of the Provincial Synod and of the General Synod embodying the statements and findings herein contained and praying that the desires and recommendations herein contained be carried into effect, and that a copy of this report be sent to each member of the Provincial Synod Committee on Memorials from Dioceses of Toronto, Huron and Montreal.
3. Your Committee recommends that notice of motion be given in the Provincial Synod for the Draft Canon accompanying this report with the object of amending Clause IV. of the Constitution of the Provincial Synod; and that the delegates to the Provincial Synod be requested to support such a Canon in the Provincial Synod as furthering the chief object of this Synod in the matter of Provincial Reorganization.

CANON TO ALTER THE CONSTITUTION AND CANONS RELATING TO THE TIME OF MEETING OF THE PROVINCIAL SYNOD OF CANADA.

WHEREAS, it was declared in the formation of the Provincial Synod that one object should be to promote the further consolidation and united action of the whole of the Dioceses of British North America,

AND WHEREAS, the Dioceses of Canada have now been consolidated and united in the General Synod with such powers as by its Constitution appear :

AND WHEREAS, such General Synod can in future perform many duties which heretofore have devolved upon the Provincial Synod of Canada :

AND WHEREAS, the Provincial Synod desires to do what may conduce to the strength, usefulness and efficiency of the General Synod, and to prevent the Government and Legislation in the Church from becoming too expensive or burdensome, while at the same time reserving and preserving the rights and powers of the Provincial Synod for action when necessary.

AND WHEREAS, so long as the General Synod satisfactorily exercises the various powers conferred upon it, less frequent sessions of the Provincial Synod than as now provided for will be sufficient ; and the Synod should meet only when business which ought to be transacted by it may require attention.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Provincial Synod of Canada as follows :

1. Clause Number 4 of the Constitution of the Provincial Synod shall be and the same is hereby amended by striking out the words "On the second Wednesday of September in every third year or oftener," so that the whole clause as amended shall read as follows : " 4. The Synod shall meet at the discretion of the Metropolitan, or on the requisition of any two Bishops, or of the Bishop and half the delegates of each order in any Diocese."

2. That any provision in any Canon inconsistent herewith shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

6. Report of the Delegates to the General Synod Board of Missions :

At the last meeting of the Synod of Huron four representatives were appointed to represent the Diocese of Huron on the Board of Missions of the General Synod.

Two of these representatives, the Rev. David Williams and Mr. Charles Jenkins attended the meeting of the Board ordered by the General Synod to be held in Montreal on the 13th of October, 1897.

The Eastern Dioceses were not fully represented. Representatives from Rupert's Land and New Westminster were present. It was found that for a variety of causes the Board could not be organized.

The consolidation and more efficient administration of the general Mission work of the Church in the Dominion were leading objects of the consolidation of the Church, constitutionally completed in 1893. These objects were discussed by the various Diocesan Synods before consolidation, and Provincial Synod action authorizing the movement, was taken with the avowed intention of consolidating the general mission work of the Church as speedily as possible.

The Provincial Synod of Canada, at its meeting in September, 1895, did not reach the consideration of the Archdeacon of Kingston's motion to merge its

Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society in that of the larger body, before the time for adjournment had arrived.

At the second session of the General Synod held at Winnipeg in September, 1896, a scheme for a general Board of Missions was adopted, and the date for the first meeting of the Board fixed as above mentioned.

The Diocesan Synod of Montreal met in January, 1897, and passed a condemnatory resolution of the scheme. At the meeting of the Diocesan Synod of Rupert's Land in June, 1897, the Primate took the occasion to controvert in a very powerful way the resolution of the Synod of Montreal.

The effect of our Provincial Synod's inaction and the Synod of Montreal's objection, was that the General Board could not get to work, and no action by it can be taken until the Provincial Synod of Canada merges its Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society into that of the General Synod.

Your Representatives at the General Synod Mission Board meeting would respectfully suggest that it be an instruction to the delegates from the Synod of Huron to the Provincial Synod, which meets next September, that they support the movement to merge the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Provincial Synod of Canada into that of the General Synod of the Dominion.

A practical illustration of the necessity for this action is supplied by a resolution passed at the Provincial Board meeting, October, 1897:

Moved by the Bishop of Toronto, seconded by the Bishop of Ottawa:

That the Secretary do respectfully signify to each Bishop the great difficulty experienced by the Board in appropriating its funds, in the absence of information as to the definite needs and means available from all sources; and do further represent to each of the Bishops that the Board will for the future confine its aid to those Dioceses whose Bishops may be good enough to make formal application to them, setting forth in definite form the work or objects for which they desire aid, with any amount already available for it, and using for this purpose the schedule adopted by the Board.

The General Synod Scheme provides the estimate of resources and necessities in its mission field be made annually.

Any improvement that requires to be made in the Scheme—can best be done in action—and the sooner that can take place the better.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

7. The Report of the Committee on Unused Churches

The Committee on Unused Churches beg to report that there are no unused churches in the Counties of Brant, Bruce, Elgin, Grey, Huron, Middlesex and Waterloo, and also the same thing may be said of the County of Oxford, as services have recently been resumed at Drumbo by Rev. F. Leigh, and Rev. E. W. Hughes, of Tilsonburg, advises no action with reference to Culloden, "pending a possible arrangement to re-open with regular services."

The Rural Dean of Essex reports but one unused church in that Deanery, viz., St. George's, Trudell. He suggests its removal to Tilbury, where there is no church edifice, or that it should serve for the congregations of Strangfield and Mersea by uniting these congregations and moving the building half way between them. It is a frame building erected in 1863, 60x45, and is in a fair state of repair. The lot is an acre wide and 208 feet and runs back about 300 feet. We recommend that a commissioner be sent to report upon it.

The Rural Dean of Kent reports only one unused church in his Deanery, viz., in Duart, "a comfortable brick church." He advises its sale, as there are but two or three families attached to the church, and he is of opinion it will not be used again.

The Rural Dean of Lambton reports the following unused churches in that Deanery:

1. Kettle Point, neat little frame church in fair state of repair, never likely to be used by us. Would recommend that it be sold if possible.

2. Hillsboro, old frame church in bad state of repair, four miles from Forest, not likely to be used again. Might be given to Forest and used for Sunday School purposes.

3. Froomfield, little frame church in bad state of repair, but sound frame. About one mile from Corunna and joining Indian Reserve. Might be given to the Indians, as their church is of little value.

4. Sombra Village, frame church, once fair congregation, might be again, but there does not appear to be any way to supply services. This church might be given to congregation at Becher, six miles distant. They worship in a school house and have no church.

Colinsville, frame church, out of repair, formerly attached to Mooretown. If there was any way of giving service, there might still be a congregation who would worship there. If there were two men in Mooretown, the whole field could be worked and something done with Brigden, Colinsville and Sombra. Your Committee are of opinion that action on the line suggested by the Rural Dean should at once be taken in the interests of the church in that Deanery, and that a Commissioner be appointed to report upon it.

The Rural Dean of Norfolk reports two unused churches in his Deanery, viz., Port Ryerse and Langton.

The Rural Dean of Perth reports two unused churches in that Deanery, viz., Trowhige and Moncton. There seems but small prospect of either of them being used at present, and recommend the appointment of a Commissioner to investigate and report.

It would appear that there are only twelve unused churches in the Diocese, all small, and that in some cases the congregations may be revived, and the buildings utilized for the same purposes for which they were erected, which in all cases should be aimed at and their sale or alienation should only be considered as a last resort.

That hereafter the Secretary-Treasurer shall, after the meeting of the Executive Committee, held in the month of March, at which the stipend assessments for the year are confirmed, transmit, before the Easter vestry meeting, to all clergymen and church-wardens of all parishes receiving grants from the Mission Fund, a complete list of all such parishes and the amount of their several assessments for stipend for the year, as confirmed by the Executive Committee; and the Secretary-Treasurer shall also cause to be printed in the Synod Journal and in the Appendix to the Journal, in a column in juxtaposition that containing the mission grants to each of the missionary clergy, the amount of stipend for which their parishes have been severally assessed, together with a statement of all monies received from any endowments or other sources of parochial income to the clergyman's stipend.

The annual meeting of the Association, conjointly with the Convention of Lay Workers and Sunday School Teachers, was held in London on the 29th October, 1897. The proceedings of the Convention extended over three days, the attendance was large and the interest was well sustained to the close.

Prominent members of the church from the Dioceses of Toronto, Ontario and Michigan were present and made very valuable contributions to the debates.

On the kind invitation of the Rector and congregation of St. George's Church, Sarnia, it is proposed to hold the next meeting in that western town. The situation is not so central as might be desired, but it is the desire and object of the Committee to give all parts of the Diocese in turn the pleasure and benefit of having one of these inspiring gatherings in their midst, and the Committee cannot doubt but that with the strong and live churchmanship to be found in the deaneries of Lambton, Essex, Kent and Middlesex, with a liberal contingent from the See City of London and other church centres the attendance will be all that can be desired. The enthusiastic assistance of the clergy and laity in the counties named and in all parts of the Diocese is most earnestly invoked.

Conscious of the importance of economy in all departments of Synod expenditure at the present time, the Committee have carefully abstained from making any claims upon Synod funds not of immediate importance.

The sum expended during the past year amounts to \$56.15.

The minutes of the previous day's business were read by the Hon. Clerical Secretary, and being approved by the Synod, were signed by the Chairman.

Receiving Reports of Committees.

9. The Report of Committee on Vital Statistics:

Your Committee has investigated the subject of Vital Statistics for the Province of Ontario. They have corresponded with men who are in positions to know the facts, such as the superintendents of hospitals, medical practitioners, and also with men likely to be close observers of social and moral tendencies, such as the Bishops of the church, and prominent men both clerical and lay in the church and other religious bodies.

The Committee beg to report :

1. The Birth Rate. The birth rate for the Province of Ontario is the lowest of any country or province that has come before the attention of your committee, even below that for France. The rate for Ontario as a whole is 20.7 per 1000; the rate for France is 21.9; the rate in Quebec oscillates between 36 and 40 per 1000.

The rates for some other countries and provinces are as follows: Massachusetts, 29.02 per 1000; Ireland, 23.2 per 1000; Great Britain, 30.4 per 1000.

As the result of their investigation, your committee is of the opinion that the abnormally low birth rate in Ontario is due mainly to the following:

(a) Selfish and materialistic views of life; the Divine and social ends of marriage are sacrificed to personal ease; Wives shrink from the duties and cares of motherhood; marriage is degraded to minister to animal pleasure while its social responsibilities are ignored.

(b) The use of preventatives to child-bearing. To quote the words of a superintendent of one of our large city hospitals, this practice "prevails to an alarming extent," and a leading medical practitioner declared that some of the practices resorted to were "filthy and degrading."

(c) Changed social conditions. The substitution of women for men in many positions, the expense of living, and the emigration of the young men into the Northwest, the United States and elsewhere.

(d) Defective registration. Possibly the registration of births is not quite complete. The change in the Registration Act of 1896 has slightly altered the results, and a more stringent enforcement of that law might further alter them.

In view of these facts and inferences, your Committee beg to recommend:—

1. That the clergy be exhorted to be wise, to the Divine will.

3. That the Synod be exhorted to be wise in Ontario:

"In view of the fact that the Province is to be abnormally morally and otherwise, it is the duty of the Synod to make a statement complete and trustworthy."

2. The Death Rate. The death rate in 1897 was 24.857; of this number 5,724 were due to deaths in the year from birth; 4,400 were five years old, and 1,324 were over five years old.

Of the pre-natal deaths, while the rate in the cities, while the rate in the rural districts is only 1/4.

Of the total number of deaths, 50% die before they are five years old.

In the rest of the Province:

Your Committee beg to report that these figures, (1) the enormous percentage of deaths in the cities. And in the rural districts these deaths are avoided.

"In view of the fact that the reports of the Registrar-General for the Province to be abnormally low, and inasmuch as the said fact is of grave significance morally and otherwise, the Synod of the Diocese of Huron petitions the Legislature to make a stringent enforcement of the Registration Act so as to secure complete and trustworthy returns."

2. The Death Rate. The total number of deaths in the year 1896 was 24,857; of this number 2,758 were due to consumption, or 1 out of every 9; 5,724 were due to pre-natal causes, *i.e.*, were either still-born or died under one year from birth; *i.e.*, a trifle over 1 out of every 4 deaths; 7,767 died before they were five years old, or 1 out of every 3.

Of the pre-natal total, 2,008, or nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ of the whole belonged to the cities, while the ratio of the population of the cities to the whole population is only $\frac{1}{4}$.

Of the total number of deaths in cities, the pre-natal count $\frac{1}{3}$, and nearly 50% die before they are 5 years old.

In the rest of the Province $\frac{1}{2}$ of the deaths are before the age of 5.

Your Committee beg to draw the Synod's attention to the two facts shown by these figures, (1) the large percentage of deaths due to consumption, (2) the enormous percentage of infant mortality all over the Province, but especially in the cities. And in view of the fact that in the opinion of medical men many of these deaths are avoidable, your Committee recommend:

That the clergy help the medical profession in isolating consumption patients either in their homes or otherwise; that they use every opportunity to teach the poor in the laws of health regarding infants; and that the Synod petition the Ontario Government to set forth as a necessary branch in education, especially of girls, some knowledge of the duties of motherhood.

And the following to be added to clause 4: "Whenever charges are preferred by three or more members of the church, or by three or more presbyters, a deposit of at least one hundred dollars must be made by them to defray expenses, before the charges can be entertained. In case the charges are not sustained, all expenses incurred are forfeit out of the above deposit."

Clause 6, instead of the first seven lines, have the following restored: "The Bishop shall cause a copy of the charges to be served on the accused, who shall, within seven days after such service, have the privilege of nominating five members of the Committee of Discipline, and shall notify their names to the Bishop in writing, (if the accused shall fail to nominate, the Bishop shall then choose five members of the said Committee)."

Clause 29, to read: "All other expenses, necessarily incurred by the Commissioners, or Board of Triers, in any investigation or trial under the Canon, and any further legitimate costs of the accused, when the verdict is 'not guilty' or 'not proven,' shall be paid by the Synod out of the Synod Expense Account."

To the General Purposes Fund, three-eighths of the whole.

To the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, one-eighth of the whole,

Any unexpended balance of the General Purpose Fund shall be transferred to the Mission Fund.

The parishes may raise their required contributions as heretofore, or by special services, meetings, collections and subscriptions, as may by each of them be deemed most expedient and suited to their circumstances. Provided always that an annual Missionary Meeting or Service shall be held in each parish.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary-Treasurer at the beginning of each financial year to notify the Clergyman and Churchwardens of each parish of the amount of their required contribution, basing it on the last annual statistical report to the Bishop, which report shall contain the number of all the families known to belong to the Church in the parish, and the Missions Committee of each Rural Deanery shall act in co-operation with the Clergyman and Churchwardens of each parish in raising the same.

All such monies shall be sent forthwith to the Secretary-Treasurer of Synod.

And substitute the following:

In order to more fully promote the objects of the Synod, annual subscriptions and donations shall be collected from each congregation in such manner as shall be deemed most effective, and every endeavor made to augment the resources of the Synod. All money raised shall be transmitted to the Secretary-Treasurer. An annual missionary meeting shall be held or sermon preached in each church or other suitable place, and a collection made for the Mission Fund of the Diocese. Six collections shall be made annually, the proceeds of two of which shall be devoted to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, and the proceeds of the other four to the Maintenance and Mission Fund, and at other times for such purposes as the Bishop may direct. The collections shall be forwarded to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod within fourteen days after being made. It shall be the duty of every Clergyman to give notice of these collections, and to call the attention of his congregation to the importance of the objects, and their claims for liberal support.

The Bishop then rose to dismiss the Synod :

He said he desired to draw attention to a few salient points. He trusted that a loyal spirit would pervade all members of the Synod. If there had been things done which were contrary to the judgment of some, he trusted that all would believe that what had been accomplished was according to the best judgment of each. If there had been faults, they were only errors of judgment. He desired the members to bear in mind that if the Diocese is to progress, they must observe the rules. No institution can succeed unless its laws are carried out in a loyal spirit. The Executive Committee had grave duties to perform, and these had to be dealt with in a calm and deliberate way. He thought at the beginning that a very large majority were in favor of a separation of the funds. The result proved that such was not the case. It only showed how easily one can be mistaken in his judgment of others. He called attention to the important subject brought before them by the Committee on Vital Statistics, and thought it the duty of the Clergy to call attention thereto. Before separating he trusted that God would lead them to a right judgment in all things and that they would bring the Diocese often to the Throne of Grace. He prayed that God would give them the fulness of His blessing.

The Doxology was then sung and His Lordship dismissed the Synod with the benediction at 2 p.m.
