Consecration Service.

Churchwarden.

My Lord, I humbly desire, in my own name, and in the name of the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry, that your Lordship would be pleased, by your ordinary and episcopal authority, to proceed to consecrate this new Church according to the Rites and Discipline of the Church of England.

The Bishop, accepting the Petition, will answer and consent, saying:

Sir, if this be your desire and the desire of the Rector, Church Wardens, and Vestry, in the Name of God let us begin.

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with thy most gracious favour, and further us with thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in thee, we may glorify thy Holy Name; and finally by thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Then the Bishop and Clergy, entering the Church by the West Door and proceeding up the middle thereof towards the East end, shall say or sing the 24th Psalm.

THE earth is the Lord's, and all that therein is: the compass of the world, and they that dwell there in.

For He hath founded it up on the seas: and prepared it up on the floods.

Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord: or who shall rise up in His holy place?

Even he that hath clean hands, and a pure heart: and hath not lift up his mind unto vanity, nor sworn to deceive his neighbour.

He shall receive the blessing from the Lord: and righteousness from the God of his salvation.

**The Bishop, standing on the North side of the Holy Table and
turning to the Congregation, will say:**

DEARLY BELOVED in the Lord, Forasmuch as devout
and holy men, as well under the Law as under the Gospel,
moved either by the secret interpretation of the blessed
Spirit, or by express command of God, or by their own reason
and sense of the natural decency of things, have erected
houses for the public worship of God, and have separated them
from all profane and common uses, in order to fill men's minds
with greater reverence for His glorious Majesty, and affect
their hearts with more devotion and humility in His service;
which pious works our heavenly Father hath vouchsafed to
approve and accept; let us not doubt but he will also graciously
approve this our godly purpose of setting apart this place in
solemn manner to religious worship, and let us faithfully and
devoutly beg His blessing on this undertaking, and say,

Then (all kneeling) the Bishop will say the Prayer following.

O ETERNAL GOD, mighty in power, of majesty incom-
prehensible, whom the heaven of heavens cannot con-
tain, much less the walls of temples made with hands, and who
yet has been graciously pleased to promise thy especial pres-
ence in whatsoever place even two or three of thy faithful

servants shall assemble in thy name to offer up their supplications and their praises to thee; vouchsafe, O Lord, to be now present with us, who are gathered here together to consecrate this place, with all humility and readiness of heart, to the honor of thy great name, separating it henceforth from all unhallowed, ordinary, and common uses, and dedicating it entirely to thy service, for reading therein thy most holy Word, for celebrating thy holy Sacraments, for offering to thy glorious Majesty the sacrifice of prayer and thanksgiving, for blessing thy people in thy Name, and performing all other holy ordinances; accept, O Lord, this service at our hands, and bless it with such success as may most tend to thy glory and the furtherance of our happiness both temporal and spiritual, through Jesus Christ our blessed Lord and Saviour. *Amen.*

After this, the Bishop (standing up, and turning his face towards the Congregation) will say:

REGARD, O Lord, the supplications of thy servants, and grant that whosoever shall be dedicated to thee in this house by baptism, may be sanctified with the Holy Ghost, delivered from thy wrath and eternal death, and received as a living member of Christ's Church, and may ever remain in the number of thy faithful and elect children. *Amen.*

GRANT, O LORD, that they who in this place shall in their own persons undertake to renew the promises and vows made by their sureties for them at their baptism, and thereupon shall be confirmed by the Bishop, may continue thine for ever; and being preserved in the unity of thy Church, may daily increase in thy holy Spirit more and more, until they come to thine everlasting kingdom. *Amen.*

GRANT, O LORD, that whosoever shall receive in this place the blessed Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ thy Son, may come to that holy ordinance with a true penitent heart, lively faith, and perfect charity; and being filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction, may to their great and endless comfort obtain remission of their sins, and all other benefits of His passion. *Amen.*

GRANT, O LORD, that whosoever shall be joined together in this place in the holy estate of Matrimony, may faithfully perform and keep the vow and covenant letwixt them made, and may remain in perfect love together unto their lives' end, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

GRANT, O LORD, that all such as have, through thy mercy, been preserved in the great danger of Child-birth, and shall come to this place, according to their bounden duty, to give thee thanks for the same, may, through thy help, both faithfully live and walk according to thy will in this life present, and also be partakers of everlasting glory in the life to come, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

GRANT, O LORD, that all who enter into this place may behave themselves with great reverence, devotion, and humility, both of body and mind; and vouchsafe unto them what, in thine infinite wisdom and mercy, thou shalt see to be most expedient for them. And be pleased graciously to hear the prayers of thy servants in this place for all such as are afflicted in mind, body, or estate, granting them patience under their sufferings, and a happy issue out of all their afflictions. [And this we beg for Jesus Christ his sake.] *Amen.*

GRANT, O LORD, that by thy Holy Word which shall be read and preached in this place, the hearers thereof may both perceive and know what things they ought to do, and may have grace and power to fulfil the same. *Amen.*

Then the Bishop sitting in his Chair, one of the Clergy is to read publicly (having been directed so to do by the Bishop) the sentence of Consecration.

Then the Officiating Minister reads the Morning Service for the day.

PROPER PSALMS, 48, 122, 132.

PROPER LESSONS: { *The First.* I Chron: xxix, v. 10 to 20.
The Second. Hebrews x, v. 19 to 26.

Instead of the Collect for the day the Bishop says the following Prayer:

O MOST BLESSED SAVIOUR, who by thy gracious presence at the Feast of Dedication, didst approve and honour those and such like religious services, be pleased so to possess our souls by thy grace that we may be living temples, holy and acceptable unto thee: and, being cleansed from all carnal and corrupt affections, may be devoutly given to serve thee in good works, who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. *Amen.*

Then the Minister proceeds in the Service of the Day to the end of the General Thanksgiving. After which the Bishop says the following Prayer:

BLESSED be thy name, O Lord, that it hath pleased thee to put into the hearts of thy servants to erect this house to thy honour and worship. Bless, O Lord, them, their families, and substance, and accept the work of their hands; remember them concerning this; wipe not out this kindness that they have showed for the House of God, and the offices thereof; and grant that all who shall enjoy the benefit of this pious work, may show forth their thankfulness by making a right use of it, to the glory of thy blessed name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Then the Minister who officiates is to go on with the "Prayer of St. Chrysostom," and the "Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Then the Bishop proceeds to the Communion Service, and after the Commendments and one of the Collects for the Queen, instead of the Collect for the day is to be used the following Collect:

O MOST GLORIOUS LORD GOD, we acknowledge that we are not worthy to offer unto thee anything belonging to us; yet we beseech thee in thy great goodness, graciously to accept of the dedication of this place to thy service, and to prosper this our undertaking: Fill us, we beseech thee, with an awful dread of thy Divine Majesty, and with a deep sense of our unworthiness; that so approaching thy sanctuary with lowliness and devotion, and coming before thee with clean

thoughts, pure hearts, with bodies undefiled, and minds sanctified, we may always perform a service acceptable to thee, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Then the Bishop reads the Nicene Creed.
