The steamer Vancouver, which left Charlottetown on the 27th ult., arrived at Liverpool on Friday night last, making the passage in about eight days.

An Ottawa despatch of the 4th inst. says: Professor Robertson, will address meetings in this island, on the subject of laying, between the 15th and 25th July.

In the British House of Commons, on Tuesday last, for the purpose of a vote of censure on the British cabinet, from England to France, was rejected by a vote of 231 to 153.

A steamer was burned near the harbor of Toledo, Ohio, on the night of the 4th inst. She had no passengers on board.

News reached Milwaukee, Wis., the other day, from Shawano, Wis., that fifty hundred Indians, armed with Winchester rifles on the Monomonic Reservation, had driven the Indian agent off, and that twelve had been killed.

A Liverpool despatch of the 4th inst. says: Sir Charles Tupper, Canadian High Commissioner in England, will leave for Canada tomorrow to assist in the settlement of the Newfoundland fisheries troubles and an appeal.

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REV. D. J. GILLIS

CREATED A ROMAN PRELATE.

FATHER GILLIS' many friends were agreeably surprised, yesterday, to learn of the fact that he had been conferred on him.

It is about twenty years since he finished his ecclesiastical studies at the Grand Seminary, Montreal, where he was ordained a priest.

His first field of labor was St. Andrew's, having also for a time acted as curate of St. Peter's and St. Mary's.

About ten years ago he was transferred to the flourishing parish of St. Columba, where his activity has been especially noticeable in the material improvements effected by him.

The crowning glory of his pastoral career being the building of the parish church, which is one of the most conspicuous features of the city.

Indeed it justly ranks among the handsome private residences on the island.

He has travelled much in such manner as he could spare from the activities of his ministry.

He made the transatlantic trip with His Lordship the Archbishop four years ago. On that trip he made many friends and acquaintances who will read with pleasure the announcement of his newly conferred honors.

Last year he accompanied the Bishop to Rome. It was during his stay in the Eternal City that Bishop Hildesheim, who from his frequent contact with him, had learned to appreciate his many good qualities of mind and heart, decided to take for him a special mark of favor.

He conferred on him the rank of Prelate, and said he would see to it that the mark of honor should be conferred on him.

HALIFAX, June 9.—A miniature cyclone struck the city at two o'clock this afternoon and the harbor was lashed into a fury.

Several small boats were blown away to the harbor without doing any damage.
