All communication between Baltimore and Washington is severed. Nothing from the Confederates is heard.

Commercial Progress of Britain.

A debate in the House of Commons, on the 17th inst., by Mr. Lindsay, in relation to the commerce of the world to our shores by the repeal of the Navigation Laws in 1849, would have compelled countries like France, Holland and the United States, to follow our example. It has not been so.

In 1849 the tonnage of Great Britain amounted to 3,500,000 tons; in 1862 it was 4,500,000 tons; in 1864 it was 5,000,000 tons.

The intervening period has been the shipowners' millennium, and they have thrived in this extraordinary degree ever since the time when the Legislature determined that the ships of all nations should enter our ports on the same terms as British ships.

France stands partially stationary. In 1849 she exported 600,000 tons of shipping; in 1862 only 980,000 tons.
