## Forest Fires!

The Attention of the Public is called to the following provisions of the FOREST FIRE ACT:
1.-Any person who sets out, makes or starts a FIRE for any purpose whatever, between the Fifteenth woods, or without selecting a place free from dry trees underbrush or other inflammable material in which to make or start such FIRE, or fails to remove all such dry wood, brushwood or inflammable material within a distance of ten feet from such fire in every direction, or fails to completely extinguish the same before leav-
2.-Throws or Drops any Burning Match, Ashes of a Pipe, Lighted Cigar or any other burning substance. 3.- Or fails to totally extinguish any camp fire beless than $\$ 50$ nor more than $\$ 400$, or imprisonment for a period of twelve months.
