The most deplorable, insidious and dangerous fallacy is the argument that the elections have been a contest of races. Such was not the case. Sir Wilfrid Laurier never went to the country posing as a Frenchman. His most ardent admirer never held him up to the crowds who eagerly thronged to hear him as a worthy son of another race.

There was a deeper purpose in turning the contest into one of races than merely the wish to get into power. There was the idea that if a victory were once gained upon that basis, English ascendancy would be asserted for many a generation. A fallacy that appeals to passion, as this racial cry did, is not likely to succeed.

Doctor would have called upon Father Ryan, Rector of St. Michael's Cathedral, and made matters right about the calumny of which he was guilty just before vacation.

It was The News and its Tory contemporaries in Toronto that appealed to the racial question in Ontario.

The fact that hundreds of the members of the Labor organizations in Toronto looked upon the Candidates put up for election by the Council as merely puppets of the Liberal plan of campaign, argues ill for the political organization of labor in this city.

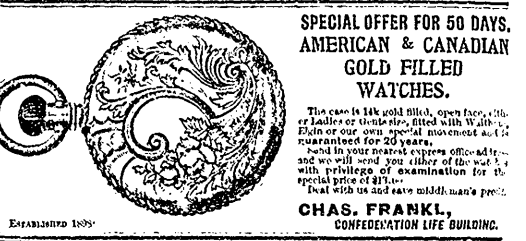
