The Society shall be called the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

No alteration shall be made in the Constitution of this Society. por shall any Bye-Law, Rule, or Regulation of the Society be rerealed, annulled, or altered, except at a Meeting of the General Committee, by the vote of at least two-thirds of the members preent, nor until it shall have received the sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, which sanction must be given in writing, nd delivered to the Secretary within six months of the said Meeting.

No alteration or amendment in the Constitution, nor any repeal, uncellation, alteration, or amendment of any Bye-Law, Rule, or Regulation of the Society, shall be proposed or made at any Meeting, unless notice shall have been given in writing at the next previous Anniversary Meeting of such proposed repeal or cancelation, nor unless the terms of such proposed alteration or amendment shall have been stated in writing at such previous Meeting; from which, without the unanimous consent of the members present, to deviation, except of a mere formal nature, shall be permitted.

· IV.

No repeal, cancellation, alteration, or amendment shall be proused, except by a member qualified to vote at the Anniversary leeting, whose name shall be entered on the Minutes by the Ser dary, together with the said proposition.

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, hall constitute a Life Momber; and the payment annually of any am, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same, Member of the Society. Provided that no member shall be give them that treespan coalified to vote at any General Meeting of the Society, unless of ver us from evil; for the full age of twenty-one years, nor unless he be a Life Member, and ever.—AMEN. or shall have subscribed and paid at least five shillings during the ear preceding such Meeting.

Officers.

1. The Officers of the Society shall be a President, two or more ice Presidents, a Treasurer, one or more Secretaries, and two uditors of Accounts.

2. The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the President of the Society, and the Archdescon the Senior Vice President; and any Life Member may, at any Anniversary Meeting, be elected a Vice President of the Society.

3. The Treasurer, Secretary, or Secretaries, and the Auditon, shall be annually elected at the Meetings of the General Committee and in case of the death, resignation, or removal from the Province of any such Officer, the vacancy shall be filled up by the Executive Committee, at its next or any subsequent Meeting within the year; and the Lord Bishop shall, if he see fit, call a Special Meeting of the Executive Committee, for the purpose of filling any such vacancy.

VII.

(Executive Committee.)

1. There shall also be an Executive Committee, to be composed of the following Members, viz. :

The Officers of the Society as provided for in the next preceding Article.

All Clergymen resident in the Diocese, duly licensed by th Lord Bishop, and Subscribers to the Society.

And twenty-four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members, or Annual Subscribers of at least One Pound; to be annual elected at the Meetings of the General Committee, provided the no annual Subscriber shall be qualified to be elected, nuless haball, during the year preceding each Meeting, have paid his subscription of at least One Pound.

2. Five Members of the Executive Committee, three of what to be Laymen, shall form a quorum.

3. The Excentive Committee shall meet either at Frederictone Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January, on the day not following the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in Mark on the first Wednesday in June, and on Wednesday after the fin Tuesday in October.

VIII.

(Objects.)

The Society shall embrace the following objects, and not other, viz. :

1. Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled Clerg man, and aid to new and poor Missions.

2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships at King's Calege, Fredericton; and assistance, when necessary, to those when may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially sons Clergymen.

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.

7. The creation of a fund towards the sugmentation of the stipends of Clergymen who are poor; and towards the education of the children of such Clergymen; and towards the making a pronision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity.

8. The creation of a fund for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy.

9. Aid to the Endowment Fund in particular Parishes.

IX.

The Society will employ no Clergyman on Missionary services without the Bishop's license and appointment, and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholars to his Lordship's approbation.

It shall be competent to any member of the Society to limit his abscription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote.

XI.

(Local Committee.)

1. The Members of the Society in each Parish, or in each Mission, consisting of two or more Parishes, shall, at the discretion of the Missionary of such Mission, constitute a Local Committee; and so also the Members residing in any District of a Parish set of under the authority of the Lord Bishop, with the concurrence of the Rector and Church Corporation of such Parish (there being in such District a Church duly consecrated, and a resident Clergyman licensed thereto by the Lord Bishop), may, at the desire of such Clergyman, and with the approval of the Bishop and the Rector of the Parish, form a separate Local Committee; and in that case the District shall, for the purpose of the Society, be considered as a separate Parish.

2. Each Local Committee shall hold an Annual Meeting on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendation to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

3. Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two Lay Members of the Society to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

4. It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society,

XII.

1. The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Frederictos and Saint John alternately, on the first Thursday in July in each year.

2. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time by the President, or in his absence, by any two or more of the Vice Presidents, four weeks' notice being first given thereof by advertisement in one or more newspapers, published in Fredericton and Saint John respectively.

XIII.

(The General Committee.)

1. The General Committee of the Society shall be composed of the following Mombers, viz.: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese, who shall be the Chairman; but in the absence of the Lord Bishop, the Committee may elect a Chairman, the Secretary or Secretaries who shall also serve in that capacity at the M. etnig of the General Committee, the Treasurer and the Auditors, the Rector or Missionary of each Parish, or of a Mission comprising two or more Parishes, and the Clergyman of any separate District of a Parish (provided that in the absence or sickness of the Rector of any Parish, the duly licensed Curate or Assistant Minister shall be coasidered pro hac vice a Member of the General Committee), and the Lay Deputies elected by the Local Committees as before provided; all such persons being Subscribers to the Society.

Proof of the election of such Deputies by each Local Committee, to be the Certificate of the Chairman or Secretary thereof.

2. The General Committee shall meet on the two days next previous to the Anniversary Meeting, to make the Annual appropriation of the funds of the Society; and a report of the proceedings of such Meeting shall be made at the Anniversary Meeting.

3. The Order of Business in General Committee shall be as follows:

Firstly-Production of Certificate of Lay Deputies.

Secondly-Secretary's Report to be read, and also a Report of the proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year.

Thirdly-Report of the Auditors to be read and laid before the General Committee,

Fourthly-Such appropriations or disposition of the funds to the objects of the Society as a majority of those present may determine

REPORT.

Never since the Church was first planted in this Proince, has any crisis occurred like that which marks its estion at the present time. The step, so long spoken of a the part of the venerable Society for the Propagation f the Gospel, has been taken. With a large reduction pon its annual grant, it has left this Society to deal with the gross amount, without the least hope of further assisnce—with a certain prospect of increased reduction. However hard the case may be felt on the part of the der missionaries, with reference to their relation to the merable Society, the Church must acknowledge that the resent annual grant of £2,860 sterling, to this Diocese, is most generous gift.

The Diocesan Church Society, however, has been obliged assume a heavy responsibility in accepting the terms reed upon. The General Committee last year required appropriation of a large sum beyond its former annual. penditure, in order to maintain the present Missions in Diocese. The support of other objects of the Society s abandoned. The already very limited stipends of the issionaries could not be reduced. Without increased ads, the onward progress of the Society must be stopped. With all these increased claims for the sympathy and pport of its members, it cannot but be deplored that there ould have been an actual diminution in the income of Society during the year 1865. The increase of the tributions from some of the smaller parishes was outne by the falling off in other quarters.

When all the circumstances of the case are fully known dunderstood by the members of the Church, it surely y reasonably be hoped that the dangers which threaten missions may be avoided. This can only be done by ited offerings from each for the service of Almighty d, and by that united action in this blessed work, which gospel so plainly enjoins upon all who name the name Christ.

There has be less sickness and death than during the last year, yet many familiar faces have passed away from among us, and I have performed the last rites of the churc over twelve of my flock:

"The number of communicants is increasing, and the services are well a tended. The Sunday-school is prosperous; and both teachers and childre take a lively interest in the work. There are sixty-four scholars in the school under the care and tuition of seven teachers.

"During the past eleven months I have had three services every Sunday, one at the County Alms House every Tuesday.

"The people in this parish are, for the most part, struggling hard to get a ng by their farms. I believe they value the services of the church very ply, and I have much satisfaction in all my intercourse with them. One distragement, however, we have had for years past, is so many of our young men leaving the homes of their youth in search of more remunerative emplo ment elsewhere.

"I cannot but think that in course of time, the discouraging days of some will be rewarded by joyous days of harvest. The Church Society will be the amply repaid for continuing its generosity through so many years of compartively unrequited labor."

Contributions amount to \$81.48.

SHEDIAC.—Rev. G. S. Jarvis, D. D., reports contributions, including the from Dundas and Wellington, amounting to \$62.05, an excess of \$5.03 on those of any preceding year.

SPRINGPIELD AND JOHNSTON.—Rev. G. Rogers reports that be has paid to to the credit of the Treasurer, in the Bank of New Brunswick, as part of a contributions from this mission.

"I made the change, believing myself to be in the path of duty, but with mt regrot, especially as there was no one to take my place. I trust I was e means of doing some good, and that I found some place in the hearts of Iny people, and a very near place in the hearts of some.

"The baptisms for the eleven months, from June 1st, 1865, to May 1st, 1866, eretwenty-eight; the number of marriages, five; the Sunday services, ninety; tweek-day services, thirty; the number of miles travelled on duty, 2,200 or

"The subscriptions for the Diocesan Church Society were taken up in the ring previously to my leaving, when the roads were very bad and money are: this will account for the smallness of the amount.

"As long as Weldford is without a resident clergyman, it is the Blshop's sire that I should visit it as often as possible, to hold services, and to adinister the sacraments. This I shall endeavor to do at least every three waths. "I enclose subscription list, and a P. O. Order to the amount of \$27."

WESTFIELD.-Rev. E. S. Woodman is glad to report that the amount of conributions is considerably in excess of those of last year. They are from felsford, \$12; Westfield, \$88; in all \$108.04.

WESTMORLAND.-Rev. D. M. Bliss writes that he cannot yet state the exact mount of the contributions, which will not, he hopes, be less than last year.

Woonsrock .-- Rev. S. D. Lee Street has enclosed the following resolutions used at the annual meeting of this Local Committee:-

1. That whereas this Committee learn with regret that the Society for the hopagation of the Gospel has already reduced the usual grants towards the upport of the Church in this Diocese by the sum of \$1,200, and that this is e commencement of a triennial reduction until the whole amount is withrawn :

Therefore Resolved-That the time has now come, of which we have been equently warned, that the members of the Church in this Province must be p and doing; and if they really have any desire to see our beloved Zion, not uy maintaining her present position, but also extending her limits, they must muse themselves to more zealous and united exertion in her behalf.

2. That in the opinion of this Committee, there is but one course for the mbers of the Church to pursue to meet this diffculty, and that is for each dividual member not only to increase his own contribution to the funds of the Diocesen Church Society, but also to use his influence in inducing other to do the same, for it is through the instrumentality of this Society that we ca alone hope, with the blessing of God, to see the church maintained and es tended.

3. That while this Committee cannot but regard the welfare of the Diocess Church Society of paramount importance, they learn, with deep regret, that a the present critical period in the existence of the Church among us, the dain of any other societies should be introduced, which must have a tendency a withdraw a large amount of aupport from the Diocesan Church Society.

This Committee feel convinced that if the members of the Church through ont the Diocese, were more firmly united in a heartfelt determination to mis the Society to its proper standard, there would be no further reason to fee the result of the withdrawal of the aid of the Society for the Propagatione the Gospel; for this Committee firmly believe there is wealth enough amon Churchmen in this Diocese, if properly and judiclously combined, to place in Church hove the need of foreign aid.

Church above the need of foreign aid. 4. Whereas the members of the Church in the Parish of Richmond are nostriving to raise the amount required by the Bishop, in order to obtain the sevices of a resident Missionary; — *Therefore Resolved*—That this Commits are fully aware of the necessity of the case, which cannot be adequately supplied by the Rector and Carate of Woodstock, with the many other demand upon their time and attention, this Committee again press this matter upon the notice of the Society, satisfied that there are few country parishes in the Dioces where a resident dergyman is more needed than at Richmond.

Contributions are largely in excess of last year; they amount to \$335.94.

This abstract will show, in some degree, what is bein done through the missions of the Society, and afford som insight as to their present and future prospects

It may well be a matter of deep thankfulness to on Heavenly Father, that in many places there has been large increase in the contributions, and that the whole amount will exceed that of last year by over \$1,000.

To abandon any one of the smallest and most remot of our missions, would be a grievous wrong. It is surely bad enough to turn a deaf ear to the cry for help from those increasing settlements and parishes which are wholl devoid of the means of grace.

If it be possible for the members of the Church to a together in a work like this, it seems hard to devise a bet ter scheme than that embraced by this Society. Only la it receive adequate support, and with the aid supplied into the mother country, we shall, by the Divine blessing, hav sufficient means to maintain our present missions, and yea by year to add new ones to our list.

A solemn warning is given at each anniversary to "wor while it is day." The past year will long be remembered by this Society, by the removal of one, whose loss the whole country has good reason to regret. A REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, FOR THE PAST YEAR.

The Minutes of the Meeting of the Committee held at Fredoricton on the 7th July, 1865, were published in the 30th Report (see page 37).

The next meeting of this Committee was held at St. John on the 4th October.

An account of the Treasurer, made up to the 1st inst., was read, showing a cash balance of \$2,678.77.

The Rev. Canon Coster, from the Loan and Finance Committee, presented the following report, which was ordered to be received and entered upon the Minutes.

The Loan Committee beg leave to report, that upon the death of the late William Wright, Esq., they called upon his Excentors, who furnished them with the securities placed in his hands, which correspond with those mentioned in the Treasurer's Report.

It appears from the book of accounts kept by the late Mr. Wright, that all monles received by him were paid to the Treasurer, or to the Bank of New Brunswick, on his account, except the interest upon Water Debentures received on the 8th May, just previously to his death, which amounts to \$102. For this sum they will claim upon his estate.

This sum they will claim upon his estate. The Committee believe that the securities in their hands are quite safe; but they propose to collect some of the mortgages, and place the amount in investments, where the interest can be more readily collected.


