CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

I.

The Society shall be called the **DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.**

II.

No alteration shall be made in the Constitution of this Society, nor shall any Bye-Law, Rule, or Regulation of the Society be repealed, annulled, or altered, except at a Meeting of the General Committee, by the vote of at least two-thirds of the members present, nor until it shall have received the sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, which sanction must be given in writing, and delivered to the Secretary within six months of the said Meeting.

III.

No alteration or amendment in the Constitution, nor any repeal, cancellation, alteration, or amendment of any Bye-Law, Rule, or Regulation of the Society, shall be proposed or made at any Meeting, unless notice shall have been given in writing at the next previous Anniversary Meeting of such proposed repeal or cancellation, nor unless the terms of such proposed alteration or amendment shall have been stated in writing at such previous Meeting; from which, without the unanimous consent of the members present, no deviation, except of a mere formal nature, shall be permitted.

IV.

No repeal, cancellation, alteration, or amendment shall be proposed, except by a member qualified to vote at the Anniversary Meeting, whose name shall be entered on the Minutes by the Secretary, together with the said proposition.

V.

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same, a Member of the Society. Provided that no member shall be qualified to vote at any General Meeting of the Society, unless of the full age of twenty-one years, nor unless he be a Life Member, or shall have subscribed and paid at least five shillings during the year preceding such Meeting.

VI.

Officers.

1. The Officers of the Society shall be a President, two or more Vice Presidents, a Treasurer, one or more Secretaries, and two Auditors of Accounts.

VI

2. The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the President of the Society, and the Archdeacon the Senior Vice President; and any Life Member may, at any Anniversary Meeting, be elected a Vice President of the Society.

3. The Treasurer, Secretary, or Secretaries, and the Auditors, shall be annually elected at the Meetings of the General Committee; and in case of the death, resignation, or removal from the Province of any such Officer, the vacancy shall be filled up by the Executive Committee, at its next or any subsequent Meeting within the year; and the Lord Bishop shall, if he see fit, call a Special Meeting of the Executive Committee, for the purpose of filling any such vacancy.

VII.

(Executive Committee.)

1. There shall also be an Executive Committee, to be composed of the following Members, viz.:

The Officers of the Society as provided for in the next preceding Article.

All Clergymen resident in the Diocese, duly licensed by the Lord Bishop, and Subscribers to the Society.

And twenty-four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members, or Annual Subscribers of at least One Pound; to be annually elected at the Meetings of the General Committee, provided that no annual Subscriber shall be qualified to be elected, unless he shall, during the year preceding each Meeting, have paid his subscription of at least One Pound.

2. Five Members of the Executive Committee, three of whom to be Laymen, shall form a quorum.

3. The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January, on the day next following the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

VIII.

(Objects.)

The Society shall embrace the following objects, and no other, viz.:

1. Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled Clergyman, and aid to new and poor Missions.

2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships at King's College, Fredericton; and assistance, when necessary, to those who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially sons of Clergymen.

3. Aid to Sunday and other Schools in which Church principles are taught, and the training and encouraging of Schoolmasters and Catechists.

4. The supply of such Books and Tracts as are on the Catalogue of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and none other.
5. Aid to the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels.
6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.
7. The creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of Clergymen who are poor; and towards the education of the children of such Clergymen; and towards the making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity.
8. The creation of a fund for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy.
9. Aid to the Endowment Fund in particular Parishes.

IX.

The Society will employ no Clergyman on Missionary services without the Bishop's license and appointment, and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholars to his Lordship's approbation.

X.

It shall be competent to any member of the Society to limit his subscription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote.

XI.

(Local Committee.)

1. The Members of the Society in each Parish, or in each Mission, consisting of two or more Parishes, shall, at the discretion of the Missionary of such Mission, constitute a Local Committee; and so also the Members residing in any District of a Parish set off under the authority of the Lord Bishop, with the concurrence of the Rector and Church Corporation of such Parish (there being in such District a Church duly consecrated, and a resident Clergyman licensed thereto by the Lord Bishop), may, at the desire of such Clergyman, and with the approval of the Bishop and the Rector of the Parish, form a separate Local Committee; and in that case the District shall, for the purpose of the Society, be considered as a separate Parish.

2. Each Local Committee shall hold an Annual Meeting on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendation to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

3. Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two Lay Members of the Society to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

4. It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society,

XII.

1. The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately, on the first Thursday in July in each year.

2. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time by the President, or in his absence, by any two or more of the Vice Presidents, four weeks' notice being first given thereof by advertisement in one or more newspapers, published in Fredericton and Saint John respectively.

XIII.

(The General Committee.)

1. The General Committee of the Society shall be composed of the following Members, viz.: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese, who shall be the Chairman; but in the absence of the Lord Bishop, the Committee may elect a Chairman, the Secretary or Secretaries who shall also serve in that capacity at the Meeting of the General Committee, the Treasurer and the Auditors, the Rector or Missionary of each Parish, or of a Mission comprising two or more Parishes, and the Clergyman of any separate District of a Parish (provided that in the absence or sickness of the Rector of any Parish, the duly licensed Curate or Assistant Minister shall be considered *pro hac vice* a Member of the General Committee), and the Lay Deputies elected by the Local Committees as before provided; all such persons being Subscribers to the Society.

Proof of the election of such Deputies by each Local Committee, to be the Certificate of the Chairman or Secretary thereof.

2. The General Committee shall meet on the two days next previous to the Anniversary Meeting, to make the Annual appropriation of the funds of the Society; and a report of the proceedings of such Meeting shall be made at the Anniversary Meeting.

3. The Order of Business in General Committee shall be as follows:

Firstly—Production of Certificate of Lay Deputies.

Secondly—Secretary's Report to be read, and also a Report of the proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year.

Thirdly—Report of the Auditors to be read and laid before the General Committee.

Fourthly—Such appropriations or disposition of the funds to the objects of the Society as a majority of those present may determine.

XIV.

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a collection on each occasion for the General Purposes of the Society.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

That the title of all Churches, towards the erection or completion of which any grant is made from the funds of this Society, be vested either in the Church Corporation of the Parish in which such Church is situated, or in some party or parties in trust to convey the site, as soon as practicable, of such Church to the Church Corporation as soon as the same may be legally constituted. (14th Report, page 24.)

That no grants from this Committee, subject to conditions, be paid until an order is issued from the Executive Committee, who will previously ascertain that the conditions of the grants have been fulfilled. (17th Report, page 21.)

That in future no application for grants shall be considered which is not made on the first day of the meeting of the General Committee, or previously. (18th Report, page 24.)

That each Missionary receiving a salary from this Society, be requested to make an annual return to the Secretary, to be handed in by him at the first meeting of the General Committee, as follows, viz.:

The number of Churches under his charge.

The number of weekly or other stated services held in such Churches or stations.

The number of Communicants.

The average number of attendants.

The amount contributed in each Parish towards the support of such Missionary. (19th Report, page 24.)

That when a Missionary is absent from his Mission on account of ill health, with leave from the Lord Bishop, his Lordship be authorized, in his discretion, to pay to him the whole, or any part of the sum granted for such Mission. (20th Report, page 33.)

That if any alterations shall be found necessary in the Schedule of Missionary Salaries, granted by this Committee, by reason of the death, absence, or removal of any Missionary named therein, the same shall be made by the Lord Bishop, with the concurrence of the Executive Committee.

That all grants by this Committee for Missionary salaries, and all sums placed at the disposal of the Lord Bishop, shall be for the service of the fiscal year in which the grants are made, and shall expire with it. (25th Report, page 30.)

That all vouchers for the payment of any sums of money whatever, must be on the face of them, the authority under which they are paid, and the period for which they are claimed, together with the services performed.

That the Treasurer be directed not to pay any monies after the first day of July in each year, until authorized to do so by the General Committee at their meeting in July.

That the following be the form of draft for a Missionary's salary, to come into effect on the first October, 1861, and that no draft be paid by the Treas-

surer, unless presented in person, or endorsed by the person to whom it is made payable, the Treasurer to take a receipt from the party to whom the payment is made on the same.

That for the future, the Clergy and other collectors of the funds of the Diocesan Church Society, be required in their lists of subscribers handed to the Secretary for publication in the Report, to insert in such lists the names of such persons only as have paid the amounts subscribed.

Whereas, The grants made by the Diocesan Church Society from its annual income (exclusive of the grants received from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel), are made in aid of local contributions for the support of several Missions :

Therefore Resolved—That in future grants from this Committee will be made mainly with reference to the ability of the members of the Church in several Parishes to support their own Clergymen,—the amount of local contributions for Church objects in such parishes, and the sums paid in aid of general objects of this Society. (31st Report.)

That all bequests made to the Society be funded as heretofore, and the interest only applied to the general or special purposes for which they are bequeathed. (31st Report.)

The following are the conditions on which grants are made to Churches and Parsonage Houses, viz. :—

To the Rev. A. B. to assist in building a Church at C. D., the sum of £—, to be paid on a certificate that the land on which the Church is built is held in fee simple by or for the use of the Church, and the external walls completed.

In the case of a second grant, for "the external walls completed" must be substituted "the building finished both externally and internally."

In the case of a grant to pay a debt on a Church, for the same words must be substituted "the Church made thereby free from debt."

REPORT.

Never since the Church was first planted in this Province, has any crisis occurred like that which marks its position at the present time. The step, so long spoken of on the part of the venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, has been taken. With a large reduction upon its annual grant, it has left this Society to deal with the gross amount, without the least hope of further assistance—with a certain prospect of increased reduction. However hard the case may be felt on the part of the older missionaries, with reference to their relation to the venerable Society, the Church must acknowledge that the present annual grant of £2,860 sterling, to this Diocese, is the most generous gift.

The Diocesan Church Society, however, has been obliged to assume a heavy responsibility in accepting the terms agreed upon. The General Committee last year required an appropriation of a large sum beyond its former annual expenditure, in order to maintain the present Missions in the Diocese. The support of other objects of the Society has been abandoned. The already very limited stipends of the missionaries could not be reduced. Without increased funds, the onward progress of the Society must be stopped. With all these increased claims for the sympathy and support of its members, it cannot but be deplored that there should have been an *actual diminution* in the income of the Society during the year 1865. The increase of the contributions from some of the smaller parishes was outbalanced by the falling off in other quarters.

When all the circumstances of the case are fully known and understood by the members of the Church, it surely may reasonably be hoped that the dangers which threaten our missions may be avoided. This can only be done by united offerings from each for the service of Almighty God, and by that united action in this blessed work, which the gospel so plainly enjoins upon all who name the name of Christ.

The following is an abstract of the reports of Missionaries, and of the various Local Committees:—

PROVINCIAL.—Rev. W. Henry Street reports contributions to the amount of £175. Mr. Street is happy to report this increase. "I trust," he writes,

"that churchmen are beginning to understand their duty to the Church in her time of trial, and will save the Society from the sad necessity of abandoning any of its present fields of labor.

"When I state that my Mission embraces nearly the whole County of Victoria, and a portion of Carleton, some idea may be formed of the arduous duty of the Missionary. God grant that the time may not be far distant when more laborers can be employed: until then much must be left undone, and the progress of the Missionary's work be scarcely visible. The services during the year have been well attended, and the congregations attentive.

"A melodeon has been, by the kind assistance of two parishioners, procured for one of the churches. At Greenfield an effort is being made to erect a church.

"During the summer we shall be busy preparing for confirmation, to be held in October next, when it is hoped the church at Grand Falls may be ready for consecration."

BATHURST, &c.—Rev. W. LeB. McKiel writes as follows:—"There is little report beyond the accustomed round of duty. The regular services at the two churches and the various stations, have been punctually attended to, except when the state of the roads or the weather made it impossible. There has been less sickness and death than during the last year, yet many familiar faces have passed away from among us, and I have performed the last rites of the church over twelve of my flock.

"The number of communicants is increasing, and the services are well attended. The Sunday-school is prosperous; and both teachers and children take a lively interest in the work. There are sixty-four scholars in the school under the care and tuition of seven teachers.

"St. George's Church, Bathurst, will be undergoing repairs and alterations during the summer. The congregation at New Brandon have put up a new fence around the church. The parsonage has been finished. I moved into it in February last." Contributions, which exceed those of last year, amount to \$42.05.

CAMBRIDGE, &c.—Rev. B. Shaw writes as follows:—"In submitting my annual report, the predominant feelings in my mind, are gratitude and humility—gratitude for past mercies, and hopeful signs of growth in the mission; and humility in looking back and finding so many things left undone, which ought to have been done.

"I have reason to hope, from the increasing numbers of the congregation, that the church is steadily making its way among the people; and, I trust that making use of its ordinances, myself and people may become more closely united with the great Head of the Church.

"Last summer the church at Young's Cove was thoroughly painted, and this year we shall add a belfry. We have paid nearly \$300 towards the new church at Cambridge, and we hope to make it ready for service before the winter.

"The church at Newcastle will receive repairs this summer, to the amount of \$80. Owing to the severe weather last winter, with an unusual delay between ice and water this spring, I was prevented from fulfilling some appointments at the stations on the western side of the Lake. I shall endeavour to make up for this before the end of the year." The contributions amount to \$37.

CAMPOBELLO.—Rev. J. S. Williams has enclosed the following resolution passed at a meeting of the local Committee:—

I. That in view of the withdrawal by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, of a part of its grants to this Diocese, this Committee desires to press its sense of the importance of rendering a strenuous support to our Society, so that at least the deficiency caused by the above-mentioned withdrawal may be made up.

Contributions amount to \$100.

CEATHAM.—Rev. S. Bacon reports that at the annual meeting of this Committee, the following resolutions were passed:—

1. That this Committee continue to regard the Diocesan Church Society with the same lively interest they have ever done; that they consider it impossible to over-rate the inestimable benefits and blessings likely to result from such a like institution, especially as a General Endowment Fund, now the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel are withdrawing their aid.

2. That this Committee will not relax their efforts to obtain contributions toward the augmentation of the funds of the Diocesan Church Society, whilst they entertain serious apprehensions that the continued unprecedented pressure of the times, the additional claims upon the liberality of the people in having to support a Curate; and moreover, the recent attempt to form a Local Endowment Fund, will inevitably diminish their accustomed contributions.

They amount to \$126.33.

DESBY, BLACKVILLE, &c.—Rev. W. Cruden reports contributions to the amount of \$31.04. An additional sum is expected.

"Our contributions," Mr. Cruden writes, "are, as you will perceive, more than double those of last year, though not so large as I could wish."

DOUGLAS.—Rev. T. E. Dowling has forwarded the following report:—

"In addition to the usual fortnightly service at St. John's Church, Nash Mills, the Bishop licensed Mr. Hanington to act as Lay Reader. For two months the congregation enjoyed one service on every Sunday.

"I am more and more convinced that if the Church of England wishes to hold her own in Douglas, your Missionary must have the assistance of a candidate for Holy Orders, or a lay reader. We dare not hope for a Curate. A few weeks will show the reasonableness of these statements. First, there is always a regular congregation, including 16 communicants, at Tay Creek. For forty days in the year this church is closed. The settlement is twenty-five miles from the Parsonage. Secondly, through the goodness of God, the congregation at Upper Keswick have been stirred up to re-build their Church. At present they have only twelve Sunday services during the year. They ask for, and I hope to give them, more. Only a few years since the bulk of the population in Keswick Valley, were members of our Communion; there are now, however, three new anabaptist meeting-houses, and a fourth is being built within gun-shot of our proposed church. The population increases on all sides; and I believe it is not even now too late to reclaim many a wandering sheep if the Spirit of God would but stir up some earnest man to face rough work. I ask the Society, if successful in procuring lay assistance, to consider the urgency of the matter, and encourage me with a grant, if only of \$40.

"His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has contributed to the Douglas Society of England Endowment Fund. The sum of \$70 has been deposited in the Savings' Bank, and the parishioners have already promised to assist the Society with grants of land. Although this endowment is small, it is by no means discouraging. Those who have not been in the habit of supporting their own clergy, are not likely to be anxious to provide for a future ministry. This year, however, please God, after the question of a local endowment has been more ventilated, I trust that progress in this respect will be reported.

"One feature of interest deserves to be recorded. When the Diocesan Church Society withdrew the annual grant of books, it was necessary that a new supply should be obtained in some other way. A Church book depository has been established; the profits from the sales are devoted to paying off our arrearages; and a readiness is being shewn to purchase, where, hitherto, unfortunately, all publications were given away.

"Although the Offertory Collections in the four congregations are only made in advance of those for last year, it ought to be mentioned that many of our members have more conveniently supplied the clergyman with provisions of all kinds, and have contributed more liberally than in former years."

The contributions, to which a further sum, will probably be added, amount

DUNDAS AND WELLINGTON.—Rev. A. H. Weeks has enclosed a subscription list, amounting to \$20.15.

Mr. Weeks writes that during the summer of 1865, he was prevented by illness of some weeks' duration, from attending to more than the usual pressing calls of duty. He is thankful to report that the new church at Buctouche is so far advanced, that it can be used for divine service, and that the attendance is both regular and increasing.

FREDERICTON.—Rev. C. Lee has enclosed the following report from the local Committee:—"They feel thankful to the 'Giver of all good gifts' that they are enabled to report an increased amount of offerings for the present year. The increase arises from larger offerings at the Cathedral and parish church, full subscriptions from former members, and the addition of many new subscribers. Some ladies of the parish were authorized by the Rector (under the Bishop's suggestion in his last pastoral), to aid in collecting the annual subscriptions and were very successful in the work.

"At the meeting of the Committee, it was unanimously resolved, that while parochial objects are promoted, or subscriptions given to any religious society that may commend themselves to our judgments, we yet feel it to be the duty to all members of the church in this diocese, to combine with one heart and soul in large gifts to God through our Diocesan Church Society."

Contributions amount to \$1,242.06.

GAGGETOWN.—Rev. J. Neales reports contributions to the amount of \$62.

GLENELG, NEWCASTLE, &c.—The Missionary (Rev. James Hudson), reports to the Society, that at a meeting held at Bay-du-Vin on the 28th May, resolutions of support and good feeling were unanimously passed.

He also states that in August last, through the kindness of a young Englishman, a Barrister in London, our fellow-churchmen in the Bay-du-Vin Settlement received a service of altar plate, of silver, partially gilt, and of admirable workmanship. To the many persons assembled in the church on the day of its presentation, it was a most welcome and unexpected gift; and the minister was requested to convey the people's grateful thanks to their unknown friend and benefactor, for "the good deed done for the house of their God, and the offices thereof."

Mr. Hudson continues to minister, as regularly as possible, to his little flock in different parts of the county, to reach one of which he is still obliged to travel sixty-five miles; a journey, however, that would be undertaken more frequently than it is, if health and strength permitted him to do so; there being many communicants in that congregation, while most of the other worshipers seem to appreciate the sweet, soothing, and earnest petitions of our beautiful "Book of Common Prayer."

The Missionary closes his remarks with the pleasant statement that the strict contributions sent from the 3d July, 1865, to the present date, July 1866, exceed those of the preceding twelve months by *one-fourth*; a statement made in the spirit of boasting—far otherwise. To God be the praise for bringing the hearts of His people to help the Church Society in bringing sinners to the saving knowledge of Christ our Lord.

The offerings referred to are as follows, viz.:—Glenelg, £9 19s. 10d.; Newcastle, £10 12s. 1d.; Ludlow, £1 13s. 7d.; Northesk, 9s. 7d.; total, £22 15s.

GRAND MANAN.—Rev. G. T. Carey reports \$20 as the amount of contributions from this parish. The failure in the herring fishery during the past year, Mr. Carey writes, caused a general depression in business on the Island.

GREENWICH, WICKHAM, &c.—Rev. D. W. Pickett writes that he has not of special interest to report with regard to the work in this mission, which has been regularly going on during the past year. He is able to report a large increase in the contributions to the Society. The circular of the Bishop has been well responded to. Many have doubled their subscriptions, while

Mr. Pickett adds, "I rejoice that God has put it in the hearts of His people to do more for our beloved Church in this her time of need. I trust they will not grow weary in well doing, but that every year may find them more willing and better able."
Contributions are \$102.

HAMPTON.—Rev. W. Walker reports contributions to the amount of \$120, to which he thinks will yet be added \$20 more.

KINGSLEAR.—Rev. J. Black reports contributions to the amount of \$59.80.

KINGSTON.—Rev. W. E. Scovil reports \$128 for the general purposes of the Society.

KINGSTON AND HAMPTON.—Rev. D. I. Wetmore has forwarded a report, which will be found referred to in the usual abstract. "I have held," Mr. Wetmore adds, "fifty-six full services, chiefly at Clifton, and assisted in sixty, part in Kington, and part at Gondola Point and Rothsay."

LANCASTER.—Rev. W. S. Covert hopes to send a larger amount of contributions than those of last year. There were nine persons confirmed in this parish, by the Bishop, on the 15th May.

MAUGERVILLE AND BURTON.—Rev. H. Pollard, before his departure for England, reported the payment to the Treasurer of \$7.24 from this mission, being the amount of collections in church.

Rev. E. H. W. Hanington, at present in charge of this mission, writes that the contributions will be about \$109. Mr. Hanington has had only a limited time to make the collections, and rejoices that as well in this parish as elsewhere in the Province, they are more liberally given than in former years.

MONCTON, &c.—Rev. W. N. Boyer has enclosed the usual returns from this mission; and he writes that list of subscriptions will shortly be completed.

Mr. Boyer adds:—"The Colonial and Continental Church Society are annually withdrawing their grant to this mission. They have already taken £60 of my income. It is a poor mission. There are but two or three families able to contribute to the stipend of a clergyman, and they do this cheerfully; and indeed the members of the church do what they can."

Contributions reported by Mr. E. B. Chandler, amount to \$80.

NEW MARYLAND.—Rev. John Pearson writes that he has remitted to the Treasurer the sum of \$25.02. He regrets that the amount is not larger.

NORTON.—Rev. E. A. Warnford reports contributions to the amount of \$102.80.

PORTLAND.—Rev. J. W. Disbrow, in charge of this parish during the absence of Rev. Canon Harrison, reports contributions to the amount of \$133.41. "I am pleased," Mr. Disbrow writes, "to report that there is no diminution in the amount contributed last year, though it falls far short of what it ought to be. Some kind ladies assisted to obtain the subscriptions, to whom I beg to return sincere thanks."

PRINCE WILLIAM.—Mr. T. Jones reports contributions to the amount of \$68; which, in the vacancy of the mission, has been kindly attended to by the Church Warden.

QUEENSBURY.—Rev. W. H. Tippet reports that the contributions from this mission will exhibit a considerable increase. This is much due to the Bishop's regular. The amount, though small, is in proportion to the circumstances of the people. "I meet," Mr. Tippet writes, "with no reluctance to subscribe, but only regret that they cannot give more. My public services have been somewhat less numerous than usual, owing to local causes; one of them has

been the vacancy in the adjoining mission of Prince William, which I served as well as I could, as long as the river remained closed.

"The duties of the mission have been regularly discharged during the year, with nothing to call for special notice; the sick and aged are regularly visited, and my Sunday-school keeps, in point of numbers, much as in former years.

"The resources of the parish cannot lead me to hope for any success in forming a Local Endowment Fund; and unless some aid reach me from without for this object, our prospects are gloomy enough."

Contributions amount to \$60.

RICHMOND.—Rev. N. A. Coster reports contributions to the amount of \$76.80, and has enclosed a Post Office Order to that amount, less 40 cents paid for the order. Mr. Coster writes that the task of collecting was kindly undertaken by the Misses Forster and Chandler, without whose exertions perhaps not half the amount would have been collected.

"Some have felt an inclination to withdraw their aid, because the Society has ceased to give its grant of books, which, when placed in the Sunday-school or lending libraries, found their way into almost every house, supplying a want which, in country parishes, cannot otherwise be met."

SACKVILLE AND DORCHESTER.—Rev. G. G. Roberts is happy to report an increase of over \$40 in the contributions this year. They are \$173.75.

ST. ANDREWS AND CHAMCOOK.—Mr. G. D. Street, Secretary of this Local Committee, reports \$190, as the contributions for the present year. The subscriptions have been collected by the kind attentions of two ladies. The erection of a new large church, which is at present a heavy charge upon the parish, has prevented any increase to the contributions this year.

The Rev. Ranald E. Smith continues his usual assistance in the parish and reports as follows regarding the mission at Chamcook:—

"The services have been kept up without intermission during the past year. The attendance, both at divine service and at the holy communion, is steadily on the increase. The Sunday-school which, through the kind attention of Mr. Grimmer, was kept up through the winter months, is doing good service, and gaining in numbers."

ST. GEORGE.—Rev. J. McIlvern has enclosed the following report from the Local Committee:—

"At the commencement of another year, we desire to express our thankfulness for past mercies, and renew our resolutions to persevere in the good cause. We are thankful to say that the appeal made in the Bishop's Pastoral which was read in both churches in this mission, has not been in vain. The result has been that we are enabled to place at the disposal of the General Committee the largest sum yet contributed in one year in this mission. This is one item in the list of contributions which we regard with much satisfaction, viz., the sum of \$61 from the officers and men of the volunteer companies of St. George. On the matter being suggested to Col. Wetmore, commanding, he generously and promptly brought it before his men, and they, with few exceptions, without distinction of class or creed, responded to this call.

"We desire also to record an expression of our best thanks to a benevolent young lady of the church, for her untiring zeal in the work of collecting for the Society, by whose sole exertions in the district of St. George, the fund has been largely increased.

"It only remains for us to offer up our prayers to the Author and Giver of all good, that it may please Him to bless and prosper the labors of this Society to sanctify and accept our offerings to this sacred cause, and that in all our works begun, and continued, we may ever seek His honor and glory, and the good and welfare of His holy Church."

St. JAMES.—Rev. W. Armstrong reports contributions to the amount of \$173. Mr. Armstrong expresses regret that the amount is not larger; and he says, "the falling off is owing to deaths and removals from the parish."

St. JOHN—TRINITY.—Mr. H. W. Frith reports the sum of \$501.16, as the contributions to the Society.

St. MARK.—Mr. C. H. Fairweather, Secretary of this Committee, reports the sum of \$400, as the amount of contributions.

St. PAUL.—Rev. W. H. DeVeber reports the sum of \$445.72, as contributions from this parish. This shows an increase of \$90, as compared with the returns of last year, which is the more commendable, as the parish has relinquished its claim to the grant of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, \$120, making an actual increase of \$210 to the funds of the Society. It should also be noticed that the members of the Church in this parish are at present engaged in raising funds for the immediate erection of a Church and Sunday-school house.

St. MARY'S, STANLEY, &c.—Rev. W. Jaffrey reports contributions to the amount of \$14. He also sends the following list of stations, with the number of church people residing within two miles of the same, and the average congregations in each, that the Society may observe the great difficulty in collecting a large number of persons in any one place.

There is also nearly 100 nominal church people scattered about in remote parts of the parish.

The Parish of Stanley is more compact. Larger numbers assemble together: but the parish lies twenty-five miles distant from the missionary's place of residence.

"Many," Mr. Jaffrey adds, "have been added to the church in this mission during the last twenty years." He knows of two only who have left their membership in the church for that of other communions.

St. STEPHEN.—Rev. E. S. Medley has forwarded contributions to the amount of \$76.

St. SIMONS.—Rev. G. Schofield has enclosed an interesting report, of which the following are extracts:—

"On the 16th of May I had the pleasure of presenting sixteen persons for confirmation at the church at Loch Lomond. The whole services, including the most appropriate address by the Bishop, were very solemn and impressive.

"During the past eleven months I have had three services every Sunday, and one at the County Alms House every Tuesday.

"The people in this parish are, for the most part, struggling hard to get a living by their farms. I believe they value the services of the church very highly, and I have much satisfaction in all my intercourse with them. One disadvantage, however, we have had for years past, is so many of our young

"I cannot but think that in course of time, the discouraging days of sorrow will be rewarded by joyous days of harvest. The Church Society will be handsomely repaid for continuing its generosity through so many years of comparatively unrequited labor."

Contributions amount to \$81.48.

SHEDIAC.—Rev. G. S. Jarvis, D. D., reports contributions, including those from Dundas and Wellington, amounting to \$62.05, an excess of \$5.03 over those of any preceding year.

SPRINGFIELD AND JOHNSTON.—Rev. G. Rogers reports that he has paid \$400 to the credit of the Treasurer, in the Bank of New Brunswick, as part of the contributions from this mission.

"My parochial work," Mr. Rogers writes, "has been equal to that of any previous year. I have made forty-nine visits to the sick and dying, besides one hundred and forty pastoral visits. I wish I could assure the Society that the mission had begun fully to recognize the claim the Church now has upon its members, and the relation in which we stand to the venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, which has so many years generously aided us. There is not a disinclination on the part of our members to contribute to the Diocesan Church Society, yet doubtless there is much apathy to be removed before that zeal can display itself, which our altered circumstances demand. To the best of my ability, both publicly and in private, I have, as required by the Bishop's Pastoral Letter, enforced the duty of increased liberality: this has not been altogether without some good results. There is a slight increase in the contributions, which I have good reason to believe, will be larger next year."

"The church at Johnston, for so many years sadly out of repair, has, through the exertions of the congregation, been entirely new roofed. Many things still required for the interior, for comfort as well as the decent performance of Divine worship. A communion-table, cloth, chairs and carpet for the chancel would be gratefully received. I wish to acknowledge the gift of a handsome table and chairs for the vestry, from Charles Raymond, Esq., of St. John."

"The church at the Irish Settlement still remains in an unfinished state. It is used during the summer for divine worship. This church is in the poorest part of my mission. For many years past efforts have been made to finish it but as yet only a little more than the exterior is completed. A beautiful communion-table has been presented by Mr. A. Lordly, of St. John. We greatly need a reading desk, lectern and pulpit."

STRATHOLM.—Rev. R. Simonds reports contributions amounting to \$110.61.

"This," Mr. Simonds writes, "is a large increase over the sum contributed last year. Mr. Edwin N. Sharp has, with exemplary liberality, quadrupled his previous very handsome contribution."

"It is cheering to meet with such instances of zeal and devotedness in the time of the Church's pressing need, and we can only hope and pray that a similar spirit may be manifested by the members of our Church in other parts of the Diocese, so that we may be removed from all painful doubts and hesitations respecting the self-sustaining power of our communion."

SUSSEX.—Mr. C. P. Bliss regrets that in forwarding his returns to the Diocesan Church Society, the amount has not come up to his expectations. Owing to continued ill-health, Mr. Bliss is obliged to give up the duty at Havelock. If a clergyman could be appointed with head-quarters at Peticodiac Station, he could take the duty at Havelock, his services would be greatly appreciated. Mr. Bliss writes that the state of his health prevents him from taking more than one service on the Sunday, and he trusts the Society will be able to do something to supply the urgent need of a clergyman at Havelock.

Mr. Bliss has since written to say that the contributions from this parish will not exceed \$60.

UTAH, &c.—Rev. S. J. Hanford reports that the contributions in this mission amount to \$123.64, being an increase compared with last year. The Bishop's Circular has been read in public, and "I have endeavored," Mr. Hanford writes, "to set before the people of my charge the claims of our Society. Most persons admit that it is their duty to give something, and I trust they will realize more and more distinctly their responsibilities in this matter, so as to enable the Society to meet the deficiency in the grants from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel."

Mr. Hanford again calls attention to the want of Church Prayer Books; and asks if nothing can be done towards maintaining a supply for those willing to purchase.

WELDFORD.—Rev. James P. Sheraton writes as follows:—

"Having been presented to the Rectory of St. Andrew's Church, Shediac, I resigned about the end of last April my charge at Weldford, which I had held for over three years, of which time I was a year and nine months Lay Reader, and a year in Deacon's Orders.

"I made the change, believing myself to be in the path of duty, but with great regret, especially as there was no one to take my place. I trust I was the means of doing some good, and that I found some place in the hearts of my people, and a very near place in the hearts of some.

"The baptisms for the eleven months, from June 1st, 1865, to May 1st, 1866, were twenty-eight; the number of marriages, five; the Sunday services, ninety; the week-day services, thirty; the number of miles travelled on duty, 2,200 or more.

"The subscriptions for the Diocesan Church Society were taken up in the spring previously to my leaving, when the roads were very bad and money scarce: this will account for the smallness of the amount.

"As long as Weldford is without a resident clergyman, it is the Bishop's desire that I should visit it as often as possible, to hold services, and to administer the sacraments. This I shall endeavor to do at least every three months.

"I enclose subscription list, and a P. O. Order to the amount of \$27."

WESTFIELD.—Rev. E. S. Woodman is glad to report that the amount of contributions is considerably in excess of last year. They are from Westford, \$12; Westfield, \$88; in all \$103.04.

WESTMORLAND.—Rev. D. M. Bliss writes that he cannot yet state the exact amount of the contributions, which will not, he hopes, be less than last year.

WOONSTOCK.—Rev. S. D. Lee Street has enclosed the following resolutions passed at the annual meeting of this Local Committee:—

1. That whereas this Committee learn with regret that the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel has already reduced the usual grants towards the support of the Church in this Diocese by the sum of \$1,200, and that this is the commencement of a triennial reduction until the whole amount is withdrawn;

Therefore Resolved—That the time has now come, of which we have been repeatedly warned, that the members of the Church in this Province must be up and doing; and if they really have any desire to see our beloved Zion, not only maintaining her present position, but also extending her limits, they must arouse themselves to more zealous and united exertion in her behalf.

2. That in the opinion of this Committee, there is but one course for the members of the Church to pursue to meet this difficulty, and that is for each individual member not only to increase his own contribution to the funds of

the Diocesan Church Society, but also to use his influence in inducing others to do the same, for it is through the instrumentality of this Society that we can alone hope, with the blessing of God, to see the church maintained and extended.

3. That while this Committee cannot but regard the welfare of the Diocesan Church Society of paramount importance, they learn, with deep regret, that at the present critical period in the existence of the Church among us, the claims of any other societies should be introduced, which must have a tendency to withdraw a large amount of support from the Diocesan Church Society.

This Committee feel convinced that if the members of the Church throughout the Diocese, were more firmly united in a heartfelt determination to raise the Society to its proper standard, there would be no further reason to fear the result of the withdrawal of the aid of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel; for this Committee firmly believe there is wealth enough among Churchmen in this Diocese, if properly and judiciously combined, to place the Church above the need of foreign aid.

4. Whereas the members of the Church in the Parish of Richmond are now striving to raise the amount required by the Bishop, in order to obtain the services of a resident Missionary;—*Therefore Resolved*—That this Committee are fully aware of the necessity of the case, which cannot be adequately supplied by the Rector and Curate of Woodstock, with the many other demands upon their time and attention, this Committee again press this matter upon the notice of the Society, satisfied that there are few country parishes in the Diocese where a resident clergyman is more needed than at Richmond.

Contributions are largely in excess of last year; they amount to \$335.94.

This abstract will show, in some degree, what is being done through the missions of the Society, and afford some insight as to their present and future prospects.

It may well be a matter of deep thankfulness to our Heavenly Father, that in many places there has been a large increase in the contributions, and that the whole amount will exceed that of last year by over \$1,000.

To abandon any one of the smallest and most remote of our missions, would be a grievous wrong. It is surely bad enough to turn a deaf ear to the cry for help from those increasing settlements and parishes which are wholly devoid of the means of grace.

If it be possible for the members of the Church to act together in a work like this, it seems hard to devise a better scheme than that embraced by this Society. Only let it receive adequate support, and with the aid supplied from the mother country, we shall, by the Divine blessing, have sufficient means to maintain our present missions, and year by year to add new ones to our list.

A solemn warning is given at each anniversary to "work while it is day." The past year will long be remembered by this Society, by the removal of one, whose loss the whole country has good reason to regret. This Society will miss the yearly offerings of the late Honorable Chief Justice Parker, but it will miss still more the weight of

his influence for good, and the kind and valuable assistance he was always ready to afford.

The Society will also readily place on record an expression of deep regret at the death of W. J. Bedell, Esq., who, from its first formation, filled the important office of Treasurer. Each year, for thirty anniversaries, Mr. Bedell was unanimously elected. He discharged the duties of his office with the strictest integrity, while his invariable kindness and courtesy will be long remembered by all who knew him.

The Society will feel it a matter for gratitude to Almighty God, that in this time of its great need, it pleased Him to put it into the hearts of one of its members to recognize its claims when about to be summoned to his great account. By a codicil to his will, the late Frederick W. Hatheway, Esq., has bequeathed the sum of \$2,000, payable within six months of his death, for the general purposes of this Society.

Since the above was written, information has been received of another valuable legacy in aid of the funds of this Society, viz., \$1,600, bequeathed by the late Miss Simonds, of the city of St. John.

- To the Widows of the late Revs. J. M. Stirling, T. W. Robertson, and T. McGhee, each, \$100.
- To the Rev. J. S. Williams, in aid of a church school at Campobello, \$40.
- To the Lord Bishop for Missionary purposes, \$40.

On motion of Major Robinson, the following resolution was passed :—

Whereas—The grants made by the Diocesan Church Society from its annual income (exclusive of the grants from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel), are made in aid of local contributions for the support of the several missions;

Therefore Resolved—That in future, grants from this Committee shall be made mainly with reference to the ability of the members of the Church in the several parishes to support their own clergymen, the amount of local contributions to church objects, and the sums paid in aid of the objects of this Society.

On motion of Rev. J. Pearson, it was—

Resolved—That a Committee be appointed to consider the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, with a view to placing it on a self-sustaining basis, and to confer with the Committee of the C. M. L. A. On motion of Rev. C. Lee—*Resolved*, That the Frederickton and St. John Book Depository Committees be authorized to distribute among the Clergy of the Diocese, in an equitable manner as possible, the balance of stock now on hand in the said Depositories.

"I have already set apart certain bonds of the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonality of the City of St. John, of over four hundred pounds, towards the Endowment Fund, to be raised for the support of the clergy of the Church of England in New Brunswick, subject to conditions, and if such conditions are not complied with, I still devote this part of my personal estate for the benefit of the said missions, as my Executors may deem best, and should they make no provision, I give the same bonds to the Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick for the object of missions in the poorer parishes, on such terms as the Society may direct."

FORMS OF REQUESTS AND DEVISES IN WILL.

I give and devise unto the "Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick," all and singular, &c. (Describe the Real Estate clearly.) To have and to hold the said, &c., unto the said Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick, and their successors, for ever: upon trust to hold and apply the same, and the rents, issues, and profits thereof, and the proceeds of the sale thereof, should the Society sell the same, to and for the uses and purposes of the said Diocesan Church Society, as specified in the Act of Incorporation, and none other.

The sum total of the contributions, as reported for the current year—made up from the Returns and Subscription Lists, is \$6,624.89; which exceeds a similar statement last year, by the sum of \$1,307.47.
