"We haven't progressed as fast here in France as we have in some other countries." he said, "but I believe we have now started on a new era, and that better times are ahead.

"We only bring religion to those who haven't it," he replied. "A man tells us he is a Catholic, We ask: 'Are you a good Catholic? Are you true to the principles of your faith?' So also with the Protestant.
