When we consider man's salvation, we find an ocean of Divine love. "He gave his only begotten Son, that all who believe in him might not perish, but have everlasting life." The Church is only a channel of Divine love. "The Son of man came not to destroy, but to save." His commission to his apostles was, "Go ye into all the world." Nothing can express the longing, ardent, burning heart of Christ as he sees a famishing, dying world. "Behold my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." His haustible provision for the salvation of the world spread, the fulness of his grace heard on every mouth, on every ear, in every heart. "Come, for all things are ready." "Behold, I stand at the door and knock."

But has the world heeded? Alas! the question is still unanswered. The world has rolled their course, and the sons of men remain in open rebellion against the law of God, in league with the devil. "How should not the soul of man be grieved?"

The debt on earth is now urgent. The time of reparation is now come. The precept and example of Christ call us to the work of salvation. The Canadian Conference of the Methodist Church is now in our sphere of operation. The cause of the Divine Being imperatively demands our attention.

## RE P O R T.

—:o:—

When we contemplate the boundless love of God, in the economy of man's salvation, we behold an unparalleled exhibition of grace and mercy. The ocean of Divine love stirred to its utmost depths, "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believeth on him should not perish but have everlasting life." The institution and establishment of the Christian Church is only the continuation and application of this glorious scheme of Divine love. The world is put into the hands of the church. The Masters commission to her is, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." His promise, "Lo I am with you always, even to the end of the world." Nothing less than the salvation of the whole world should satisfy the longing, ardent, burning love for souls, of the great heart of the church. She sees a famishing, starving, countless multitude; beholds also the rich and inexhaustible provision made for them in the gospel, the feast prepared, the table spread, the fulness infinite, and oh! can she rest till the voice of her heralds is heard on every mountain top, in every valley, in all the waste places of earth's wide domain, in trumpet tones, crying to the perishing millions of Adam's race, "Come, for all things are now ready;"

" Crowd to your places at the feast  
And bless the founders name."

But has the church accomplished her task and fulfilled her high destiny? Alas! the question seems a taunt and a mockery. Nearly nineteen centuries have rolled their course since she received her great commission, and yet millions of men remain in open and daring rebellion against their rightful sovereign,—slaves of sin, in league with hell, willing subjects of the prince of darkness. Then should not the solemn language of the poet move our very souls, and roll with earnest anxiety from our lips—

" Why then, Almighty Saviour, why  
Do wretched souls in millions die?  
While the infernal tyrant reigns  
O'er spacious realms in ponderous chains."

The debt on this department of our work is a subject demanding prompt and energetic action. When will our friends awake to the imperative duty and urgent necessity of giving to the support of God's cause in accordance with Scripture precept and example? The union of Prince Edward Island District with the Canadian Conference, we consider a very important move; not only enlarging our sphere of operations, but greatly increasing our responsibilities. May the Divine Being impart sufficient wisdom to conduct the whole to a successful issue.

The following statistical table shows that the society occupies 17 Stations in Canada West, 5 in Prince Edward Island, and 6 in the United States of America; on which are laboring 41 Missionaries, assisted by 132 Local Preachers, who preach in 85 chapels, and 121 other places; having under their care 3010 members, 56 Sabbath Schools, 472 Teachers, 2917 Scholars; which shows an increase, including Prince Edward Island District, of 4 stations, 13 Itinerant, and 21 Local Preachers, 28 chapels, 17 other places, 646 members, 78 Teachers, and 557 Scholars.

The following are the statements of the Pastors on the various Mission Stations, received through the Quarterly Meetings:

**PETERBORO.**—The past year has been one of pleasantness and peace, and we have had much to cheer us, in the marked increase of some of our congregations. We have been making increased effort, in union with other Christian Churches, in the temperance movement, and have realized considerable success in this very important moral reformation. The society in Peterboro have provided an instrument of music for the Chapel, built a new shed, and otherwise improved connexional property; we commend their zeal to the mission at large, and

hope their example will induce others to do the same. Amen.

**DUMMER.**—Through another year we have been meeting we commend our efforts to some dead souls. Among whom were the Rev. Mr. Plated Mission House, driving house, and a drain from the house is \$400, to the removal of which receipts are behind.

**HUNTINGDON.**—At the temporal point of view, things are better than social, have been improving; the Bible meetings did not flourish. Societies are lively, close communion, finances present a difficulty, friends would be glad to contribute to her coffers into other hands.

**HUNGERFORD.**—Services were held in the schoolroom about 40 persons, for preaching. Spiritual and financial drought of last summer was a cause of God at hand. It is necessary to

hope their example will be imitated. The great want of the mission is a deeper tone of piety, more regular and devout attendance to the ministry of the word, class meetings, and prayer meetings. We are sorry our special services were productive of so little lasting good; but while we mourn over our failures and defects we are not without hopeful anticipation of improvement. May Heaven smile on us. Amen.

DUMMER.—Through the abundant mercies of God we are safely brought through another year; and though its commencement appeared gloomy, before its close matters assumed a brighter aspect. At the close of the January prayer meeting we commenced special services, which resulted in the quickening of some dead souls. About thirty presented themselves as subjects for prayer, among whom were several of our Sabbath School children. The long contemplated Mission House has at length been built, together with a good stable and driving house; the Lot containing two acres, given by Mr. Thompson, is fenced, and a drain from the cellar dug—all the labor given by the friends; the cost of the house is \$400, of which \$116 have been paid, and \$60 more promised. Owing to the removal of many of our friends, and the death of some, our Missionary receipts are behind last year; still we thank God and take courage.

HUNTINGDON.—This year has been one of unprecedented hardships in a temporal point of view, owing to the parching droughts of last summer. Spiritually, things are brighter and more animating. The meetings, both public and social, have been rich with Divine influence. The Sabbath School at Zion is improving; the Bible class more than meets our expectations. Our protracted meetings did not fully meet our hopes, still we believe good has been done. The Societies are living in peace, and for the most part enjoying, we believe, close communion with God. Four of our members have died in the faith. Our finances present a heavy deficiency, and but for the self denial of many of our friends would be much heavier; while the self-indulgence of others tend to cripple the energies of the church, by turning the funds which might have replenished her coffers into other channels.

HUNTERFORD.—The past year has been one of arduous labor. Special services were held for five months, which resulted in the hopeful conversion of about 40 persons, 31 of whom joined the church. Two places have been opened for preaching. Several things have militated against the progress of the Station, spiritually and financially: 1st, the pressure of the times, owing to the severe drought of last summer. 2nd, the large number of removals. 3rd, Pride, worldly mindedness and covetousness; nevertheless there are some who have the cause of God at heart, and support it to the utmost of their ability. We believe it is necessary to send two preachers to work this mission efficiently.

SEYMORE.—The present state of this Mission is not as prosperous as we desire. Some of our members do not manifest that interest in the prosperity of God's cause we should like to see; our class and prayer meetings are not so well attended as they might be. The congregations are in most places good. We have two Sabbath Schools, but neither in a very prosperous state. Two public Tea meetings were held in January, which were well attended and proved a decided success. Our Quarterly and Missionary receipts are ahead of last year. But O! how much we need a baptism of Heavenly influence to prepare us for usefulness. May we soon realize it. Amen.

**PERRY TOWN.**--In looking over the past year we see much to be thankful for ; also, cause for deep humility. We have suffered much from the removal of many kind friends, and from want of a resident Missionary. The friends would gladly build and give more to the support of the cause, but are prevented owing to the light crops and low prices of the past few years. We hope with the Divine blessing to do better in future. Our congregations are good, but the societies are small.

**PICKERING.**--We take a retrospect of the past year with mingled feelings. We have had to wade through deep waters, and with sorrow acknowledge a lack of spirituality among our members ; but thank God we have some deeply pious, and zealous for God's cause. We have witnessed a few conversions ; but through the unfaithfulness of some, and the removal of others, the number of members is a few below last year. Financially we are behind our expectations : the people complain of a scarcity of money on account of the light crops of last year. Our chapel at Duffin's Creek was dedicated to the service of God last fall : may it prove the birthplace of many souls.

**SCOTT.**--With mingled feelings we review the past year. We rejoice because the Lord has not left us without tokens of his favor ; and sorrow that more good has not attended our labors. Only one special service was held during the winter, and we regret to see so little lasting good as the result thereof. Our congregations have improved in a few instances. Our Missionary receipts are behind last year, owing to the scarcity of money, and the removal of some young persons, who, though not members of the church, gave liberally to that department last winter. We have raised for chapel purposes somewhat more than one hundred dollars. We must candidly acknowledge the mission is low, not only numerically and financially, but also spiritually. By whom shall Jacob arise ? O Lord, send now prosperity. Amen.

**FENELON.**--We feel thankful to be able to report a little progress. Since the erection of the chapel at Moyne's the cause of God advances, the Sabbath School increases in numbers and interest, and a good influence pervades the whole locality. The several appointments are in a more prosperous condition, and if regularly attended to will doubtless rise. In Somerville we hope to organize a connexional Sabbath School. A Preacher's house would be a great acquisition to the Mission, and the friends are turning their attention to the subject. Financially we are far behind, both in our Quarterly and Missionary receipts, owing to the failure of the crops, and the scarcity of money among the lumbermen. Some of the friends are sorry they cannot do more, and anxiously inquire when will the mission be self sustaining?

**OSHAWA.**--The work of God on this station is steadily progressing. Our chapel opening was a complete success. Our congregations are good, and the cause established. Our special services resulted in about 50 professing faith in Christ, but we have to mourn over the instability of some. We have opened one new place with a good prospect of success. Our Sabbath School works well. We have organized a Bible class, which has been made a blessing. We believe if this station is worked with care it will soon become self-sustaining. So in reviewing the year we thank God, and take courage.

**MITCHELL.**--The year just closed has been one of serious sickness among members and Preachers, causing many disappointments in our public services;

but, thank God, mercy has been mingled with correction. The unfaithfulness of some has also militated against the prosperity of the station. Hibbert centre and Prospect were united with Usborne Mission last Conference. The Sabbath School anniversaries were seasons of great interest; extensive additions have been made to the libraries of Zion and Mitchell Schools. A very neat chapel has been erected at Gould's (Fullerton), and is free of debt; and a brick parsonage at Mitchell is in course of erection. We need, we pray, and are believing for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

**CLINTON.**—In presenting our report we must speak of trials and conflicts, as well as prosperity. Owing to the failure of crops we must report a heavy deficiency. An unhappy circumstance at Oasis led to the dropping of 6 members. At our special service at Fowler's a few souls were saved. At Zion, in Colborne, a gracious outpouring of the holy spirit was realized, resulting in the addition of 24 to the society at Fisher's, the formation of a new society in the 6th Concession, and 20 added to Zion: here our friends have commenced to build a Preacher's house, with a view of dividing the station, which is felt to be absolutely necessary. At Clinton, too, (long dry and barren,) fruit has appeared: 25 have been added to the Church, a new class formed, and a promising Sabbath School organized; an addition has also been made to the Preacher's house. At Holmesville an eligible site has been procured for a chapel, and if \$100 can be raised two friends have engaged to see it built. This Mission, by the blessing of God, bids fair to rise from its past stationary position; still a more general quickening is needed, and a spirit of believing prayer and holiness of heart cultivated to ensure continued and enlarged success. May the great Head of the church supply all we need. Amen.

**LONDON.**—The year has passed away without bringing such results as we desired and expected. We cannot report many conversions; the societies however are dwelling in peace, and many of the members give evidence of a growth in grace. Some have removed to other parts, others have backslidden and left the church. The entire debt on London chapel has been paid off, and a balance left towards a house for the Minister. The congregation also has been a little on the increase. The Sabbath School has grown both in numbers and interest, and we hope to reap a rich harvest from it in time to come. All things considered, we have reason to thank God, and take courage.

**DEREHAM.**—With feelings of gratitude we record the mercies of God during the past year. We held special services at Bethel and Utmanville, which resulted in the conversion of several precious souls. At the latter place we are building a frame chapel 30 x 40, which is to be finished by the 1st of June. We have commenced preaching in Inggersoll, and organized a society consisting of 9 members, which we hope to increase. During the winter we had a Circuit Tea, and realized \$70, designed to be applied to building a Preacher's house. We have three very interesting Bible classes. Our societies are living in peace, but we want more active piety. May God purify us and make us a peculiar people, zealous of good works.

**GREY.**—The past year has been one of great anxiety and care. Owing to the scanty produce of the fields, and consequent pressure of the times, our finances are low; but we hope to realize a change for the better. We believe in order to succeed in Turnberry an active young man should be placed there, to reside at

Blue Vale, and to change on the Sabbath with the preacher on the Grey part of the Mission. The number of members is less than last year, owing to the unfaithfulness of some who joined the Church during the protracted services of last year. Much more of the Divine power is needed among us.

**USBORNE.**—We are not able to report all the progress we could desire; but can truly say, hitherto hath the Lord helped us. Our special services were attended with some success. In one place not long opened several professed faith in Christ, and a Society of 20 formed; they have commenced to build a Brick Chapel 24 x 36. Prospect Chapel, in the Township of Hibbert, has been plastered, comfortably seated, and placed out of debt. A new brick Chapel 30 x 40, at a cost of nearly \$1000, has been built in Horne's settlement, and opened for Divine service Feb. 12th. The collections, tea, and subscriptions, added to previous donations, reduced the debt to \$212. Steps have been taken towards the erection of a Preacher's house. Our congregations are generally good, but we need improvement in attendance to class and prayer meetings; we also need a richer baptism of heavenly influence.

**PRINCE ALBERT.**—Through the tender mercy of God we are brought to the close of another year. We cannot report very great success, being only 13 in church fellowship in advance of last year. One from our ranks has sweetly fallen asleep in Jesus. In all the societies except one peace and friendship exist, and our prospects brighten. This mission cannot be properly worked without two Preachers, yet through financial embarrassment we must be content with one. Our greatest want is more of the mind which was in Christ, and richer effusions of the Holy Spirit of God.

**ORANGE STATION.**—The affliction of Bro. Haycraft while here, and his premature departure from the Station on account of it, in connection with the excitement and war raging in the country, our societies have not prospered as we anticipated at the commencement of the year. Fortunately Bro. Ham, (who had been resting on account of his voice) had sufficiently recovered to render us material assistance through the last quarter. During the year three of our members have died in the hope of the Gospel. Rockport has been taken on with the prospect of success. Generally speaking our congregations are good. An effort is being made to pay the debt of the Cleveland Church, which we hope will soon be accomplished. May the Lord baptise us with the Holy Spirit.

**PALMYRA.**—This Station does not present that pleasing aspect so ardently desired. Owing to removals, backslidings and deaths, and also a number of names dropped from the books, we report a decrease in membership. God has, however, visited his people, and at our Quarterly lovefeasts we have had glorious seasons. Many have experienced converting grace. Lord send us a Pentecostal shower. Amen.

**YORKVILLE.**—In tracing the events of the past year we see cause for gratitude and humility. We are sorry we cannot report an increase of membership; our losses by deaths, removals and backslidings, being about equal with the number of our admissions. Our societies are living in peace, and some are making advancement in Divine life. Financially we are ahead of last year. The Sabbath Schools in two or three places are in a prosperous condition; in others a greater interest is necessary to success. The need of a general outpouring of the spirit throughout the station is manifest. Our prayer is, O Lord revive thy work. Amen.

The few friends have done well in raising funds for the support of the cause, but they will require help from the mission funds for a time. May God baptize us with the Holy Ghost and with fire. Amen.

ILLINOIS.—Through the mercy of God we are brought to the close of another year. The amount of success anticipated has not been realized, owing to the confused state of the country, a want of more local help, and other causes. At Washington a chapel is greatly needed, which the friends intend to build when peace is restored to the country. Our society at Solon is living in peace. A few special meetings were held in the winter, and we hope some good was done. Our congregations are generally good. Our Missionary receipts in advance of last year. O! Lord, revive thy work. Amen.

LITTLE PRAIRIE.—With much fear and trembling we entered on the duties of this important station. We are sorry we cannot report more favorably at the close of the year. During the year 19 have removed, 4 have died in the faith of the Gospel, and 12 have unceremoniously withdrawn from us as a body. We are happy to say the congregations are good, and some of the members living near to God. The drought last summer, and the heavy taxes arising from the war, have militated seriously against our financial prosperity. Our Missionary receipts are in advance of last year; while our quarterages are behind. One great drawback on this station is the want of more suitable places of worship. May the great head of the church help the people to arise and build. There is not that interest taken in Sabbath Schools we would like to see. O! Lord, breathe on these dry bones and they shall live. Amen.

CHARLOTTE TOWN.—The past year, like most of its predecessors, has been largely commingled with the bitter and the sweet. The opinion formed on the actual state of affairs will principally depend upon the stand point occupied by the observer: from one point he will see much, the sight of which will cause him to blush for the christian name. From a second point may be seen earnest persevering efforts to win souls to Christ, crowned with success. Again we look from a third point of observation and behold the devastation death has made. The aged sire rich in fruits of usefulness,—the widowed mother,—the blooming youth, alike struck down, yet triumphing o'er the common foe. Our congregations in Charlotte Town and some other places were never so large as at present. Financially the Circuit is embarrassed; but arrangements have been made for the discharge of the present debt. Noble and successful efforts have been made in the chapel department. Our numbers are less than last year, owing to the dropping of quite a number of names long retained on the books expectant of a quickening; which expectation has not been realized.

**VERNON RIVER & MONTAGUE.**—Amid many hopes and fears we have arrived at the close of another year ; we have had peace and harmony in our borders ; the interest manifested in our connexional operations, and attendance to the means of grace are encouraging. Some fields appear ripe for a precious ingathering whenever circumstances will admit of our making the necessary effort. After filling up deficiencies we have an increase of 7 members. Two have passed away from earth ripe in years, and we trust ripe for glory. The chapel department is receiving earnest attention. At Vernon River preparations are making to erect a larger chapel. Montague Bridge Chapel has been finished, seated, &c., at a cost of £20. The debt on Bethesda (Murray Harbor road,) has been reduced £12. At Cherry Valley, cross road, a site has been procured, and a large frame chapel in course of erection. A gift of land for a chapel and cemetery has been made, and liberal promises obtained towards the building fund for the same, at the head of Montague, near five roads. Our finances are in a healthy state, the friends having, besides paying the current year's expenses, considerably reduced a debt of long standing.

**EBENEZER.**—In reviewing the labors of the past year, we have cause for joy and also for deep humiliation before God. With thankfulness we refer to the blessed influences realized in our special efforts, resulting in the conversion of many, 31 of whom united with us in church fellowship ; on the other hand we lament the low tone of piety among many of our members ; our great want is a mighty baptism of the holy spirit. Our advancement financially is not what we could desire, yet it is pleasing to notice the fixed determination of our friends to be self-sustaining. During the year death has entered our ranks, and torn from us one greatly beloved ; but the grim monster found her ready : converted at an early age, she joined the church, and making her motto "holiness to the Lord," she lived to purpose, and died in the triumph of faith.

**MURRAY HARBOR.**—In presenting our annual report for this station we have much cause to bless God for his continued favors and loving-kindness. Union and peace exist among our members—gracious influences often realized in the public and social means of grace, causing us to rejoice and say, "it is good for us to be here." Our congregations are good throughout the entire station. Our prospects of spiritual good are encouraging. We wait for the promised showers. We feel we need a deeper baptism of the holy spirit. Improvements have been made on the mission premises, at a cost of from eight to ten pounds. About twenty pounds have been expended on the new Chapel at the White sands, and provision made for the whole expense of finishing it. Our Sabbath Schools are progressing, —two Bible Classes organized,—a new library has been promised for the Three Rivers School,—and a friend has kindly presented eleven volumes to the library of the Murray Harbor School.

**GRAND RIVER.**—We rejoice to be able to report numerous and attentive congregations, liberality in contributions to support the cause of God ; but regret the neglect of attendance at class meetings and the social means of grace. Our position is somewhat peculiar, the population being composed of persons of various and conflicting opinions ; nevertheless we are hopeful that if proper attention is continued to be paid to this now comparatively unprofitable field, it will yet become as a field the Lord hath blessed.
