

Smaller (garrisons will be established at Marsa, Susa, Tokra, Medina, Lebda, Hissa, I Mosurata and a few other points. To Expel Maitese Rome, Oct. 12.—Advices received here today from Tripoli state that the J Italian governor, Rear Admiral Borea. D'Olomo has been ordered to expel several Maitese who were attached to the old regime, and have shown a dis-position to resist the innovation. Their attitude has surprised the Ital-ians. The officers are finding great diffi-culty in holding the soldiers within bounds as the latter are anyious to march on the enemy in the interior. Soldiers have now replaced the saliors on duty, and the advance posts have been extended to several miles around Tripoli. It is evidently the purpose of the Italians to gradually push their lines to the Ghurian hills where the remnant of the commander of the Turks, is about to surrender, while according to others, he is gathering a large army in preparation to resist indefinitely.
