Biographical Sketch of the Founder of the Young Men's Christian Association Organization.

GEORGE WILLIAMS was born on a farm near Somerset, England, 1821; was converted when an apprentice at Bridgewater; entered a London business house, 1841; was powerfully impressed by the commercial slavery and spiritual neglect of men in commercial and industrial employ. Organized his fellow-employees into an Association for Bible study and Christian fellowship; was at first a Director then Treasurer, and, on the death of the Rt. Hon. Earl of Shaftsbury, President. When on a salary of £150 per annum, was accustomed to give £50 per annum to the funds of the Association; was knighted by Her Majesty Queen Victoria, June, 1894.

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SUMMARY OF SALIENT FEATURES OF 32 YEARS HISTORY

OF THE

Ottawa Young Men's Christian Association.

- Nov. 1867 Organized at Public Meeting, Geo. Hay, Esq., Chairman. Simple Constitution adopted.
- 1867-8 One Weekly Meeting, religious and literary alternately.
- 1871-2 Accumulated debt, \$600; contemplated closing.
- 1872-3 Annual Report first printed.
- 1873-4 Weekly literary and religious meetings. Bible Class organized. Rev. R. Gavin, teacher. Services started at Jail and Hospital.
- 1875-6 Four Committees, viz., Mission, Meetings and Lecture, Rooms and Library, Boarding-House and Employment.
- 1877-8 Accumulated debt, \$1,337. Value of assets, \$174. Seizure. Temporary settlement.
- 1878-9 Finance and Reception Committees organized. Bolton St. Mission opened. Debt greatly reduced.
- 1879-80 Sick-Visitation Committee and "A.M." Bible Class (Jas. Gibson, teacher) organized. Literary Society becomes defunct. Singing, French and Drawing taught.
- 1880-1 New Constitution adopted. Board composed of Pres., 6 Vice-Pres., Treas., Librarian, Sec'y., 10 memb., resident Pastors ex-officio. Rooms and Printing Committee organized. "Association Reporter" published; issue, 1000 copies monthly.
- 1881-2 Revs. Messrs. Rich. Gavin and A. A. Cameron, and Chas. Falconer elected "Honorary Members" for conspicuous service.
- 1884-5 Incorporation, 2 June, 1884. Invitation and Boys' Committees and Boys' Work organized. Building Committee (Ed. Seybold, Chairman, P. Larmouth, Treas.) organized and Fund opened. Woman's Auxiliary organized, Mrs. Jas. Gibson, Pres., Miss L. E. May, Sec'y., Mrs. Young, Treas.
- 1885-6 Piano presented by Woman's Auxiliary. Physical Culture Committee (A. G. Pittaway, Chairman), Ramblers Club and P.M. Bible Class organized. First public anniversary, 2000 present. Literary Society re-organized. "Association Reporter" discontinued.
- 1889-0 Corner-stone of building laid by Hon. E. H. Bronson, 8 May, '88, building entered Nov. '88. Physical Director engaged. Fee increased from \$1 to \$2 and \$5. Provincial Convention first held in Ottawa. Death of D. D. McPherson, who left legacy of \$1,000 and cost of outdoor fountain. Woman's Auxiliary furnish building; cost \$1,000. Mrs. Donaldson presents "A" and "B" Library cases, also table. No. of subscribers to the building fund, 637.
- 1889-90 Constitution amended, year to end 30 April instead of 30 August; Board of 21 members, including Pres., Vice-Pres., Treas. and Board Sec'y., 7 to retire each year. Life membership increased from \$30 to \$50.
- 1891-2 Constitution amended, 10 May, '92, to include Invitation and Tract, Physical Culture and Membership Committees, and dropping office of Board Secretary. Death of Rev. Richard Gavin, who left legacy of \$100 and the Richard Gavin Reference Library.
- 1892-3 Silver Anniversary, 31 Oct., '92, to celebrate removal of the \$10,000 mortgage debt, the family of the late H. F. Bronson, Esq., contributing \$4500 of the amount. John MacMillan, Esq., B.A., Pres. 1867-68, Chairman of the evening.

- 1893-4 Mrs. Bronson donates \$1,000. First Summer Camp of the Junior Dept.
- 1894-5 Literary Society win "Highest Award" and the Educational Dept. "Award of Merit" at Intern'l. Convention at Springfield, U.S.A. F. J. Fedarb and Chas. Falconer, delegates to World's Jubilee Conv., London, Eng., June, '94. Death of Charles Falconer (5th Feb'y., '95), Paul M. Robbins and Robert Blackburn, Esq. Latter left legacy of \$500 to Assoc'n. First Convention of Woman's Auxiliaries of Ontario and Quebec, Jan'y., 1895.
- 1895-6 Woman's Auxillary present second piano to Assoc'n. Death of B. H. Teakles, for 25 years consecutively a member of the Board.
- 189C-7 Anniversary of Association and the 19th Provincial Welcome Convention held in conjunction, January, 1897, Mayor Bingham extending city's welcome to delegates; His Worship's first public function as Mayor. Charles Falconer "Memorial Fountain" erected. Anonymous bequest of \$150 through W. H. Eagleson.
- 1897-8 Natatorium installed; formally opened for use by address and "plunge" by Mayor Bingham and Ald. Robt. Stewart. Earl of Aberdeen, Governor General, donates and presents 100 prizes to members of Physical Dept. at Closing Exhibition.
- 1898-9 F. J. Fedarb, for 9 years General Secretary, resigns to accept a Field Secretaryship in England. No Gen'l. Sec'y. from 24th Oct., '98. First Inter-Association debate, Montreal vs. Ottawa.

32nd ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Ottawa Young Men's Christian Association

Year to the 30th April, 1898.

As will be seen, an attempt has been made to present in this Report a sort of resume of the history of the work and workers of the Ottawa Association, and related agencies, from the date of the organization of the Association, and so to remind us of "all the way by which the Lord hath led us, for there hath not failed one word of all that He promised." May we therefore give Him our heartfelt thanks for the guidance and success He hath vouchsafed us.

The Annual Meeting:

The Annual Meeting, held Tuesday evening, 9th May, was exceptionally well attended, and was remarkable for the healthy, if acute, spirit of inquisitiveness that was manifestly abroad. The Woman's Auxiliary provided refreshments at the close of the meeting. The reports presented by the President, on behalf of the Board, and by the Chairmen of the various Committees, showed that on the whole good progress had been made in the work of the several departments. Back of the statistics of work done, and the evidences of material benefit derived by those who made use of the privileges provided, there are many testimonies, both oral and written, as to help received by a considerable number of members and others, who date the beginnings of useful and prosperous lives from the period of their connection with the Association. The letters received from individuals and their friends, speaking of benefit received, are in some cases very touching.

SUMMARY OF REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES.

Mission and Devotional Committee:

J. S. Eagleson, Chairman; T. E. Chisnall, Secretary. The Bible Classes taught by Mr. Jas. Gibson and the Secretary have been conducted with good results; the attendance at the Sunday afternoon class being exceptionally good, and the same is true of the religious meetings and Bible Training classes. Services were conducted every Sabbath at the jail, Hos-

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pital, and Perley Home, at the Exhibition last summer, and special services in the Rooms during the Universal Week of Prayer. There should be an attendance of one hundred every Sabbath at the Bible Class taught by Mr. Jas. Gibson. The International series of Sunday School Lessons is taken up by this class.

Invitation and Tract Committee :

Norman McLeod, Chairman. This Committee has rendered effective service in the distribution of tracts on the barges, at the foot of the Locks, Queen's Wharf, and along the wharfs; also in the Parks and livery stables. Invitations to the meetings were distributed at the hotels. The Committee is indebted to the Upper Canada Tract Society, the Evangelical Tract Society, and to Mr. Bell Dawson, M.A., for contributions of Tracts. The death of Albert Mulligan, a devoted worker, is much regretted by the members of this Committee.

Reception Committee :

Geo. Barwell, Chairman. The moonlight excursion in June last, the farewell social tendered to Mr. Fedarb, the New Year's Reception, the reception to the delegates to the Brockville Convention, and the Annual Social for the Bible Classes were well looked after by this Committee. The importance of the work which this Committee may do, even apart from the attention given to such social functions as have been enumerated, can scarcely be overestimated.

Physical Culture Committee :

R. H. Campbell, Chairman; S. J. Willoughby, Secretary. The work of splendidly conducted and well attended classes was brought to a fitting close in the Gymnasium Exhibition, held in Harmony Hall in April, under the distinguished patronage of His Excellency Lord Minto, Governor-General of Canada. The Snowshoe Club was conducted with success, and the new swimming bath has been very popular.

Statistics :

Classes—Sessions held, 436; total attendance, 8,001 for classes and 1969 for visitors, a total of 10,060, against 8,000 for the previous year. An experiment is being made of a field for outdoor athletics this season.

Educational Committee :

Wm. A. Code, Chairman, With a competent staff of teachers, specialists in their several departments, good results were looked for, and were realized, in the work of this sphere of the Association's activity. While it is satisfactory to know that 168 students attended the various classes this season, as against 115 students for last season, it is still to be regretted that a much larger number of young men do not seize the opportunity presented by these classes to enhance their prospects in life. The work of the French classes in particular is growing. Dr. V. H. Lyon gave his services gratuitously, a fact which the Committee appreciates very much, as services of this kind should command a high award. A reception given the staff and members of the Committee by Dr. and Mrs. Greene was much enjoyed.

Dr. W. R. Greene, President ; S. W. Hume, Secretary. The Society continues to maintain the high level of efficiency which won for its exhibit the highest award at the International Convention, held in Philadelphia, U.S.A., in 1895. Meetings are held weekly from 1st October to 15th April, and are devoted in turn to public, private or impromptu debates, literary evenings, mock parliaments, and mock court trials. Essay writing is found to give good results. Representatives of many callings, including six or more graduates and specialists of Universities, are enrolled in the membership of the Society. Perhaps the notable event of the past season was the public Inter-Association debate with representatives of the Montreal Society. Rev. D. P. Rose, D.D.; His Honor Judge McTavish, and Mr. R. W. Shannon, B.A., Barrister, composed the Committee of Judges on this occasion. The Society deeply laments the death of Mr. Geo. R. Webster, B.A., Barrister, whose services as critic and whose contribution to the literary features of the work were of the greatest value to the society.

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Junior Department Committee.

S. L. T. Frost, Chairman. W. Lyle Reid, Secretary. The Department has just closed what is believed to have been the best year in the history of the Junior Department. Greater interest in the Summer Camp, better provision for the social needs, a greater number of conversions, a marked deepening of the spiritual life of the members, and a splendid corps of consecrated, faithful and able members of executive made possible such a satisfactory result. Outings were held last summer at Chelsea, the Experimental Farm, Aylmer, Marshall's Bay and other points, and entertainment was provided at the homes of Mr. Lyle Reid, Mrs. Blackadar, Mrs. Frost, and Mrs. Eddie Russell. Five members of the Department attended and took an active part in the Junior Convention, the first of the kind, held in conjunction with the Inter-Provincial Convention, held at Brockville.

Statistics.

10 Prayer Meetings ; 53 Weekly Meetings ; attendance, 2,633 ; 84 requests for prayer ; 144 professed conversions ; 4 Training Classes ; average attendance of 6 at the 70 sessions.

Fourteenth Annual Report of the Woman's Auxiliary :

Mrs. Wm. Young, President. Miss Charlotte Ross, Secretary. Mrs. W. S. Odell, Treasurer. Meetings of the Auxiliary have been held monthly ; average attendance, nineteen. The Bible Readings given at the regular monthly meetings have been found very interesting and helpful, Mrs. C. Seybold giving great assistance in this connection. The members of the Auxiliary regretted very much to have to part with Mr. and Mrs. Fedarb, and took the opportunity to present to Mr. Fedarb a token of their esteem in the shape of a handsome clock.

Besides assuring the success of the social functions referred to in the report of the Reception Committee, the Auxiliary has helped very greatly to strengthen the influence of the Association in the community and to assure the success of the work in a sense that would not be possible without their aid. Two members of the Auxiliary, Mrs. Young and Mrs. A. G. Cole, attended as delegates at the Brockville Convention, where they took a prominent part in the proceedings of the Conference of Woman's Auxiliaries.

Report of the Finance Committee

Robt. Stewart, Chairman. The financial statement will show that the Committee exercised all due diligence in seeking to meet the financial obligations for the year, and while not called on to meet so large an outlay for current expenses, or special Swimming Bath account, as was necessary for the previous year, yet had a heavy obligation to meet, and, thanks to the generous response given by members and subscribers to the appeal for support, were able to meet it with very fair success. A considerable

number of members and subscribers responded very willingly to the appeal for an increase in the amount of their contributions. A sustaining membership of several hundred members and subscribers, at \$5, \$10, and \$15, and amounts up to \$50 and \$100, would relieve the management of much anxiety, and the expenditure of much time and energy, and would ensure the efficiency of the work.

Personal and General:

On 24th October, Mr. F. J. Fedarb resigned the General Secretaryship after nine years of devoted and able service, to accept a position as Field Secretary in the work in England. Mr. Fedarb was presented by the members with a valuable gold locket, chain and watch, and Mrs. Fedarb was presented by the ladies of the Auxiliary and friends with a handsome clock.

Mr. Booth and Mr. Moore, of the International Committee, were visitors to the Association. Mr. Booth conducted several religious meetings and Bible Classes while here, and quite won the hearts, as well as the thanks of the members who met with him, being used as well of the Master in helping special cases. It is with feelings of sincere regret that the Board and Association must agree to accede to Mr. F. P. Bronson's request to be allowed to retire from the Board of Directors, and from the position of Treasurer, in both of which positions he has rendered the Association conspicuous service.

Quite a large contingent of members attended the Provincial Convention at Brockville in January. The thanks of the Association are due and are hereby tendered to Mr. Alex. Lumsden, M.P.P., and Mr. C. B. Powell, M.P.P., for services rendered the Association in regard to assisting in securing certain legislation, and also to Mr. Robert Stewart, who at considerable personal cost and inconvenience to his business, assisted in the same connection. The thanks of the Association are also due and are hereby tendered to the Ottawa Auxiliary of the British and Foreign Bible Society, for copies of the Bible supplied the Association; to the city newspapers, the Journal, Citizen and Free Press, for news, notes and kindly references to the work, and to the Rev. Norman McLeod, B.A., B.D., for the series of Bible Readings conducted by him with so much profit to a large number of the members and their friends.

A matter of great satisfaction to the Board and Association is the entirely happy relationship which exists between the Churches and the Association, and the more frequent use that is being made of the Association Building by the religious bodies.
