

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

REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

The Committee of Management of the St. George's Society, on retiring from office, have the honor to submit to the members a general report of the proceedings of the Society for the past twelve months.

St. George's Day was, as usual, celebrated by the members attending Divine Service at the Cathedral, in the evening. The Lord Bishop delivered a most eloquent and appropriate sermon. Prayers were read by the Revd. G. V. Housman, and the Lessons by the Revd. A. W. Mountain. The musical ervice was conducted by F. W. Mills, Esq., F.C. O., Organist of the Cathedral, to whom, with the ladies and gentlemen forming the voluntary choir, the Society is much indebted.

The collection, in aid of the charitable fund, amounted to \$68.20.

It affords the Committee great pleasure to state that the affairs of the Society continue in a prosperous condition notwithstanding that a greater number than usual of our fellow-countrymen have this year been relieved, while others seeking our shores, and failing to find employment, have been sent back through the instrumentality of the Society. During the year the sum of \$505.85 has been expended by the charitable committee.

This year the Society has added to its roll three life members and four ordinary members, and one ordinary member has become a life member.

The Society has sustained a considerable loss in the removal from Quebec of B. Daikers, Esq., one of its most active

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members and first Vice-President. By the unanimous vote of the Society, a resolution passed at a general meeting held on the 23rd of April, acknowledging his services, was engressed and transmitted to him.

The Committee have also to regret the departure of Joseph White, Esq., late President of the Society, and for years one of its most benevolent and indefatigable members, whose failing health necessitated his return to England.

Death has removed from the Society's list the following members: Henry Goodwin, Esq., who was for many years Secretary of the Charitable Committee, an active and zealous member, and one whose sympathies were at all times enlisted in the cause of his indigent fellow-countrymen. William B. Valleau, Esq., and Noah Freer, Esq., both life members since 1845, the latter one of the original members, and for the last few years a resident of Montreal. Also, Mr. Edward Bartlett, late of Her Majesty's Customs, an ordinary member.

The thanks of the Society are due and are hereby tendered to J. E. Deschamps, Esq., Agent of the Richelieu Company, and to the Manager of the Grand Trunk Railway Company here, for forwarding at half fares many distressed Englishmen.

Before concluding the report, the Committee beg to record the great advantages derived by the Society from the existing charitable institutions, the Finlay Asylum and the Ladies' Protestant Home, by which the Society is enabled to afford temporary shelter to many waiting an opportunity to return to their native country, and in some cases being the means of preventing the Society from being imposed upon by worthless applicants.
