## BY-LAWS.



1. An Annual Fee of One Dollar must be paid by all members.
2. Any member failing to render the part assigned to her on any programme, except when due to illness, must either furnish a fitting substitute, or pay a fine of 25 cents.
3. Concerts must begin promptly on time, and no person shall enter during the performance of a number.
4. Visitors to the city introduced by members are welcome at the Club Concerts.
5. Twelve members of the Executive Committee shall form a quorum. Members of the Committee absenting themselves from business meetings, except from unavoidable causes, shall pay a fine of 10 cents.
6. Encores are strictly prohibited at all regular concerts.
7. Gentlemen can become associate members upon payment of the annual fee of one dollar.
