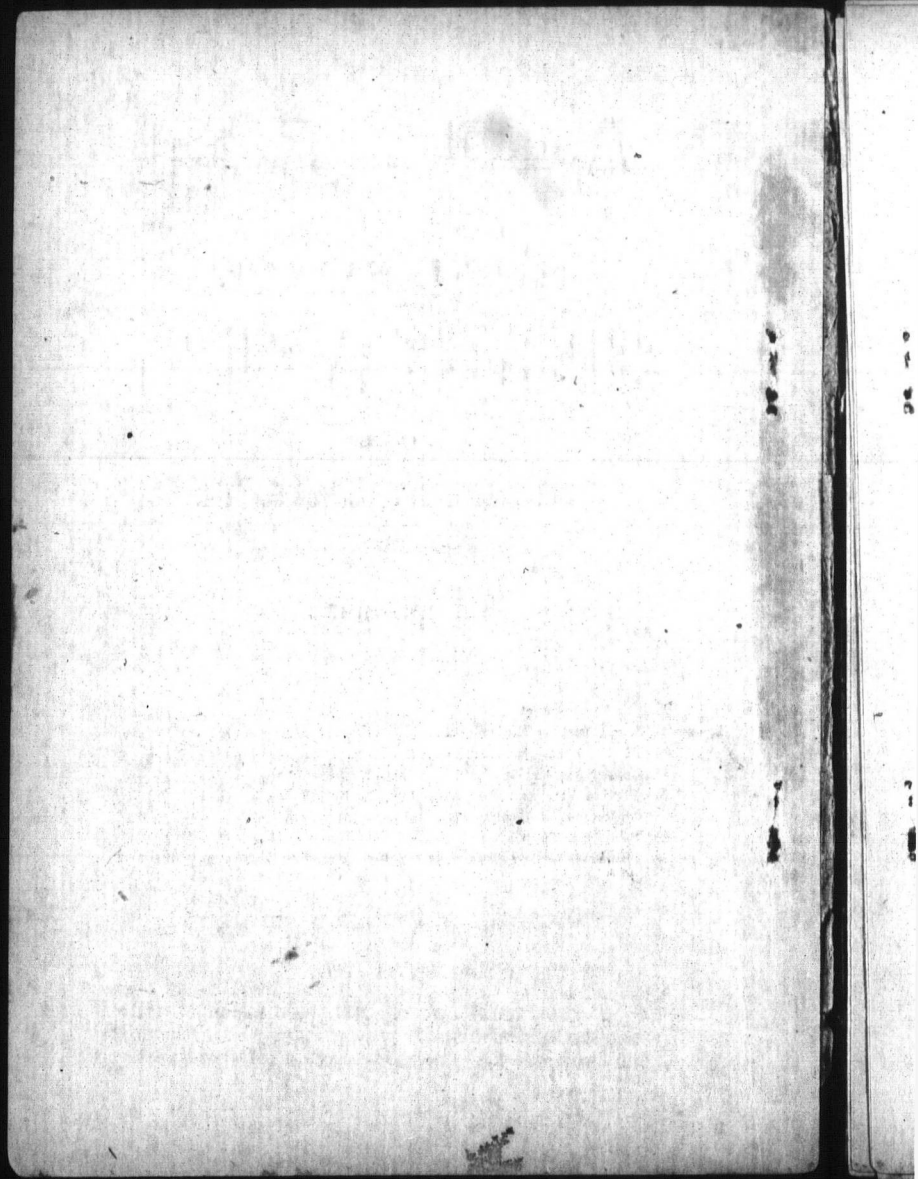

THOMAS MCCrackEN

Report of the Session for 1891.

DEAR BRETHREN:—It is our privilege to present to you another annual statement, and, in so doing, we call upon you to join with us in thanksgiving to God for the spiritual and temporal mercies He has bestowed upon us as a people during the year now past. A goodly degree of success has crowned the efforts of all the organizations in connection with our congregation, and it is a pleasure to add that harmony and good will are everywhere apparent in our bounds.

Our membership at the close of 1890 numbered 303, and during the past year 20 members have been added—10 by certificate and 10 by confession of faith. Since the induction of our present pastor—a little more than two years ago—there has been a total addition of

81 members. During the year the names of 33 members were removed from the Roll, the number being made up as follows:—2 by death, 17 certified to other churches, and 14 (by a careful revision of the Roll) added to the retired list, so that, at this date, we have a *present and active* membership of 290. The large number of removals is mainly owing to the closing up of the Streetsville Woollen Co's mills at Barberton.

We are further pleased to note the regularity in attendance at the Lord's day services of a majority of the families of our congregation. Let us ever remember that now, as of old, Jehovah gives precious manifestations of His presence and grace to those who forsake not the assembling of themselves together. Especially to those who stand in the parental relation do we counsel the bringing up of the entire family to the courts of God's house, and the establishment of the family altar in the home. Nor should parents be negligent in the matter of securing the attendance of the children in the Sabbath School. With an efficient and consecrated staff of teachers, together with fair equipment, much good in the near future should result; but such an end cannot be attained without the warm co-operation of parents. The Moderator reports that the attendance at prayer-meetings is fair, *but might easily be better*. We should not forget that the prayer-meeting attendance marks in some degree the general interest of the congregation in religion. The congregation enjoyed three Communion Seasons during the year with the following large attendances of members: 233, 254, 227. The number of Baptisms for the year was five. The pastor's visiting-book shows a record of 311 pastoral calls and visits, of which 68 were to sick and afflicted. Our losses by death have touched a wide circle of friends and filled their hearts with sorrow. We deeply sympathize with all who have thus been sorely shaken with grief, and pray that they may receive the abounding consolations of the "blessed hope" the Gospel brings.

On the threshold of another year we would remind

the congregation (and especially those who are personally devoted to it) of the great obligation we are under to God for our privileges and opportunities, and of the corresponding responsibility of each one *for the work* the Master has left him to do. Organization is helpful in many matters of earthly business, but in doing the Lord's work *individual* consecration is of supreme importance. *Unless we are each one given up to Him, so as to be filled with His Holy Spirit, His work cannot be done by us.* The slothful servant was condemned. "To him that hath shall be given."—"Whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he seemeth to have." *Faithfulness* is a personal and responsible quality of all true action. Our Lord says:—"Be thou faithful unto death and I will give thee a crown of life."

Young People's Mission Band

The attendance at the monthly meetings of the Band during the year has not fairly represented the numerical strength and missionary interest of our young people. It is also a matter of regret that so few heads of families attended those public meetings at which active missionaries were present to give addresses.

In December, missionary envelopes were distributed

and voluntary offerings asked. The result has been most encouraging, and indicates that the day is not far distant when the Streetsville congregation will be much in advance of the old-fashioned plan of district collectors. Not yet, however, have we as a congregation attained the position we ought to occupy in missionary contributions. While the average annual contribution in the Presbytery of Toronto to the schemes of the church is \$8.40 per member, that of our congregation is only \$1.40 per member. This is not as it ought to be. The President, therefore, kindly but very earnestly urges that in the coming year the offerings be so *individually* increased that this unfavorable showing may be very greatly remedied. "Freely ye have received, freely give."

Report of the Board of Managers.

To the Members and Adherents of the Streetsville Presbyterian Church :—

In presenting the Annual Financial Statement we have much pleasure in recording the great mercies of God which have attended and blessed our labors. Notwithstanding many removals from our bounds—consequent upon the closing of the Barberton Woollen Mills—we are permitted to report a good degree of success in the contributions to ordinary revenue. We thank you most cordially for the gratifying increase noticeable since the revision of the weekly and yearly offerings early in the year. The balance due the Treasurer results from three causes, viz., (1) a shrinkage in Receipts during our late vacancy, leaving a burden we have not since been able to overtake; and (2) the withdrawal of the communion collections (amounting to some fifty dollars yearly) from the ordinary revenue in favor of the Session Fund; and (3) the payment of a second coal bill in the last month of the year just closed. It is believed that the arrears will fully cover this balance.*

We also extend our warmest thanks to those who so promptly responded to the volunteer offering in aid of the Total Liability Fund. By it the debt on our congregational property is reduced to the sum of \$1,875.00. In this, the third statement since the induction of our present pastor, it is only proper to add for our mutual encouragement that, during that period, we have as a congregation, raised for all purposes, the handsome sum of upwards of \$9,000.

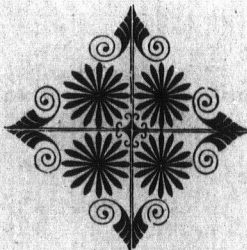

Synopsis

Of Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Streetsville Presbyterian Congregation for the year 1891.

Pursuant to notice duly given, the annual congregational meeting was held on Monday evening, January 11th, 1892, in the lecture room of the church. After a social tea given by the ladies, the pastor took the chair and opened the meeting with devotional exercises. Mr. Nathaniel Steen was appointed Secretary.

The minutes of the last annual meeting were read and confirmed.

Full and satisfactory reports from the several organizations of the congregation were presented in order, and, as published in this printed pamphlet.

In connection with the Report from the Board of Managers, it was moved by Mr. N. Steen, seconded by Mr. R. A. Redding, that the thanks of the congregation be tendered to Mr. Joseph Featherston, Treasurer of the Board, for the able and satisfactory manner in which the yearly accounts are kept and presented. This motion was heartily carried.

Similar votes of thanks were proposed and carried to Mr. John McCauley, who retired from the Managing Board after six years of faithful and active service; and also to the ladies of the congregation who had, during the year, successfully completed their work.

The Historical Committee, appointed at the last annual meeting, reported that work had been commenced, but owing to the difficulty experienced in getting the mass of information into proper shape, they were unable to present their work in definite form at present. They were instructed to continue their labors.

The election of Managers was next considered. The Chairman named Mr. W. Jardine and Mr. L. Scruton as Scrutineers.

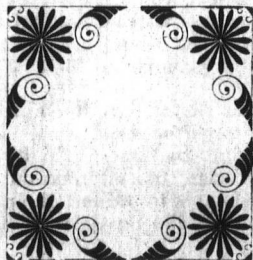
Several names were then proposed, but as some of the gentlemen nominated declined to stand, no ballot was necessary, and Messrs. T. A. McClure, G. Irwin, Wm. Thomsan and T. K. Beaty were declared duly elected by the Chairman.

Mr. McIlwrick tendered his resignation as a member of the Board, with reasons. On motion duly seconded and unanimously carried, he was asked to withdraw said resignation. On consideration, Mr. McIlwrick consented, expressing his thanks to the members and adherents for their confidence in him.

It was agreed that the Managers increase the outside lighting capacity of the church grounds, and that the Managers and Ladies' Committee consider the question of re-lighting the auditorium of the church. To this project, Miss J. Franklin promised \$75.00.

Messrs. J. B. Leslie and F. W. Morgan were re-appointed as Congregational Auditors for the current year.
