

THE HARBOUR MONTREAL



ONTREAL, a city of over 600,000 souls, named after the picturesque "Mount Royal" and lying between its base and the St. Lawrence, is the commercial metropolis and the national port of Canada. It is located at the head of navigation upon one of the greatest of rivers — the St. Lawrence — a river which drains a rich and generous soil.

Montreal is destined to hold a foremost rank among the cities of the American continent. Its marvellous growth during the past century redounds to the credit of its French and English speaking inhabitants. The friendly rivalry of the races in promoting its embellishment and prosperity affords the world the unique privilege of witnessing a most pronounced "entente cordiale".

From a commercial standpoint, Montreal occupies an unrivaled position. The majestic St. Lawrence, three miles in width, flows by the city, and empties into the Ocean about a third of all fresh waters of the globe. It commands the fauvest waterway which leads to the Atlantic, and its outlets reach the very tirths of North America. A network of canals facilitates communication with the cities along the shores of the great lakes and enables it to an extensive trade with Chicago, Duluth and other inland cities. Montreal is the key to the great waterways of Canada and the chief railway centre of the Dominion. It is the headquarters of the Canadian Pacific and of the Grand Trunk Railroad systems. Lines of railways branch out in every direction and lead to the fertile plains of the West as far as the Pacific or to the ports of the Atlantic and the picturesque hills of the North. Two bridges of surpassing beauty span the St. Lawrence and connect with the City. The Victoria Bridge, opened for traffic by the Grand Trunk Railway, in 1860, by His late Majesty King Edward VII, then Prince of Wales, is a double-track steel open-girder bridge, with carriage-ways and foot-walks on either side of the main trusses. The Canadian Pacific Bridge crosses the River about seven miles from the city, a short distance above the Lachine Rapids and a little below the Indian Village of Caughnawaga.

Montreal owes its prosperity to its harbour.



BELOVED SON, HEALTH A APOSTOLIC BENEDICTION,

WE greatly rejoice that the example of the Italian priests has inspired the Canadian clergy to emulate their zeal in the proposed Congress of Priests-Adorers for 1915.

We congratulate you, Beloved Son, and encourage you with Our Commendation and best wishes.

We desire nothing more than to see the worship of the Holy Eucharist spread among all Catholics. We would have all priests, ministers of the altar, so accustom themselves to Eucharistic Adoration as to come from it "like lions breathing fire and terrible to the devil".

In fact We are convinced that nothing can inspire them with zeal for God's glory more than the earnest study of Divine Charity. It fills the soul with grace and the love of Christ, the Victim of Charity. It stimulates devotion and makes the diffusion of God's love the supreme desire of the heart.

May this Congress of the Canadian Priesthood be blessed! May it be a sign of hope and promote the worship and reception of the Eucharist! May it be to all the Faithful a pledge of the future glory which We, in Our Fatherly love, desire for them.

Additional favors granted by Pope Benedict XV

As an Evidence of His interest in this Congress of the Priests' Eucharistic League, His Holiness Benedict XV has been pleased to grant to the Congress the same favors and privileges as to the International Eucharistic Congresses — namely: — 1. A Plenary Indulgence, on the ordinary conditions, may be gained during the Congress. For a visit to the Most Blessed Sacrauent, an Indulgence of Seven years and Seven Quarantines. 2.—The Apostolic Blessing, with Plenary Indulgence to be given by the Officiating-Bishop in the name of the Holy Father, after the Solemn Votive Mass in honor of the Blessed Sacrauent.

Priests attending the Congress, by special favor, have the privilege of saying the Votive Mass of the Blessed Sacrauent.



Association of the Priests' Eucharistic League



THE Priests' Eucharistic League was established in Paris by Venerable Pierre-Julien Eymard, founder of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament. The Blessed Cure of Ars was among the first to enroll in the League. The Association assumed its present form in 1870, received the approval of Leo XIII in 1881, and years later was definitively approved and canonically established in the church of St. Claudio at Rome. The centre of the administration however is at the house of the Fathers of the Congregation.

OBJECT — The primary object of the League is the frequent and protracted personal communion of the Most Blessed Sacrament. It is assuredly the desire of the members that priests should often appear in His presence and seek there intimate and affectionate intercourse.

Its next object is to extend the Kingdom of Christ by forming apostles of the Eucharist.

A third object is to band priests together who will pledge themselves to promote the cause and defend the honour of Jesus Christ, by visits to the sick, by frequent Communion, and by frequent Consecration.

MEMBERSHIP — All religious and secular priests are entitled to membership in the League.

The Holy See has enriched the devotion with many indulgences.

ORGANIZATION — The organization of the League is very simple. Members are grouped under their respective diocesan directors, united in turn under a general director for a country or whole district.

LITERATURE — A number of monthly periodicals keep the members in touch with the activities of the League and foster its extension. The official organ in English is the "Emmanuel", a bright little booklet published by the Fathers of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament in New-York.



THE Priests' Eucharistic League was established in Paris Venerable Pierre-Julien Eymard, founder of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament. The Association assumed its form in 1870, received the approval of Leo XIII in 1881 years later, was definitively approved and canonically in the church of St. Claudio of Rome. The centre of the League's administration however at is the house of the Fathers at Sals.

OBJECT - The primary object of the League is the frequent and reverent worship of the Most Blessed Sacrament. It is essentially the desire of the League that priests should often appear in His presence and seek there intimate and affectionate intercourse.

Its next object is to extend the Kingdom of Christ by forming apostles of the Eucharist.

A third object is to band priests together who will pledge themselves to promote the cause and defend the honour of Jesus Christ, by visits to the Eucharist as well as by frequent Communion.

MEMBERSHIP - All religious and secular priests are entitled to membership in the League.

The Holy See has enriched the devotion with many indulgences.

ORGANIZATION - The organization of the League is very simple. Members are grouped under their respective diocesan directors, united in turn a general director for a country or whole district.

LITERATURE - A number of monthly periodicals keep the membership in touch with the activities of the League and foster its extension. The official organ in English is the "Emmanuel", a bright little booklet published by the Blessed Sacrament Fathers in New-York.

Second Paper.

"The Weekly Hour of Adoration, a means of Personal Sanctification for the Priest"

1. Nature and importance of adoration in itself and for the Priest.

He is the appointed and loving Guardian of the Eucharist; his proximity to it, his necessary relations with it, the sacred rights that he exercises over it and the example that he ought to give to the Faithful, all combine to make his adoration a very necessary as well as a very elementary duty for him.

2. Fruits that he can and ought to expect, because of the special graces attached to this exercise.

3. Practical manner of making the adoration and of rendering the exercise possible and interesting.

To make use of the method of the four ends of Sacrifice.

To take inspiration from the feasts of the Liturgical cycle.

To profit by the various Eucharistic Feast Days: Holy Thursday, Corpus Christi, and particularly the Forty Hours.

To take advantage of the assemblage of Priests gathered together on these occasions, to organize among them a regular session of adoration during the free hours of their ministry.

In order to assure fidelity to the weekly hour make the daily visit to the Most Blessed Sacrament, a strict duty of which the weekly hour shall be but an easy and cherished continuation.

To invite the Faithful to join in this adoration in order that every one may not only derive benefit from the adoration but also to avoid being disturbed during the hour of guard.

To refute the principal objection against the weekly hour and the sending of the Libellum Adoracionis, which experience has taught to be one of the best guarantee of fidelity and perseverance in the practice of the hour of adoration.

AFTERNOON SESSION

First Paper.

"Holy Mass and the Priest"

Holy Mass: the ultimate reason for the Priesthood.

Immediate aim to be pursued by the Priest... He ought to live for his Mass; he is a Priest, first of all, in order to offer the Holy Sacrifice, says, St. Thomas.

Many faults of rubric resulting from routine, too great hurry, ignorance or distraction.

Preparation for Mass.

Remote preparation. Mass well celebrated is the result of a good life; a pure life, exempt from mortal sins; a life of prayer, a life of faith.

Mass well celebrated is also the result of an immediate preparation of at least a quarter of an hour's duration, well and carefully made.

Thanksgiving after Mass; it is here in particular that the Priest reaps many graces.... He should set aside a certain time for making it.

To make it in the chancery so that the Faithful may observe it and that they may understand its importance and also follow the example of their pastor by making their thanksgiving well.

Second Paper.

"The Priest and the Worship of the Eucharist"

If, for the Priest, Our Lord is: "Tu solus sanctus, Tu solus Altissimus", whatever may be the poverty of the parish, these titles of grandeur will appear and be expressed exteriorly in the manner and condition in which the Most Blessed Sacrament is guarded.

Pretext of Poverty: "Non est servus major Domino suo".

First Paper.

"Public Adoration of the Eucharist with the Faithful"

The Priest who before all else God's anointed, is also, and necessarily, a public Intercessary for the people.... He should in consequence do good to his flock.... provide for their sanctification.

How his best and most powerful aid in this duty is the Eucharist, which not only gives him grace, but the Author of grace Himself.

The Priest should first endeavor to make the Eucharist known to the faithful, disclosing to them the real life, the active loving life our Lord lives in the Host.

He should insist on the right of our Lord to adoration as God and as Man; on the intense longing of His Sacred Heart for our homage and our love; show forth the power of His intercession, in the Blessed Sacrament: "Semper vivens ad interpellandum pro nobis"; consequently the reasons we have to go to Him, in all our necessities before and above any of the Saints; and make the faithful understand that on entering the Church their first homage should be to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and not to such or such a saint. All this done, and well done, it will then be easy for him to persuade the people to enroll in Works of Adoration, specially in the Archconfraternity of the Blessed Sacrament, whose essential end is to draw them to Our Lord by the practice of Eucharistic Adoration.

The priest will first announce beforehand the Hour of Adoration, warmly invite the faithful to take part therein, show them its importance, its fruits, tell them that Christ in the Eucharist is the very same Christ with whom the Apostles walked in Judea, that His Presence in the Eucharist is the same Presence with which the disciples and the people were familiar in the old days of Galilee. And then let them look for a miracle because of His Presence now, as they did in the far away Israel. Is He not here now, and for love of them, and is He not as strong and merciful now as in the great days gone? Why should we think of Him as working His miracles of love and grace and mercy only then? It is not the same thing now? Is not Christ in the Eucharist the explanation and motive of every Christian deed done in our day? Is not Christ in the Eucharist the Magnet that draws frail human beings to walk in His footsteps? Oh! God, if men did but know! How the multitudes would gather at Thy dwelling-place, and how the face of the earth would be changed if they were made supremely conscious of the abiding Presence of their God, the "Word made Flesh and dwelling among us". And if this is made plain to the people, their love thus becomes entwined with the idea of Christ on the altar, and He is as He should be, the Sun that lights and warms and sustains their spiritual world.

A Priest worthy of his sacred calling will exert himself to make the Hour of Adoration as fervently as possible, not contenting himself by simply reading, but speaking from the fulness of his heart, letting his hearers see that he knows Our Lord, that he loves Him, and can speak about Him. If it should happen he might be obliged for some reason or another to use a book, let him do so before the Hour so that he may be conversant with his subject. I knew a saintly priest, who was forever saying to his people: "Think of the loneliness of Christ in the Tabernacle; will you, not go to the Church a minute every day, and just say, 'how do

"you do, Lord", if no more? It will please Him and do you great good". And people did go, and God blessed him and them.

An easy method whereby Adoration is rendered agreeable to the people: divide the hour into quarters adapted to the four ends of the sacrifice.... five minutes recol prayer of self examination in silence, five minutes singing,

Proper time to make the weekly Hour of Adoration...

Practical means to recruit adorers...

Apart from the hour of public adoration would it not be possible to establish daily adoration at least, on the First Friday before the Blessed Sacrament exposed? Why not lead even to Nocturnal Adoration, specially during the night of Holy Thursday to Good Friday and during the Forty Hours?





The Priest should first of all thoroughly study, according to the rules laid down by the Council of Trent (ch. xx), the nature, the fruits, the ceremonies of the Mass so as to be able to show the faithful its excellence and innumerable priceless advantages.

If the people are convinced that at the altar is truly renewed the Sacrifice of the Cross, "that the agreeable odor from this Sacrifice is so pleasing to the Lord that He grants us gifts of grace and repentance, and washes away our sins" (c. of Trent, xx, 8), they will surely come, and come frequently too.

The Priest will return again and again to this important subject, the pivot of Christian life and from which flows the benefit of the Real Presence and of Communion itself.

Exhort families to be represented by one or more members. As the people, specially in villages, are often at a loss to know how to employ their leisure, earnestly invite them to come to Mass every morning. In parishes where there are at least two priests, have the second Mass at a later hour; where there is only one, announce that Holy Communion will be gladly given to whoever asks for it. Choose an hour convenient for the people; be punctual to begin at that hour; never leave the parish without Mass except for very grave reasons.

The Priest should teach the practical way of hearing Mass, explain the meaning of the liturgical ceremonies, the way to behave, etc. With what faith and reverence should he not offer the Holy Sacrifice, how carefully and gravely should he perform those sacred rites lest perchance he be a stumbling block, rather than a help, to the piety of his flock.

AFTERNON SESSION

First Paper.

"The Communion of Adults"

The Priest should first of all be convinced of the true doctrine and importance of the Decree: "Sacra Tridentina Synodus". Study it well, become a member of the Sacerdotal League of Communion and faithfully follow its directions.

Pius X has commanded all parish priests, confessors and preachers frequently and with great zeal to exhort the faithful to the practice of frequent and daily Communion.

In the second place, the priest should preach the doctrine of Communion in season and out of season, return to it again and again in pulpit and confessional, insist in the two only essential and very easy conditions required for daily Communion, refute objections, plenary weekly indulgence to those who receive five times a week, recall the privileges for Communion of the sick.

The Priest, anxious to succeed, will assure his flock the preaching of an annual Eucharistic Triduum and be particular that the preacher changes neither its nature nor its end.

The great objection to frequent Communion, the great stumbling-block for the Priest, is the extra labor and fatigue it entails, either on account of the extra sermons or especially the confessions, also in a lesser degree, the distribution of Communion which he too often gives to suit his own convenience, instead of that of his flock.

Second Paper.

"The Communion of Children"

The Priest should start out with the firm conviction that the little children are able to understand the Eucharist.

He should believe in and adhere fully to the Decree: "Quam singulari", make it his profession of faith his rule of conduct.

He should also bear in mind the direct end Our Lord follows in the Eucharist, in Holy Communion, which is not exactly to be adored but to sanctify souls and first of all to protect them; so, even the beautiful little ciborium. Some good priests still influenced by Janissim, would do well to remember the words of the Decree: "Because it is absolutely necessary that children should become united with Christ before their passions get the start of them, and that they may thus have the strength to repel with greater energy the assaults of the devil and of their internal and external foes".

The Priest should make the Eucharist known to children by Catechism regularly, carefully prepared; it is in fact more difficult to be understood by children than adults, more difficult especially to interest them, and hold their attention. Catechism will not only be held in Church, but also in school, which the Pastor should visit often.

Make it a duty to confess, and thoroughly too, the little ones, even if it be not very agreeable; give them all the time and attention necessary, be careful even to direct them, for many of those young souls are vocations in embryo, that require cultivation and development.


Question of absolution refused without sufficient reason, or of confessions heard too rapidly.A practical and fruitful way to hear childrens' confessions, especially in crowded parishes would be to divide them into groups or categories and have weekly, each group only coming once a month, which would not prevent the children from receiving Communion very frequently provided they remain in the state of grace. In case of any fear or scruple that might arise, tell the children they can come to confession whenever they want to, and be well received.

The Priest will organize general Masses for the children, especially during vacations.

He will try to have preparation and thanksgiving publicly made, showing thereby its importance and the practical way of discharging this duty.

He will group the children in a League or Association in order to promote frequent Communion among them.

"The Communion of Children"

While Congress Hall is parochial and might be designated as semi-religious in character, the future centre for the various activities that are conducted in connection with St. Patrick's, there are several features of the building which emphasize its cosmopolitan nature and suggest the diversity of purpose to which it may be put. The Auditorium will well repay a visit and again the larger rooms, which are fitted up exclusively with the view of accommodating, in various ways, Catholic societies and associations. Special attention has been given to the furnishings of these meeting rooms, the long benches about the wall in quartered oak being upholstered in light green mohair with great high-backed President's and Assistant's chairs, tables, etc. Already a number of local organizations are using these fine apartments for executive assemblies and places of administration.

THE AUDITORIUM

with its soft salmon colored walls and cream toned stone facings, with its balcony, stage, dressing rooms and (joining) kitchenette — indispensable to the caterer of to-day, is planned with special regard to detail, so as to be adapted readily and equally to the requirements of a modern private theatre, banquet hall, and concert room for lectures, entertainments, school fetes, etc., and as a charming locale for future social functions of our people. The lighting and ventilation, the latter supplied by four huge fan lights, enclosed in the ceiling, have been the subject of much favorable comment from visitors, as well as the exceptionally good acoustic properties.

LADY CHAPEL

IN THE beautiful Lady Chapel, congregations and sodalities of the parish declare that they find the ideal place for their devotional exercises and meetings. In a large city parish, the possession of such an annex to the church, where services may be duplicated or religious functions, totally diverse in their nature, may be conducted at the one time without interference or postponement, is invaluable. The unique design of the natural limestone altar, the peculiar tablet form of the Stations, with their brief, significant inscriptions, the buff and grey walls produce an ensemble that grows more and more attractive as one becomes accustomed to the chaste and strict lines that mark this part of the Hall.

The Chapel has been munificently endowed by parishioners of St. Patrick's. As a memorial to the late Chas. F. Smith, Jr., his mother has donated the Altar. From Prof. J.-A. Fowler comes the superb electric organ. J. Ambrose O'Brien presented the handsome baptismal font and equipment and the pews are the gift of Mrs. J.-G. Kennedy. A beautiful marble statue of Our Lady that is being made in the studio of Jos. Sibbille, of New-York, will represent "The Madonna of the Smile" well known to readers of the life of the Saintly Carmelite Nun, Sister Teresa, The little flower of Jesus. Of exceptional interest to the Priests visiting at the Congress is the large Sacristy on the ground floor. Its length is the whole breadth of the building, and all the appointments, made of oak; viz the double Vestment Cabinet, the Presses for linens, sacred vessels, altar decorations, etc., have been built heavy and with an eye to the existent proportions of the room. Here too are the Baptistry, vault, and confessional for the deaf. In the equipment of the sacristy specially, the architect's fondness for the cube design, is in evidence. Indeed this style so well suited to an edifice of this kind, has been carried in detail through the whole building and predominates in every accessory. Adjoining is another room almost as large, with cabinets, lockers, lavatories, etc., destined completely for the use of the Altar Boys. At the extreme end is the room of the Sisters in charge of the Sacristy, and one floor above is the Practice Room for St. Patrick's various choirs.
