MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS.

COURT HOUSE, TRURO, N. S.

JANUARY 10TH, 1882.

Council met at 10 A. M. The Warden in the chair.
The Clerk called the roll.

Warden Tupper briefly addressed the Council on the subjects likely to be considered at the present meeting, and referred to the necessity at no distant day of a new Court House and County offices.

On motion of Councillor Chisholm, seconded by Councillors Millar and McKay, it was unanimously *resolved* that Hugh MacKenzie be re-elected Clerk for another year.

On motion of Councillor Hamilton, seconded by Councillor Ross, it was unanimously resolved that John F. Crowe be re-elected Treasurer for another year.

It was moved and seconded and *resolved* that the Clerk and Treasurer give security for the faithful discharge of their duties in the same amounts as last year.

On motion Messrs James D. Ross and Leonard G. Crowe were appointed Auditors for the current year. Mr. James D. Ross being present takes the oath of office.

On motion of Councillor Crowe, the following Councillors were appointed a committee to nominate standing committees: Councillors Millar, Crowe, Chisholm, Pitblado, McKenzie, D. Nelson and Clarke.

Report of Committee on petition for a new road in Clifton is read, and on motion of Councillor Crowe is received and confirmed.

Report of W. D. Corbett, Committee, on petition of John F. Marsh for a pent road is read.

Councillor Millar moved, seconded by Councillor Fulton, that the consideration of the report be deferred for three months. Motion passed.

The petition of Finlay McKenzie and others for a committee to lay out a new road in Tatamagouche is read. On motion the petition is referred to the Committee on roads and bridges.

Reports of Committees on petitions of William Lee and Colin Grant are read but no action is taken thereon on account of irregularities in the proceedings.

Petition of S. W. H. Durning and others, for a committee to lay out a road at Economy Point, is read and on motion the prayer of the petition is granted.—Samuel McLaughlin and Isaac Reid to be the committee.

The report of Richard C. Archibald, Supervisor of roads is read, and on motion is referred to the Committee on roads and bridges.

The Petition of James McKay asking to have certain taxes paid by him, refunded, is read, and on motion is referred to the committee on Assessments.

The petition of James Ramsay asking to be refunded certain taxes paid twice for the same property, is read. On motion the prayer of the petition is granted.

The petition of County Collectors for relief from uncollectable assessments are ordered to be referred to the committee on Assessments.

On motion it was *resolved* that the committee appointed to nominate Standing Committees be empowered to add to their list a committee on account of Overseers of the Poor.

Some difficulty having arisen about the key of the Court House, it is ordered by the Council that the key be committed to the custody of the Sheriff, which was done forthwith.

The committee appointed to nominate Standing Committees, present their report, which on motion is received, and confirmed.

On motion it is resolved that the Warden, the Clerk, Councillor Millar, and Councillor Pitblado be appointed a committee for Law Amendments.

On motion resolved that Councillors McKenzie, Fulton and Hamilton be a committee to ascertain and report as to the cost of publishing the proceedings of Council, either in Pamphlet form or in the Local Papers.

The Petition of certain ratepayers of the Poor District of Tatamagouche asking for a division of said district into two Poor districts, is read; also the order of Council passed last May in reference to said petition and the notice in pursuance of said order; also the petition of Samuel Waugh and others against such division; also the petition of Rob rt Cunningham and others in favor of such division.

Moved by Councillor Clarke, seconded by Councillor——— that an order be made dividing the Polling District of Tatamagouche into two Poor Districts as petitioned for.

Moved in amendment by Councillor Millar, seconded by Councillor J. N. Crowe that no such order be made. Amendment lost 6 to 9, original motion carried 9 to 6. Councillor Millar called for the names on the division on his amendments which results as follows:

FOR, Councillor Crowe, Hamilton, D. Nelson, Millar, T. J. G. Nelson, Flemming and McKenzie.

AGAINST, Councillor Guild, Dickie, Logan, Pitblado, McKay, Ross, Clarke, Chisholm, Blaikie, Morrison and Fulton.

On motion it was resolved that the two Poor Districts, formed as above be called respectively "East Tatamagouche," and "West Tatamagouche." The division of the present liability of the district divided between the two divisions is left to the Councillors for the Polling District.

The Report of Gilbert Sutherland, Supervisor of roads is read and on motion is referred to the committee on roads and bridges.

Report of commissioners of school lands in Onslow is read and on motion received and confirmed.

Report of John McKay, Tailor, on petition for alteration of a road in Earlton is read; also the Petition of Alex. M. Bailie and others, and the petition of Hugh Munro and others, Trustees of Knox Church Earlton against the confirmation of the Report.

E. F. Munro, Esq., is heard in support of the Report, moved by Councillor Ross, seconded by Councillor Millar that the report bereceivedand confirmed, motion passed unanimously.

The petition of J. M. Blaikie and others asking for a committee to lay out a new road in Londonderry, is read, and on motion is referred to the committee on roads and bridges.

Petition of Kenneth Sutherland and others for alteration in a road in Earltown is read, and on motion of Councillor Ross seconded by Councillor Clarke the prayer of the petition is granted, the petitioners paying all expenses. James McKay Esq., to be committee.

A letter is read from the Town Clerk of Truro asking for a proportion of the Government Road Grant and submitting certain accounts for opening up new streets in the Town of Truro. On motion the account and letter are referred to the Finance committee.

A letter from the Town Clerk of Truro is read asking for a time to be appointed for a committee of the Council to confer with a committee of the Town of Truro on matters which Town and County are mutually interested, and offering the use of the Town office for such meeting.

The petition of John S. Miller and others asking the Council for power to place Gates on a road in Salmon River is read, but afterwards withdrawn as it is doubtful whether or not the Council have power to grant the prayer of the petition.

On motion Council adjourned.

COURT HOUSE, TRURO, N. S.
JANUARY 11TH, 1882.

Council met at the usual hour, the Warden in the chair. The roll of Councillors is called.

Minutes of the last meeting are read and approved.

The Warden refers to a question that has arisen as to the liability of School Teachers for assessment for last year. After some discussion in which several Councillors took part, the matter was referred to the committee on assessments.

The Return of the Ferryman between Maitland and Black Rock is read and the Clerk is ordered to sign the usual certificate that the service has been satisfactorily performed.

Report of Samuel Lindsay, Supervisor of roads is read, and on motion referred to the committee on roads and bridges.

Petition of Robert Maxwell and others asking for leave to erect Gates on a road in Londonderry is read, but no action is taken thereon.

The Petition of Adam McLeod and others for a committee to lay out a road in Upper Stewiacke is read, and on motion referred to the committee on roads and bridges.

The Petition of Francis Cox for a Pent road is read, and on motion the prayer of the petition is granted. Wm. Ousley committee.

Petition of Robert Stevenson and others for a committee to lay out a new road at Waugh's River is read, and prayer thereof granted. Thomas Waugh, Miller, to be the committee.

The Petition of James Sutherland for a Pent road is read but no action was taken thereon.

Petition of Kenneth Baillie and others asking for an order to close an old road and have a new road laid out is read. On motion of Councillor Ross seconded by Councillor Millar it was resolved that the Council make an order closing said old road.

Report of John Taylor Supervisor of roads is read and on motion referred to the committee on roads and bridges.

Report of committee appointed to enquire into the cost of furnishing the proceedings of Council is read and on motion received and adopted.

Petition of Daniel M. Bentley and others for a committee to lay out a new road in Upper Stewiacke is read, on motion of Councillor Logan seconded by Councillor D. Nelson the prayer of the petition is granted. James S. Tupper and William Doyard to be the committee.

The Petition of George Lynds and others asking for a committee to lay out a new road in North River District is read. On motion the prayer of the petition is granted, the petitioners to pay all expenses except those of survey. John Blair was appointed committee.

Petition of W. C. Silliphant asking to be refunded certain taxes is read and on motion is referred to the committee on assessments.

On motion a number of petitions asking for permission to perform Statute Labour on private roads are referred to the committee on roads and bridges.

The petition of J. and C. P. Blanchard asking to be refunded certain county rates overpaid is read, and on motion referred to the committee on assessments.

The Petition of James Boomer is read, no action taken thereon.

The Petition of John Clarke and others of Tatamagouche asking that no change be made in the regulations respecting cattle going at large is read, and on motion is ordered to lie on the table.

The Petition of John B. Fulton and others asking for division of road districts, Lower Londonderry, is read, also Councilor Fulton's recommendation thereon, and on motion the prayer of the petition is granted.

A letter from George Reading Esq., asking for remuneration for services attending the sittings of the County Court as Clerk of said Court, is read, on motion the letter is referred to the Joint committee of the County and Town of Truro.

A number of County Officers were then appointed. These appear in the list.

On motion of Councillor Millar it is *resolved* that all the orders and County regulations published last year be as far as applicable, continued in force for the current year.

The Warden read a letter from the Commissioners of Public Charities, asking for payment of old account claimed by the Hospital for the Insane.

Council adjourned.

COURT HOUSE, TRURO, N. S.

JANUARY 12TH, 1882.

Council met at 10 A. M., pursuant to adjournment. The Warden in the chair. The roll of Councillors is called.

The minutes of the previous meeting are read and approved. Report of S. G. A. Morrison, committee on petition of S. H. Smith and others is read, and ordered to lie on the table. Report of the committee on account of overseers of the Poor is read.

Moved by Councillor Flemming, seconded by Councillor Morrison, that the sum to be assessed on Upper Londonderry Poor District be \$300.00 instead of \$350.00, as recommended by the committee. Passed.

Moved by Councillor Fulton, seconded by Councillor Blaikie, that \$600 be assessed on Lower Londonderry Poor District instead of \$700 as recommended by the committee. Passed.

A discussion arises on the recommendation contained in the report to establish a Poor House or Farm for the support of the poor of the whole county. This proposal was strenuously opposed by Councillor Ross and others. Councillors McKay and George Nelson signed a minority report against this recommendation.

On motion of Councillor Morrison seconded by Councillor McKenzie the report is adopted as amended excepting recommendation to establish Poor House or Farm.

The Petition of Mrs. Margaret Wood asking to be allowed a portion of the property of James P. Wood is read, and on motion is referred to the Joint Committee of the county and of the Town of Truro.

Petition of William Johnson and others asking for a committee to lay out a new road in Upper Stewiacke is read, and on motion of Councillor Logan the prayer of the petition is granted. James S. Tupper committee.

Petition of H. G. Crockett and others for a Pent Road is read, on motion the prayer of the petition is granted, the petitioners paying all expenses. James S. Tupper was appointed committee.

The Petition of James Gass and others asking that a lamp be placed on Shubenacadie Bridge is read, and on motion is referred to a committee consisting of Councillors Pitblado, Hamilton and the Warden.

Petition of Dempsey Borden asking for additional compensation for attending to Court House is read, and on motion is referred to Joint Committee of Town and County.

The Petition of Mrs. Susan Sibley asking to be relieved of the support of her son in the Hospital for the Insane is read, and on motion is referred to the committee last named.

Petition of Alvin Newton and others asking for a committee to lay out a new road is read, on motion the prayer of the petition is granted. Samuel McLaughlin to be the committee.

Petition of John Urquhart and others asking the Council to pass a regulation forbidding cattle to go at large in the District of Waugh's River is read. On motion the consideration of this petition is deferred until May meeting.

Petition of Timothy Barnhill asking for payment for

fencing on road in Lower Onslow is read, and on motion the prayer of the petition is granted.

Report of William McKim Subpendary Magistrate for Great Village is read, and on motion is received and confirmed.

Report of Commissioners on Exhibition Grounds and buildings is read, and on motion is received and adopted.

The present commissioners were re-appointed, viz : W. M. Blair M. P., Geo. A. Layton, C. B. Archibald, Robert Putnam and C. P. Blanchard.

On motion Council adjourned until 2 P. M. to-morrow, to give committees an opportunity to get forward with their work.

COURT HOUSE, TRURO, N. S.

JANUARY 13TH, 1882.

Council met at 2 P. M. Roll of Councillors called. Minutes of previous meeting are read and approved.

J. F. Crowe, Esq. presents his Bond as County Treasurer which is approved.

Petition of Eben Beattie and others asking for a committee to lay out a new road at Acadian Mines, is read, on motion the prayer of the petition is granted. Thomas Wilson (Nictaux) to be the committee.

Petition of Alex. Hutton and others for a committee to lay out a new road in Economy is read, on motion the prayer of the petition is granted. Samuel McLaughlin Committee.

Petition of Alex. Higgins and others for a committee to lay out a new road at Acadian Mines is read, on motion the prayer of the petition is granted. Robert Forman Esq., committee.

Report of Councillor Crowe recommending alteration in road Districts in Clifton is read and on motion confirmed.

Report of committee on Roads and Bridges is read, and on motion is received and confirmed.

Agreement of Councillors Millar and Clarke on division of liabilities for Poor of Tatamagouche between the two new subdivisions of East and west Tatamagouche is read, and on motion confirmed.

Petition of Finlay McKenzie and others, recommended by

* Road and Bridge committee is granted. Gilbert Sutherland committee.

Petition of Adam McLeod and others, recommended by committee on roads and bridges is granted. James S. Tupper committee.

Report of Committee on Assessments is read and on motion is received and confirmed.

Moved by Councillor Fulton and seconded that A. S. Collins, collector for Lower Londonderry, be relieved of the sum of \$18.31 part of the assessment for 1879 claimed to be uncollectable. Moved and seconded in amendment that the matter be deferred for three months. Amendment carried.

Moved by Councillor Pitblado and seconded by Councillor Dickie and passed unanimously that the following names be added to the list of County Constables, viz: George J. McLeod, and Lucius B. Crowe.

On motion of Councillor Millar seconded by Councillor Fulton it is resolved that the Clerk be empowered to take out Administration of the estate of W. P. Nelson who died in the Hospital for the Insane, and claim from his estate the full amount due the Municipality.

Councillor Fulton gives notice of motion to rescind the vote on the Petition of A. S. Collins.

W. M. Blair, M. P. P., and Israel Longworth Esq., a delegation from the Exhibition committee to ask for a grant from the County Funds towards improving the Exhibition Grounds and Buildings preparatory to holding a Provincial exhibition next fall, address the Council on the subject.

Moved by Councillor Guild seconded by Councillor T. J. G. Nelson, that the sum of four hundred dollars be assessed on the county for the purpose of repairing the Exhibition buildings and improving the grounds, provided the Town Council and the people of Truro within the Corporation contribute an equal amount.

Moved in amendment by Councillor Millar seconded by Councillor Clarke that the sum of four hundred dollars be assessed by the Finance Committee for the purpose of keeping in repair the County Exhibition Grounds and Buildings. Councillor T. J. G. Nelson expresses the opinion that the great majority of ratepayers of the county receive no benefit from these Exhibitions; the benefit is almost wholly to the town and citizens of Truro. He thinks the Town of Truro should do at least as much as the County. A number of Councillors

express similar views. After some discussion the amendment is withdrawn and the resolution passed on the following vote:

FOR.—Councillors Clarke, Guild, Pitblado, McKay, Blaikie, T. J. G. Nelson, Ross, Millar, Flemming and Fulton,—10.

AGAINST.—Councillors Hamilton, Dickie, D. Nelson, Chisholm, Morrison, McKenzie and Adams,—7.

On motion of Councillor Millar it is ordered that the sum of twenty dollars be assessed on the County for bushing ice in Tatamagouche.

Council adjourned to meet to-morrow morning at 9 A.M.

COURT HOUSE, TRURO, N. S.

JANUARY 14TH, 1882.

Council met at 9 A.M. pursuant to adjournment. The Warden in the chair. Roll of Councillors called. Minutes of previous meeting are read and approved.

In pursuance of notice given yesterday, Councillor Fulton moved, seconded by Councillor Morrison that A. S. Collins, County Collector for 1879 be relieved of the sum of \$18.81.— Passed.

Councillor Chisholm gives notice of motion to re-consider vote taken yesterday to grant \$400 for improvement of Exhibition Grounds and Buildings.

Moved by Councillor Chisholm, seconded by Councillor Morrison that said vote be re-considered.—Passed.

Report of committee on petition for placing Lamps on Shubenacadie Bridge is read, and on motion is received and confirmed.

Moved by Councillor Pitblado, seconded by Councillor Millar that the resolution passed yesterday in reference to Grant for Exhibition Grounds and Buildings be amended by substituting the word "Three" for the word "Four" in said resolution.—Passed, 10 to 5.

Report of committee on Public Buildings is read, and on motion received and confirmed.

Report of Joint Committee of Town of Truro and County on matters referred to them, is read, and on motion is received and confirmed.

On motion *resolved* "that the Clerk be instructed to put up Notices in two or more places in each Polling District in which there are delinquents as to the sending in of Road Returns notifying Overseers of Highways that unless their returns are forwarded to him within thirty days from the date of said notice the law will be strictly enforced.

Report of Councillor Flemming recommending a new road section in Upper Stewiacke is received and confirmed.

Moved by Councillor Crowe seconded by Councillor Chisholm that Mr. Herbert Crowe be recommended as a suitable person to take administration of the Estate of William P. Nelson.—Passed.

A discussion arises on the advisability of obtaining amendments to the act appointing Supervisors of Road Districts, and the manner of expending the road monies.

Councillor Millar denounced the act in the most vigorous terms.

Councillor Pitblado spoke in favor of the principle of the act, but thought it might be simplified, and improved especially in reference to the difficulty in drawing the money. He denounced the expense of laying out the road monies in small commissions scattered all over the district. He thought the money should be concentrated so that where a road was once made it would last for years.

Councillor Guild contended that the roads were so extensive and all in such bad condition that it was absolutely necessary to expend the money all over the district in patching up the roads to make them passable.

Councillor Ross thought the Legislature had made a great mistake in passing such a law, and they would find it out next election. The Supervisors did not know half so much about road making as the Councillors. The road money was a mere trifle compared with the work required to be done. As a matter of fact the Supervisors did not superintend the work done on the roads at all—the Councillors for the district did that. The provision of the Act that all the work should be done by tender and contract was absurd. The old act was better, leaving that matter optional with the Commissioner.

The Warden who happened to be on the floor of the house at the time was asked his views of the matter.

He thought that the law might be amended in some respects, and he thought the Councillors were perhaps in a better position than any else to make suggestions as to what amendments were required. He thought it would have been better to

have left the incorporation act alone, at least for a few years. But it was an accomplished fact, and he did not think any Government would take such a retrograde step as the total repeal of the law would be considered. He thought it was generally admitted that the principle of the act was good, but it had made so sudden and radical a change.

Report of Warden Tupper recommending a new Road District in Upper Stewiacke is read and on motion is received and confirmed.

Report of Auditors is read and on motion received and adopted.

The Clerk presents his Bond which is approved.

On motion the list of Township officers prepared by the several Councillors for the various Districts are passed and all the officers therein named appointed.

On motion of Councillor Morrison it was *resolved* that \$40 be assessed on Great Village Police District for salary for Stipendiary Magistrate for the District.

On motion of Councillor Millar seconded by Councillor Fulton, it is *ordered* that the District Clerks and Treasurers appointed by the Council give Bonds for the faithful performance of their duties in a sum equal to the amount assessed for the support of the Poor for the several Districts.

On motion it is *ordered* that the several amounts due the Warden and Councillors for travel and attendance be paid by the County Treasurer on the warrant of the Clerk in the usual way.

Report of commissioners of School Lands in the old Township of Truro is read and on motion is received and adopted.

On motion *resolved* that the money in the hands of said School Commissioners be divided by Councillor Crowe, as follows: One-Third to the schools in Truro Town, and Two Thirds equally between the other schools in the old Township of Truro.

Report of Finance Committee is read, on motion resolved that the item of \$10.00 for W. C. Kennedy be not allowed.

Moved by Councillor Flemming, seconded by Councillor Ross that the item of \$20.00 for Finance committee be struck out. Motion passed on the following vote:

FOR.—Councillors Hamilton, Dickie, McKay, Ross, D. Nelson, G. W. Nelson, Chisholm, Flemming and Fulton,—9.

AGAINST.—Councillors Crowe, Millar, Clarke, T. J. G. Nelson, Blaikie, Morrison, McKenzie and Adams,—8.

On motion Report of Finance committee as amended is adopted.

Moved by Councillor Millar, seconded by Councillor McKenzie that the sum of thirty-four dollars, land damages for road in Tatamagouche referred back to the Council by the Finance committee be passed and paid out of the surplus assets of the County. - Passed.

On motion it is ordered that no accounts be paid until first July next except Jailer's Bill, Dempsey Borden's Bill, Printer's Bill, Municipal Clerk's Bill for postage and stationery, and Hospital for Insane, accounts as rendered.

On Motion of Councillor Millar, seconded by Councillor Chisholm, it was resolved that the warden be a committee to act in conjunction with the Town of Truro in Memorializing the Dominion Government to furnish better and safer means of crossing the Railway tracks from the town to the Exhibition Grounds, by means of an overhead Bridge or otherwise.

Minutes of the present meeting read and approved.

On motion the Council adjourned.

No Exhibition having been held during this year, the grounds have been let for pasture and the building occupied by a care-taker and insured for the sum of \$2000.

The following is the Financial Statement:

The sum of \$30.00 was reported last year due from lease of grounds for that year. Six dollars of this sum has been collected, leaving a balance of \$24.00 still due, and it is very doubtful if it can be collected.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE.

To the Worshipful the Municipal Council for Colchester: —

Your committee on Finance beg to report as follows:

The account rendered by Dr. Neil Sutherland, we refer back to the Council as we are not satisfied that it is a county charge.

We recommend that the account for damages claimed for a road in Tatamagouche, established in 1876, be referred to the Supervisor for the District to ascertain and report whether or not the road referred to has ever been actually opened up or used.

We duly considered the claims made against the County by the Town of Truro, and made an amicable settlement of the whole matter with the committee of the Town of Truro, the claim for \$246 was not pressed by the Town committee in view of the fact that \$125.81 of the amount claimed has already been placed to the credit of the Town and that the balance will be so placed as soon as collected.

With reference to the claim for \$379.50 for opening up new streets, we think the claim reasonable, and consented that \$80, now in the hands of W. M. Blair, Esq., M. P. P., being balance of road monies placed at his disposal previous to the incorporation of this Municipality be paid to the Town Council.

We also agreed to ask or allow the Government to allot the Town of Truro \$299.50 out of the Road Grants to this County for the present year. We may say that the amount mentioned is all that is claimed

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by the Town out of the Road Grants for the years 1880, 1881, and 1882.
