

DOCUMENTS TO BE CARRIED

by every male person who is not on active service in any of His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces, or in the Naval or Military Forces of any of His Majesty's Allies, and who apparently may be, or is reasonably suspected to be, within the description of Class One under the Military Service Act, 1917, who for any reason may have claimed that he is not within Class

One under the Act.

knowledge of the fact; or

If it be claimed that he is not within the Class by reason of marriage, a certificate, either official or signed by two reputable citisens residing in the community in which he lives and having knowledge of the facts, certifying to his marriage and that his wife is living; or without leave;

If it be claimed that he is not within the Class by reason of his nationality, a certificate of his nationality signed by a Consult of Yiee-Consult of the forsi State or Country to which he claims his allegiance is due; or a pagagort issued by the Government of that Country establishing his nationality; or ACTIVE SERVICE With chine that he is accented as a member of any of His Majerty's If it be claimed that he is excepted as a member of any of His Majesty's Foress or as having since the 4th August, 1914, served in the Military or Naval Foress of Great-Britain or her Allies in any theatre of actual war and has been konourably discharged therefrom, official documents or an official certifi-cate evidencing the fact; or

MOTICE is hereby given that, under the provisions of an Order in Council (P.C. 1013), of the 20th April, 1918, upon and after the 1st day of June, 1918, every male person who is not on active service in any of His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces, or in the Naval or Military Forces of His Majesty's Miles, and who apparently may be, or is reasonable supported to be, within the description of Class One under the Military Sorces of His Majesty's or on whose behalf, it is at any time affirmed, claimed or alleged shat he is not, the Military Sorce Act, 1917, as defined for the time being or that, although within the said Class, he is exempted from or net liable to military service; shall have with him upon his person at all times or in or upon any building or premises where he at any time is. . 0
