Th same shock may last for years instance that of Viege, in th Valias, which end ded from Jul 1824, to 1857. At Cabul thirty three severe shocks have bee felt in one day; at Honduras, i 1656, 108 were counted in week, and at Hawaii, in 186 2,000 shocks occured in on month. Hein, it may be said i conclusion, opposes the theor of a connection between earth quakes and v canic eruption and considers that of their coin cidence with atmospheric pher omena as better supported b facts; for they are occasionall preceded or accompanied b thick and widespread fogs a seasons when fogs are not fre quent, by sudden falls of th barometer and equally suddef changes of temperature. Their occurence, however, in the majority of cases coincides with normal meteorological condi tions. Earthquakes are more frequent after sunset than in daytime, in autumn and winter than in spring. The influence of the moon is insignificant.
