SMALLEST RAILWAY SYSTEM ON EARTH

The shortest complete railway system in New York, is the little pleasure line running along the boardwalk at Rockaway Beach. The entire system comprises about three hundred feet of track. Small as it is, the system is complete in every detail, as far as the rolling stock is concerned. There are at present two locomotives in active service and six day coaches. The employees comprise two engine drivers, one for each locomotive, and a ticket agent at each terminus. PICTURESQUE STREET IN CHINA.

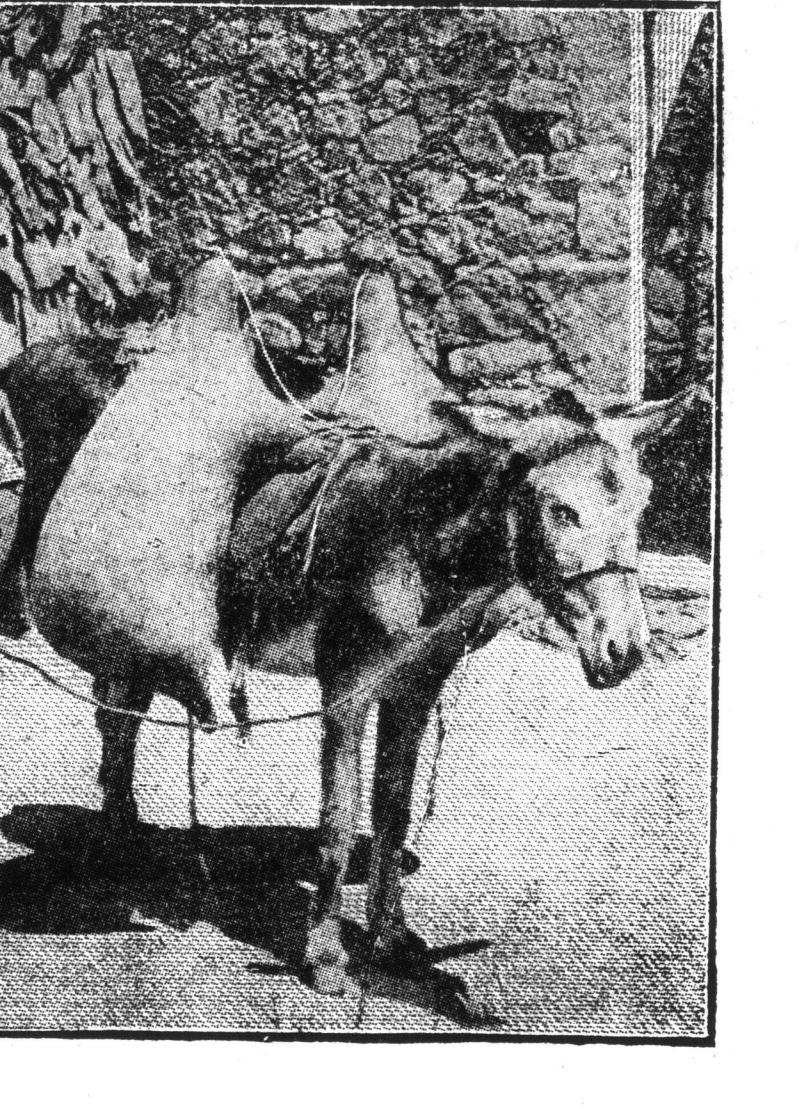


UNCOMMON SIGHT.
