



Queen Victoria and the Prince of Wales have sent a complete set of similar stones consisting of a tiars, necklace, bracelets and agraffe. The artist Angeli has completed full-length portraits of the bride and bridegroom. Photographs of the Princess and ther fiance have been sent to Queen Victoria.
