THE OLD STREET RAILWAY CO.

Judgment on the Arbitration Appeal. The motion to set aside the Award Dismissed With Costs.

Mr. Justice Robertson yesterday morning delivered judgment on the appeal by the old Street Railway Company against the award in the matter of the arbitration between the city and the company when the city took over the road.

Mr. C. Robinson, G.C., and Mr. Thomas Carroll, appeared for the city and Mr. G. Shepley, G.C., for the Railway Company.

His Lordship said that he had had a great deal of difficulty in arriving at his decision, and that it had required much labor and research. The delay in the delivery of the judgment, he said, was owing to his other official duties.

The motion to set aside the award was dismissed with costs. His Lordship said that he could not understand the company's claim on the street as a business.

Mr. Winchester yesterday made an order striking out the clause in the award relating to the Attorney-General against the Vaughan Road Company.

An application was made for interim alimony in the action of Foster v. Foster, but was refused. The plaintiff being a farmer.

Some days ago a motion was made before Chief Justice Galt on behalf of one Harwood for an order of mandamus of the district magistrate of the district of Nipissing, directing him to hear the objections taken by Harwood to the preliminary list of names published by the clerk on the 24th of October, and on the 19th of November following the applicant put a list of about 130 objections respecting names of persons on the list or wrongly omitted therefrom.

By 52 Vic. c. 22, it is provided that such objections may be made within 30 days of the posting of the preliminary list, but the applicant failed to do so until after the expiration of the time.

His Lordship yesterday delivered judgment. He thought that the applicant should have the objections and give him a chance to do so, but in default of his doing so, the mandamus as asked should be refused.
