EARLY PLANTING. Cannot be too strongly insisted upon, for manifest reasons. Early planted cane will ripen sooner, that is, before late planted, and will keep ahead all summer, and be ripe before the frost, while late planted does not get sufficient root before the scorching burning droughts of early summer will kill unfavorably in its growth.

At a meeting of the Southern Wisconsin Cane Growers and Manufacturer's Association, held at Palmira, Wis., Feb. 17 and 18, the following letter was read from C. F. MILLER, of Rice Co., Minn.: Mr. Chairman and Members of the Southern Wisconsin Cane Growers and Manufacturer's Association:

It is inadvisable to allow the small cane to become choked with the weeds, for when once overwhelmed with them, your labor is increased twenty fold to remove your cane, and then, it will never entirely recuperate. I would suggest summer following, as one of the best means of destroying the weeds. This is the best way in which to prepare land for planting cane, as it very thoroughly destroys the weeds, inasmuch that the labor of cultivating the coming crop will be very much lessened.
