

EMPEROR CHANGES TRATIGOS

The Chinese Dowager Has Appointed a Board of Administration to Relieve Her of Duties.

THE BOARD TO BE RESPONSIBLE.

A Move Which Will Make It Easier for Foreign Ministers to Do Business.

Washington, April 26.—The following telegram has been received at the State Department from Mr. Squier, the United States charge at Peking, dated today:

"The Empress Dowager has appointed a Board of National Administration to relieve her of her public functions. They are hereafter to be members of the Cabinet now with the Empress at Siang Fu, and Prince Ching, Viceroy Li and Prince Kung, who are now in Peking."

This news is regarded as of importance, indicating, as it does, the relinquishment by the Empress Dowager of the actual powers she heretofore has exercised. It is also apparent that she has placed herself in a position to avoid direct responsibility to the foreigners for whatever may happen in the future, the board will have to bear the brunt of any complaint. It is felt that the appointment of this board will make it much easier for the foreign ministers to transact business with the Chinese government.

Chinese Troops Reappear.

Peking, April 26.—The Chinese regulars who retired beyond the Great Wall have reappeared at another point within the international area. Strong reports have been received in regard to the necessity for their immediate retirement from the border. It is said to have been ordered to renew the result of the Imperial edicts.

Peking as soon as possible in order to pacify the people, who are being eagerly watched for their Emperor's return. The rumor is certain that he can return as far as Ka Fung Fu, where he can better examine the conditions and arrange for his return, eventually. But, he adds, an early date for his Majesty's return should be announced immediately.

A Hostile Movement.

Peking, April 26.—The Chinese are wondering if the Imperial Commission appointed by an edict issued April 22 to enquire into the question of reform really means the relinquishing of absolute power by the court, or whether it is merely the formation of a Privy Council.

Notices in Chinese were placed during the night, calling on patriotic Chinese to rise May 15 and expel all foreigners. Yang Lu Ting, the cousin of Chi Li, President, has denounced the threat to return.

Krupp Guns in Good Condition.

The 10 Krupp guns and 67 cars of ammunition captured by the British near Hai Kowang are in good condition. An Indian native officer who made the capture was offered two cars of silver if he would not make the guns and say nothing about them.

Great Britain's Plan Ured.

London, April 26.—A representative of the Associated Press learns from a source not reliable that the British government is not relaxing its efforts to induce the powers to decrease their pecuniary demands on a treaty, which would give a portion of their claims commercial agreement. The latest advice from British Minister Sater at Peking do not indicate any degree of success so far, owing, it is said, to opposition on the part of Germany, which continues to insist on the payment of the full of the large indemnity claims. Mr. Baskin, the American special commissioner at Peking, and Sir Ernest Sartorius are said to be working on identical lines.

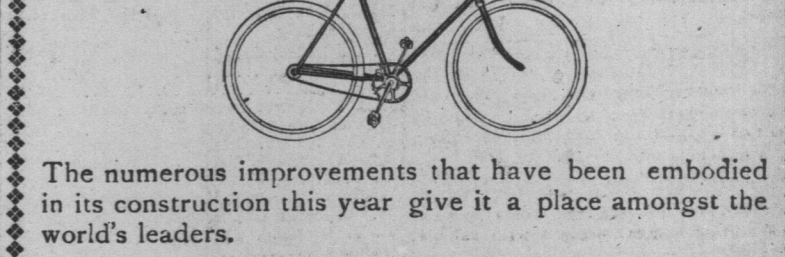

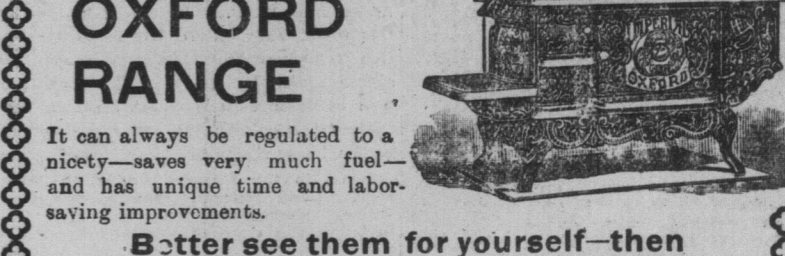

AMERICAN ANSWERS TWAIN.

Missionary to China Denies That He Sought Looting-Gives Details of the Incident.

San Francisco, April 26.—Rev. W. S. Amment of the American Board of Foreign Missions of the Congregational Church, whose collection of indemnity for damages done by Boxers in China has caused considerable discussion, takes vigorous exception to the criticisms made by Mark Twain and others as to the alleged misconduct of the missionaries.

"We found ourselves at the close of the siege with 500 native Christians upon our hands, no food, no clothing, no money, and every Christian home burned."

"On the very day of the arrival of the allied forces we were informed that the British army had immediately thought of a Mongol Prince, Hsi Ling, who was an ally of the Boxers and whose place was to be headquarter of Chinese armies."

"We found the Prince's place empty, and the next day he brought our native Christians and occupied the deserted place. In that house and its neighborhood the British soldiers were selling off their goods for a few cents."

"I considered that that was a fair, honest speculation, which injured nobody and that benefited many people."

"There may have been some looted goods taken, but it was without my knowledge. The British and Sikh soldiers were selling off their goods for a few cents, but my people did not do the looting."

BIGGEST ON EARTH.

Negotiations Going on to Form the Largest Beet Sugar Factory Ever Seen.

Chicago, April 26.—The Tribune says: Negotiations have been completed in relation to the formation of the largest beet sugar concern in the world.

The company has been organized with a capital stock of \$1,000,000, to be located in the Arkansas Valley Sugar Beet and Irrigation Land Company.

The plant of the new company is to be located in the Arkansas Valley, in the famous Rocky Ford fruit district.

A number of New York capitalists, including the Oxnards, the Gullies, the Hamiltons, the Lawsons, and Guy Richards of the Mercantile Trust Company, are interested.

Navigation has opened on the St. Lawrence River, the R. & O. N. steamer Carline having left Montreal for Quebec on Thursday. She returned to Montreal yesterday. The steamer Quebec also cleared from Montreal yesterday and will make the return trip to Quebec today. The first steamer for the Saguenay will leave today.

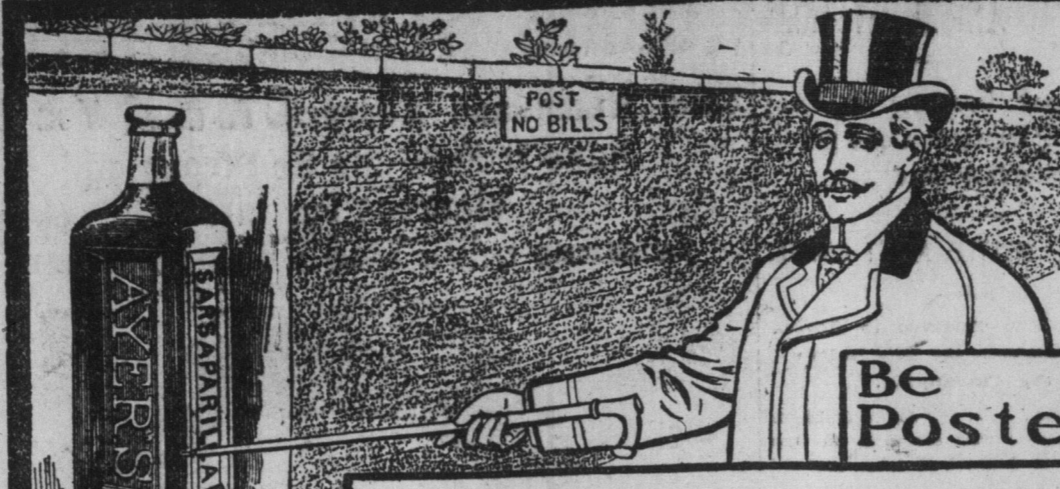
The St. Joseph came in yesterday from Oswego with 600 tons of coal for Dickson & Eddy.

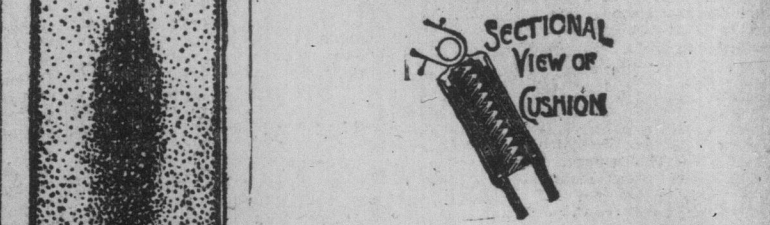

A VERY OLD VETERAN DEAD!

Captain John Davis Was Nearly One Hundred Years of Age—Three Candidates.

Capt. John Davis died on Thursday night at the home of his daughter, Mrs. William Kirkendale, 309 Bathurst-street, Toronto. He was born in Western Ontario, June 23, 1803, and until the past few months he had always been hale and hearty and the possessor of a wonderful memory.

When the war of 1812 broke out he fled with his father, a D.R. Loyalist, near Simcoe, in Norfolk County. He soon afterwards moved to Barton, which was then a wilderness. When the rebellion of 1837 broke out he was a volunteer under the command of Capt. Servos. He saw the burning Caroline boat down the Niagara Rapids, and was one of the two aides-de-camp who escorted Sir Francis Bond Head from Chippewa to Niagara on his way to Toronto.

On his return he was entrusted with despatches to Sir Allan McNab, then commander-in-chief. In the Fenian raid of 1866 he was one of the first to enroll in the home guard. Capt. Davis leaves three daughters, Mrs. Kirkendale, and Mrs. John Irving, 87 St. Patrick-st., Toronto, and Mrs. J. W. Davis, Devonport, Iowa, and one son, Mr. T. W. Davis of this city. The funeral will take place at Mount Pleasant Cemetery to-day.
