

SUBSIDY OR NO SUBSIDY THAT WAS THE QUESTION

House Bused With Railway Votes—Mr. Brock and Sir William Clash.

Ottawa, Oct. 19.—(Special.)—The railway subsidy resolutions were taken in committee in the afternoon, and the mileage subsidy on the Ottawa Northern, and Western for completing the Hull connection was reduced from four miles to one and one-quarter miles.

Some question having been raised as to the reason for delay in completing the railway into the Icelandic settlement of Gimli, Manitoba, Mr. McCrea of Selkirk explained that the subsidy was largely due to scarcity of labor in the west. Owing to this cause the Canadian Northern had not been able to complete this year more than 100 miles, instead of 400 miles intended to be built.

What of the G.T.P.? W. F. Maclean observed that if labor was so scarce as Mr. McCrea intimated there was no chance of getting the National Transcontinental Railway thru in 20 years. He suggested that the government take some steps in order to assure the carrying out of their promise to have the railway completed in five years.

Mr. Emmerson reminded the committee as to this Gimli branch which was to be built by the C.P.R. He said that a director of that company had said in the House that he was opposed to granting railway subsidies. He supposed the director was voicing the views of the company in this respect.

Mr. Richardson of South Grey offered a general protest to the policy of subsidizing railways in the old provinces. Something like six millions of dollars had been devoted for 1500 miles, and now the government had resolutions for 4000 miles of new lines, for which subsidies amounting to from sixteen to twenty millions of dollars were voted.

Mr. Brock said that while objecting to subsidies to exploitation railways, he was in favor of the railway under consideration, having had sufficient confidence in it to put a large sum of his own money in the enterprise, altho he didn't expect to get much out of it.

In part he said: Mr. Chamberlain in his first speech appeared to us that a great issue like this should be fought without heat and prejudice, and by the weapons of arguments and the temper of honest controversy.

Mr. Chamberlain says and says truly, that the colonies ought not to be treated as an appendix to Great Britain. I agree.

After all, we must put in a word now and again for poor little England. (Laughter.)

Mr. Chamberlain's second proposal is still more significant. He says the colonies are to be asked to agree not to start any industrial competition with ours.

When I am asked to accept an act upon which a shadow of proof or even a sliver of evidence, for my own part I believe it to be a calamity on the colonies and a slur on the empire.

Now, it is clear that Mr. Chamberlain's case that our trade with our colonies is growing faster, than with the rest of the world.

Mr. Chamberlain's proposals, that the colonies will be asked to accept a duty of three-fourths of the tariff on the duty on the sugar duties to be taken off.

Let me just make two or three observations on this. In the first place, the object being to make the empire self-supporting, it appears to me, at any rate, that it is not fair to burden a colony with a duty of 7 per cent. on corn and 5 per cent. on meat.

With the present sources of supply, so small a duty of 20 per cent. would cause foreign countries, such as Argentina and others, to divert their supplies to this market.
