

How Gen. Oku Won Battle of Teissu Just as He Did Battle of Nanshan

Carried First the Enemy's Right and Then His Left—In Face of a Heavy Artillery Fire Japs Climbed the Hills and Mastered the Situation.

Tokio, June 18.—(3 p.m.)—Gen. Oku, the victor of the battle of Nanshan Hill, on May 26, fought and won the battle of Teissu (Vafangou), according to the Russian designation, on June 15th.

There is a strong similarity between the two fights. At Teissu the Japanese had to drive the Russians from two hills at Nanshan the enemy occupied one hill. The Russian position at Teissu was superior to that of the Japanese and equalized the advantage of the Japanese in having a larger force.

THE RELIGION OF JAPAN.

About fifteen years ago, the mikado was seriously considering the question of "Christianizing" Japan by imperial edict, and the project seems now to have been revived in another form. The Japanese would probably obey the edict loyally, but such a change would be only in name. The Boston Watchman, a Baptist paper, says that there is no spiritual element in the movement. It does not indicate the adoption of the Christian life, nor even an intellectual acceptance of the truths of Christianity. There would be merely a formal adoption of the name, so that Japan would rank with Great Britain and the United States as a Christian nation.

"CREEDLESS" LICENSES.

The bill will be passed, and "the trade" in Britain placed on a legalized footing never before enjoyed, while the process of reducing the number of licenses will, at least in the immediate future, be a slow and difficult one. The value of licenses has already risen materially, and the trade is jubilant. THE TRENCH CANAL.

The Port Hope Canal Association has issued a circular pointing out the advantages of that town as an outlet for the Trent Valley canal. It is pointed out that a ravine extends all the way from Rice Lake to Port Hope, making the Ontario River and Port Hope 12 miles, while the distance to Trent is 58 miles, 19 miles being canalage and 22 miles improved river navigation. These are the figures given in the circular, in which it is also stated that the canal to Port Hope could be easily enlarged, if necessary, to 14 feet, there being little or no rock, while the Trent route would involve a great deal of rock cutting. It is claimed also that Port Hope has much the better harbor.

EAST TORONTO L.O.L. AT CHURCH.

Rev. E. C. Laker Preaches Inspiring Sermon to 300 Members.
Rev. E. C. Laker, chaplain of East Toronto district L.O.L., preached to 300 members in Gerard-street Methodist Church yesterday morning, making as his text the words, "Therefore brethren stand fast and hold the traditions which ye have been taught." BRITISH POLITICAL DEVELOPMENTS.

Notwithstanding the flourish of trumpets with which the Liberal party in Britain entered upon their parliamentary campaign and the openly expressed belief that the walls of the government citadel were on the eve of collapse, it is not pleasant enough to see the Liberal party in the present or under-estimated that of their opponents. Probably both entered into the miscalculation and they altogether failed to allow for possible tactical errors of their own. These have rather few normal and one by one their best laid mines have fizzled out in ineffectual and even humiliating failure. To all appearance when the session opened there were many promising prospects where the government was laid in wait to attack, and the ranks of its supporters were seamed with divisions which threatened before long to bring the party to grief. But the opposition leaders fought in vain against the ingenious devices of the premier, who displayed a quite marvelous power for evading gages of battle which did not happen to suit his book. Try as he liked Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman could not succeed in forcing a general engagement on his own terms, and had to content himself with ponderous sarcasms on the want of courage shown by the premier in not meeting him on his own ground.

Continued From Page 1. far on one occasion as to compare the report to the secret report on Canadian defence. With that report my report has no analogy.

When I presented my report for 1903, Sir Frederick Borden told me that certain portions were too strong and might embarrass him. I modified it, and again sent it to him. WITHOUT FURTHER REFERENCE TO ME HE STRUCK OUT WHOLE PAGES AND SEPARATE PARAGRAPHS, ALL OF WHICH I HAD INTENDED SHOULD BE MADE PUBLIC.

Having dealt with matters appertaining to my administrative duties, I desire here to place on record the fact that in my opinion no scheme of general defence for the militia by way of sympathy with its improvement, I will instance here the educational scheme for the promotion of officers and non-commissioned officers. One has but to turn to the pages in the militia list to see the vast number of officers who are professionally unqualified.

There being no central camp this year, I applied on May 23 to be permitted to hold this September two short paid camps, and instructed by staff orders for a limited number of staff officers. This I hoped would in some slight measure compensate for the lack of instruction in the permanent corps.


