HELD IN ZION CHURCH, WINNIPEG, COMMENCING JUNE 3RD, 1898.

### SUPERANNUATION FUND.

*Report of the Board of the Superannuation Fund for the Year ending  
July 31st, 1897.*

To provide against an increase of indebtedness ten per cent. has been deducted from all the annuities.

The estimated receipts, carefully made at the beginning of the year, have fallen below the actual expenditure, \$3,373. The falling-off in receipts, as compared with the estimates, is largely due to the payment of a less amount from certain Circuits, the Book-Room, and the Missionary Society than was anticipated.

The returns show that the Circuits and ministers generally are loyally sustaining the Fund.

The arrearages during the last two years, amounting to over \$5,000, are chargeable principally to probationers.

The Board would remind Chairmen of Districts that probationers are under obligation to pay their subscriptions to the Fund annually, according to the years travelled, without regard to the credit given them in their studies.

The Permanent Fund has been increased during the year, \$8,230.

Your Committee would further recommend that the balance of the debt to the Book-Room should be met next year; and that in order to do this the circuits be asked to contribute as this year an apportionment of 1 per cent. on the basis of the Superannuation Fund assessment to this Fund.

That the Treasurer of the Fund be authorized to compute the amount required, and notify the Chairmen of Districts in time for the Financial District Meeting.

That the Rev. A. Andrews be reappointed Treasurer of this Fund.

That Rev. H. Wigle and A. Graham be appointed to audit the Treasurer's books.

That 300 copies of the Minutes be ordered, and that the charge for the same to ministers be 50 cents per copy.

Bennett; and the bronze medal, Miss K. J. Crawford; the Governor-General's bronze medal, which is considered the chiefest among the medals, D. L. Bastedo.

1. We are pleased to note in contrast with the decrease reported during the past two years in the number learning catechism an increase of 512, and your Committee would strongly urge that an earnest effort be made to introduce our new catechism into all our schools, where such has not been done.

2. Inasmuch as in certain districts the frequent holding of Sunday School conventions and institutes has interfered with the regular work, we recommend that a more equal distribution of the appointment of such meetings be made.

3. We notice a decrease of 649 in the number who have taken the total abstinence pledge. This may be due to some irregularity in the manner of reporting, but we would recommend that the temperance question be brought more prominently before our schools, and that pastors make special efforts to address the children on this subject.

4. In view of the fact that in our towns and cities Sunday Schools have been greatly interrupted by processions during the hour of service, we recommend that our people use their influence in discouraging such processions.

5. We have noticed with pleasure a marked increase in the Home Department, and commend this branch of Sunday School work to the heartiest sympathy and support of our people.

6. We recommend that this report be read in our schools.

BOARD OF EXAMINERS, 1898.

1. That inasmuch as the necessities of the work appear to demand that certain non-matriculants be received on trial at this Conference, we recommend Bro. R. A. Swyers for reception.

2. The following regulations are recommended for the year 1898-1899:

(a) Examiners shall forward to the Secretary of the Board not later than February 15th, manuscript questions on the subjects allotted to them, which may be printed under the supervision of the Secretary, and by him forwarded to the Chairmen of the Districts by the 1st of April.

(b) The examinations shall be conducted in each district where there are candidates, under the supervision of the Chairman of the District, and shall be held on April 18th, 19th, 20th, 21st.

(c) Time shall be considered an element in the examinations, and in all cases shall be strictly adhered to. Each examiner shall specify the time allowed for writing the paper set by him. Each paper shall be valued at one hundred marks.

(d) A time-table shall be prepared and the examination conducted according thereto, and each probationer must complete the course of any one year before presenting himself for examination upon the subjects of the following year.

(e) Subjects which are set for one year and which are reviewed on a subsequent year's course, cannot, under any circumstances, be taken at one year's examination.

(f) Certificates issued by any Board of Examiners of the Methodist Church subsequent to 1894 will be accepted by this Board.

3. Candidates who purpose writing upon the preliminary course shall notify the Chairman of the District upon which they reside not later than February 15th, and shall specify the subjects upon which they desire an examination, and this information shall be immediately forwarded to the Secretary of the Board.

## REPORT OF THE TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

1. With reference to the memorial from the Calgary District, bearing on the question of social purity. After the consideration of information furnished regarding certain vices practised in open violation of the law in the Territories, your Committee recommends the Conference to appoint a committee consisting of the President and Secretary of Conference, Rev. Prof. Stewart and Mr. Thomas Nixon, to collect evidence and to communicate with the Minister of the Interior, with the object of securing the enforcement of the laws relating to such vices, and that the following be a copy of the letter to be sent to the Department of the Interior, viz.: "To the Hon. Clifford Sifton, Minister of the Interior, Ottawa,—In view of the enclosed facts and testimony concerning the prevalence of prostitution and the illegal sale of intoxicating liquors in the Territories, the Manitoba and North-West Conference of the Methodist Church, now assembled in Winnipeg, respectfully request and urge the issuance of such orders from your department as will insure the enforcement by the Mounted Police and the other government officials of all laws bearing upon these questions."

2. *Re* the memorial from the Calgary District, asking that a temperance evangelist be appointed for the Territories to assist in the plebiscite campaign, your Committee recommends that no action be taken.

3. *Re* the resolution of Revs. J. A. McClung and J. M. A. Spence, asking the Conference to memorialize the General Conference, that the note appended to the general rules be amended by inserting after the word beverage, "or signing a petition for the sale of such," your Committee recommends that such action be taken.

4. *Re* communication from the Secretary of the Dominion Alliance, asking that this Conference appoint four persons to attend their convention to be held in the city of Toronto on July 6th, your Committee recommends that the President nominate and the Conference elect the same.

5. Whereas, the Dominion Government did give to the North-West Territories during the building of the Canadian Pacific Railway and the construction of other public works in the early history of the said Territories, practical prohibition; and whereas, the administration of the ordinance by an executive in sympathy with the provisions of said ordinance did result in the entire suppression of drunkenness, and in the maintenance of law and order as per the evidence of the Royal Commission; therefore, your Committee beg leave to recommend that this Conference respectfully request the Hon. Minister of the Interior to use the same means to totally prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors in the Yukon Territory, and to abolish the issuance of further permits for the sale of liquor for beverage purposes.

6. That this Conference expresses its strong disapprobation of the tobacco habit, and would earnestly recommend to the members of the Church total abstinence from the habit, and also would urge upon the ministers and probationers, leaguers and teachers of the Church the necessity of education along this line, and that this resolution be read in our churches, schools and leagues.



7. Whereas, the Right Hon. Sir Wilfrid Laurier and his government have decided to submit the plebiscite to the electorate of Canada independently of any other issue, therefore the Manitoba and North-West Conference of the Methodist Church desires to express its approval and high appreciation of said action.

8. Whereas, the General Conference has declared that "The traffic in intoxicating liquors cannot be legalized without sin"; and whereas, the opportunity is to be given to the people of the Dominion in the near future to pronounce by means of a plebiscite its views and wishes respecting the prohibition of the traffic; therefore, we instruct all our ministers to preach sermons or hold public meetings as their judgment may indicate to be better, and use every legitimate means to secure a vote in favor of Prohibition, bringing the question prominently before their congregations at least two Sundays previous to the date fixed for the taking of the vote, and urging upon the people the sacred duty of every elector using his power of franchise for the extermination of this great evil.

3. That the consent of Conference be given to the sale by the trustees of Wesley Church, Winnipeg, of their old church property, situated in the city of Winnipeg, at the south-east corner of Ross and Nena streets, proceeds of sale to be applied to the payment of the mortgage, and the balance, if any, to be applied on the new church property, said property being more particularly described as follows: Lots 90, 90a and 90b, parish lot 9, St. John D. G. S., as shown on registered plan No. 432.

4. That the consent of Conference be given to the sale of Zion Church property at Winnipeg, by the trustees of the church, the proceeds to be applied in payment of mortgage on church, and balance in securing another site or erection of a new church, the property being lots 21 and 22 as shown on a plan of subdivision of lot 11, in the parish of St. John D. G. S., registered in the Winnipeg Land Titles office, Winnipeg Division, as No. 11, and being in accordance with sectional plan No. 1 of the special survey of the city of Winnipeg.

5. That the consent of Conference be given to the Brandon Trustee Board to sell their old church and parsonage properties, described as follows: Church property, lots 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30, block 29, sec. 23, plan 2, of the city of Brandon; parsonage property, lot 10, block 9, sec. 24, plan 4, city of Brandon. Proceeds to be applied in paying mortgage on old church, and the balance, if any, on new church.

6. That Conference give its consent to the sale by the trustees of the church at McGregor, Manitoba, of the present church building, the proceeds to be applied towards the erection of a new church.

7. That the action of Arden Mission in removing the church building at Winchester appointment to a site secured for the church at the south-east corner of section 27, tp. 15, r. 13 west, be approved, and that the trustees have permission to sell the land from which the building was removed, being one acre of land at the north-west corner of section 14, tp. 15, r. 13 west. Proceeds to be applied in paying cost of removal of church building.

8. That the Conference approves the action of the trustees of the Salem Church property, on what was the Salem and Tupper but now the Plumas Mission, in removing the church building from the south-west quarter section 18, tp. 16, r. 12 west to a site secured by the Board in the village of Plumas, and that the Conference consent to the sale by the said trustees of the land on which the church formerly stood, being a square of the area of an acre, a part of the south-west quarter section 18, tp. 16, r. 12 west, and that the proceeds be applied as the trustees may decide.

## REPORT OF THE MEMORIAL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee begs to report the following recommendations to Conference :

1. Memorials from Neepawa, Carman, Winnipeg and Crystal City districts, asking amendments of the Discipline *re* pastoral term and stationing of ministers, were read, and the following amendment is recommended : "That Conference memorialize the General Conference to amend section 140, subsection 4 of Discipline, by striking out the words 'in special cases where the necessities of the work seem to demand it.'" Adopted.

2. Memorial from the Carman District was received and the following is recommended : In the matter of a memorial from the Carman District, *re* transfers, your Committee begs to recommend as follows :

Whereas, the transfer of ministers from one Conference to another is not as easy as is desirable, or as the Church contemplated at the time of union ; and

Whereas, the transfer of ministers is not so frequent as the welfare of the Church demands, or the ministers and laymen were led to expect at the time the entire field was divided into separate conferences ; and

Whereas, the transferring power as at present constituted is practically in the hands of a single individual instead of a committee as originally provided ; and

Whereas, the operation of our transfer system as at present constituted threatens the very existence of the connexional principle under which we are organized as a Church :

Therefore, the Manitoba and North-West Conference strongly urges upon the General Conference the necessity of reviewing our entire polity relating to this subject, and the substitution of some method of transfer more in harmony with the principles of union, and better adapted to meet the just claims of ministers and circuits throughout our Canadian Methodism. Adopted.

3. *Re* memorial from Deloraine District, *re* membership roll and its revision, the following is recommended :

"That the General Conference be memorialized to amend Discipline, section 173, subsection 7, by adding to sub-paragraph 1 the words 'with an accurate list of their names.'" "

Your Committee further recommends that the following words be also added : "Subject to revision by the Official Board." Adopted.

4. Memorials from the Chairman of the Neepawa District were received as follows :

5. A memorial from the Winnipeg District, *re* the membership of the Sabbath School Committee, was received, asking this Conference to memorialize the General Conference to amend the Discipline, section 287, page 144, as follows: To strike out words "nor more than seven," and insert the words "nor more than five," to harmonize with clause 4, section 173, page 95. Your Committee recommends the adoption of this memorial. Adopted.

6. Memorials were received from the Deloraine and Moosomin districts, asking that the General Conference be memorialized to legislate to the end that alternate representatives to the District meetings, Annual Conferences and important Connexional Committees be appointed at the time of election of the regular representatives. Your Committee recommends the adoption of this memorial. Adopted.

7. A memorial from the Crystal City District was received, asking that the General Conference be memorialized to make presidents of Ladies' Aid Societies members of the Quarterly Official Boards. Your Committee recommends that no action be taken. Adopted.

8. A memorial was received from the Carman District, *re* the adoption of the sowing of wheat for Church purposes. As this matter is being considered by the Laymen's Association, your Committee recommends that no action be taken. Adopted.

9. The following memorial was received from the Chairman of the Neepawa District, and your Committee recommends its adoption:

Moved by Rev. J. Maclean, seconded by Rev. A. Andrews, and Resolved,—That we memorialize the General Conference as follows: That the Superintendent of a Circuit or Mission leave for his successor a register of all the adherents of the Church, together with the number of young people in each of the families, and that the Discipline, par. 174, subsection 6, be so amended. Adopted.

10. A memorial was received from the Calgary District, *re* making circuit estimates at the May meeting of the Quarterly Official Board. Your Committee recommends that no action be taken. Adopted.

11. A memorial was received from the Neepawa District, *re* the Superintendent of Missions. Your Committee recommends its reference to the Missionary Committee. Adopted.

12. A memorial was received from the Winnipeg District, *re* formation of new missions. Your Committee recommends its reference to the Missionary Committee. Adopted.

13. The following memorial was received from the Brandon District, and your Committee recommends its adoption:

Whereas, a memorial has been presented to this District Meeting from the Souris Quarterly Official Board in reference to relations with other denominations for the more economical working of the weaker fields; be it therefore

Resolved,—That this District Meeting respectfully requests the Conference to publish in our Minutes for the coming year, the delivery of our General Conference on this important question, that it may come more fully before our people.

14. A memorial was received from the Brandon District, *re* Sunday School Normal course for probationers. Your Committee recommends

that no action be taken, as though it recognizes the value of the suggestion it believes it to be at present impracticable. Adopted.

15. The following resolution was received, and your Committee recommends that no action be taken:

That we memorialize the General Conference to appoint a committee to revise and amend, either during the sessions of the Conference or during the next quadrennium, the ritual of our Church so that it may be brought in form and terminology more into accord with present-day Methodist thought, spirit and usage. Adopted.

16. A resolution moved by Rev. J. W. Dickinson, seconded by Mr. Thompson, was received, *re* the invitation of ministers for a fourth or fifth year. Your Committee recommends that no action be taken, as the resolution encroaches on the prerogative of the Stationing Committee and is contrary to the polity of the Church. Adopted.

17. The following resolution was received: That this Committee memorialize the General Conference to provide that missionaries returning from the mission field be transferred either into the Conference from which they came or to some other in the home field without equivalent. Your Committee recommends the adoption of this resolution. Adopted.

18. The following resolution, moved by Rev. F. B. Stacey, seconded by Rev. J. W. Bell, was received. Your Committee recommends its adoption, with the addition of the words "as at present in this Conference":

That in the judgment of this Conference it is necessary that such legislation be enacted by the General Conference on the principle of assessment on items of salary and connexional funds, as will provide the minimum amount of money necessary for carrying on the work of the Church during the quadrennium, as at present in this Conference. Adopted.

19. The following resolution was received: That the General Conference be memorialized to eliminate section 110, subsec. 14, from the Discipline. Your Committee recommends that the resolution be adopted. Adopted.

#### DELIVERANCE OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE.

The following is the deliverance of the General Conference referred to in the above memorial:

Whereas, the General Conference has already affirmed its willingness to negotiate with other branches of the Protestant Church on the question of Union; and

Whereas, the needs of the missionary work at home and abroad call more forcibly than ever for economy, for mutual recognition of sister churches and for co-operation; therefore

*Resolved*,—1. That it is desirable, in the judgment of this Conference, to establish a Federal Court, composed of representatives of negotiating churches.

2. That such court, when established, shall not have power to deal with questions of creed or discipline, or with any question vitally affecting the independence of any of the negotiating churches.

3. That the General Conference of the Methodist Church now, on its part, appoints the following persons to be its representatives in such Federal Court, viz.:

The composition of the Methodist section of the court shall be as follows:

1. It shall consist of three sections—(a) An Eastern Section, for the Maritime Provinces; (b) a Central Section, for Quebec and Ontario; and (c) a Western Section, for Manitoba and all the West.

2. Each section shall organize separately, and shall have power independently of other sections to consult and act with representatives of other churches in the territory assigned to them.

3. The officers of the Central Section shall call the whole court when a majority of the several sections shall deem it necessary.

The functions of the court shall be to consult and act with the representatives of other churches with a view to co-operation and economy in regard to "dependent charges" within their territory.

A copy of this action, with the preamble and resolutions, shall be sent to the following Church courts:

1. The Presbyterian General Assembly.
2. The Baptist Missionary Society.
3. The Congregational Union.

#### REPORT OF THE MISSIONARY COMMITTEE.

*Re* the following resolution from the Moosomin District—"Whereas, Brother Attwood's salary is below the average; and whereas, he never received over \$250 until this year, the case be referred to the favorable consideration of the Missionary Committee"—the following is the action of the Committee: Referred back to the Conference, with the recommendation that it be forwarded to the Conference Missionary Committee.

*Re* resolution from Portage la Prairie District, referring to the application of Rev. S. O. Irvine, in connection with the expense of supply during his affliction, the following was the action of the Committee:

"Whereas, Brother Irvine, while on the Moosomin District in the Conference year, 1893-94, was ill with inflammatory rheumatism for some three months, during which his circuit had to be supplied; and whereas, through oversight some irregularity in the application for remuneration took place, in consequence of which Brother Irvine has suffered loss; and whereas, the then Chairman of the Moosomin District acknowledges the justice of Brother Irvine's claim, this Committee would recommend that the claim of \$40 be referred to the favorable consideration of the Executive of the Missionary Board for payment."



*Re* resolution of Portage la Prairie District, in reference to the case of affliction in the family of the Rev. J. Peters, involving an expenditure of \$30 for medical services, your Committee refer the request back to the Conference, with the recommendation that it be forwarded through the Chairman of the Portage la Prairie District to the Executive of Missions.

*Re* resolution from the Winnipeg District—"Resolved, that Conference be requested to take the proper steps to secure the appointment of one or more colporteurs or missionaries, to work amongst the foreign population, particularly the Galicians, and to adopt ways and means for carrying on the work"—the following is the action of the Committee:

"That in view of the very meagre information received touching work amongst the large foreign population of this country, and the lack of funds for carrying on such work, your Committee cannot see its way clear at present to make any recommendations concerning the same."

In reference to the memorial of the Managers of the Woman's Missionary Society, regarding the equipment of hospitals and the supplying of medical attendants to the Indians, the Committee recommend that, whereas the whole matter is now before the General Board, no action be taken.

Memorial from the Winnipeg District, which reads as follows:

"Resolved, that this District Meeting memorialize the Annual Conference to memorialize the General Conference to amend Discipline by addition of a clause, to be clause 268, 'Formation of New Missions,' to read as follows: That all recommendations for the formation of new missions shall be referred to a standing committee of the Conference, who shall consider such recommendations. Each recommendation for the formation of a new mission shall state the relation of the proposed new mission to the existing circuits or missions adjoining or surrounding it, the number and location of the appointments and the prospective income. The standing committee shall report these facts in the case of each recommendation made by them to the Annual Conference, at least one session previous to the reading of the final draft of the stations. In each and every case a two-thirds vote of the Annual Conference shall be necessary to create a new mission. The existing clause 268 to stand as a separate clause from the words 'No new home mission shall be formed,' p. 133."

The following is the recommendation of the Committee *re* the above matter: "Whereas, the matter is already provided for—first, by action of the District Meeting; secondly, by the Stationing Committee; and finally, by a two-thirds vote of the Conference, giving power to form any mission—this Committee recommended that no action be taken."

*Re* resolution from the Lake Winnipeg and Saskatchewan District, which reads as follows:

"Moved by Rev. O. German, seconded by Rev. C. E. Somerset, and

"Resolved,—That whereas the necessities of the Indian work demand constant and intimate supervision, on the part of both the Church and the Government, in order to secure the best possible results; therefore, be it resolved, that this District Meeting request the Annual Conference to memorialize the General Conference to appoint an agent who shall be in complete and continuous relation with the Indians, the Missionary Society and the Government,"

Second resolution from the Lake Winnipeg and Saskatchewan District, which reads as follows:

"Moved by Rev. E. B. Glass, seconded by Rev. C. E. Somerset, and

"Resolved,—That we are pleased with the action of the last Conference in uniting the eastern and western sections of the Indian work, with results of the Chairman's visit to Lake Winnipeg and his conference with the people and the brethren; that we strongly advocate the continuance of this union in order that all matters relating to advancement amongst these Indians may have the fullest consideration of the Church and Government, and that there may be more concerted action on the part of the brethren in the Indian work."

Your Committee recommend the Conference to forward this to the Stationing Committee.

Regarding the following memorial in reference to the continuation of the office of Missionary Superintendent:

"Whereas, the development of that portion of Canada lying west of the Great Lakes is but in its infancy, and the development of our Church must keep pace with the needs of a developing country, and realizing how much the present status of Methodism in the West is due to the work and supervision of the Superintendent of Missions, and that the future, even more than the past, requires such a superintendency, and that it would be a disaster to our beloved Methodism to discontinue the office at this critical stage, we would strongly urge upon the Manitoba and North-West Conference to memorialize the General Conference to continue the office of superintendency of missions for the West,"

The Committee recommend that the Conference forward this memorial as an expression of its deep conviction and judgment on the subject to the General Conference.

## REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee on the State of the Work beg leave to report as follows:

1. The work of the Church having been fully reported by the several committees appointed to examine its several departments, it remains for us merely to emphasize some of its leading features and to make some suggestive comparisons. In every direction there has been very encouraging progress.

2. The membership of the Church shows an increase this year of 1,057, while in the quadrennium the increase has been 2,692. The increase of the past year is therefore nearly one-half of that of the quadrennium. Of this increase 752 have been received on trial.

3. We are pleased to note the increase this year in the amount raised for ministerial support, viz., \$5,516 for the year. We deem it of great importance that this department of our finances should receive increased attention, so that the average salaries of our ministers and probationers may be materially raised.

4. The growth of the connexional spirit in our Church is very apparent in the increased contributions to the various connexional funds as well as in other directions.

The increase in the Missionary Fund for the year, as reported by the Statistical Committee, is \$2,197. The increase for the quadrennium is \$3,713.74.

The Contingent Fund shows the gratifying advance of from \$347 in 1897 to \$724 in 1898.

We would be pleased to see similar advance in the Educational Fund of our Church.

5. The value of our church property has grown during the quadrennium from \$479,195 to \$646,819, an increase of \$167,624. This includes Wesley College. Very material progress, too, has been made in the reduction of our church and parsonage debts.

6. We simply refer with thankfulness and pride to the magnificent growth of Wesley College as it rapidly advances to take a place in the front rank of the educational institutions of this country. We rejoice in the distinguished honors won in the recent university examinations.

7. We would call attention to the encouraging signs of work among our children and young people. In this connection we note (a) the catechism is receiving increased attention, 512 more scholars than last year being engaged in its study; (b) the number of catechumens also shows an increase of 52; (c) there is a marked growth of the missionary spirit. The Sunday Schools contribute \$47.56, and the Epworth Leagues \$470 more than last year for this purpose. We would urge the still further systematic cultivation of the missionary spirit among our scholars and young people through the medium of schools and leagues and along the lines of our General Missionary Society's work.

8. We regret exceedingly to report a decrease in the number of subscribers for the *Christian Guardian*. We would earnestly urge that in the interest of every enterprise of our Church more persistent and systematic effort be made by our ministers to put this periodical in every Methodist home.

9. Our Indian work presents many encouraging features. Larger and cleaner homes are multiplying. A greater interest is being taken in the art of husbandry, and a stronger desire evinced for education, while the results of the year's work in the industrial and day schools are quite apparent. There has been, also, very gratifying spiritual growth.

## REPORT OF LAYMEN'S ASSOCIATION.

The following report of the Laymen's Association was received at one of the sessions of Conference, and on motion it was resolved to insert it in the Minutes :

*To the Laymen's Association of the Manitoba and North-West Conference.*

Your Committee appointed to consider the different schemes suggested and used in this Conference for the purpose of raising finances beg leave to report as follows :

1. We approve of the envelope system and would recommend its use wherever practicable.
2. We also approve of the voluntary system of setting apart a portion of the crop by our farmers for the purposes of church work, and wherever this can be done we would recommend its adoption.
3. We notice that the principle of tithing and systematic giving, and the earnest and prompt efforts of our stewards early in the year are bearing good fruit in securing a uniformity in giving and in having sufficient funds on hand in good time.
4. While we realize the importance and usefulness of the many schemes suggested we think these are only matters of detail, and such systems should be adopted by our several stewards as will best suit their own peculiar circumstances.
5. We would, however, recommend that our people be educated along the line of systematic giving, and that the stewards follow the instructions laid down in our Discipline in regard to ministerial support by arranging for subscriptions, either by envelope, share of crop, or in whatever manner seems most suitable at the beginning of the year, and that each steward shall report at the August Quarterly Meeting the result of such canvass so that the appropriations may be based on correct estimates.

*Re* THANKS TO RAILROAD COMPANIES.

On motion, it was resolved that the thanks of this Conference be given to the various railroad companies who so kindly granted a reduction in rates to those attending the sessions of this Conference.

On motion, it was resolved that this Conference has heard with great interest the comprehensive address of Mrs. Carcary, Corresponding Secretary of the Manitoba and North-West Branch of the Woman's Missionary Society, and would assure her and our sisters whom she represents of our deep and earnest desire that God's blessing may rest on the important work which the women of this Society have on hand, and it will be to us a satisfaction to give them all the assistance in our power, so as to insure for them a still greater success. And we do this the more cheerfully because we are satisfied that their Society is helpful to our circuit work, and in many ways we feel that they are successful and honored helpers with us in the cause of Christ at home and abroad.

MISCELLANEOUS RESOLUTIONS.

*Re* "MANITOBA MEMORIES."

On motion, it was resolved that we respectfully call the attention of the Methodist people within the bounds of the Conference to one of the most instructive volumes ever published, relating to the early history of Methodism in Manitoba and the North-West, viz., "Manitoba Memories," by Rev. Geo. Young, D.D., and we would urge upon all our people to secure copies for the use of their families and Sunday School libraries.

*Re* NEW CATECHISM.

On motion, it was resolved that the ministers and probationers within the bounds of the Conference use their influence to introduce the new catechism into the Sabbath Schools, Leagues and families, for the purpose



of instructing young and old in the doctrines of Methodism. This is one of the most important agencies for making our Church intensely spiritual, effective in building Christian character and ensuring loyalty to our faith and practice.

*Re* DELEGATES' EXPENSES.

On motion, it was resolved that it be an instruction to ministers and to the Official Board of each circuit and mission, to make provision by an appropriation or collection for raising a general fund to defray the expenses of both ministerial and lay delegates attending the sessions of the Annual Conference.

*Re* PRICE OF "CHRISTIAN GUARDIAN."

On motion, it was resolved that we recommend that the subscription price of the *Guardian* be continued at one dollar, believing that it is in the best interests of our Church to increase its circulation.

*Re* GALICIANS.

On motion, it was resolved that the Chairmen of Districts be a committee to gather information respecting the Galicians, and to suggest methods of reaching them, said Committee to report to the Conference Special Committee. The Chairman of Neepawa District to be the Convener.

*Re* COLPORTAGE AMONG IMMIGRANTS.

On motion, it was resolved that this Conference, having heard of the great need for colportage work in connection with the immigrants so numerously coming into the Province of Manitoba and the North-West Territories, thereby throwing upon the Christian people of this Dominion the responsibility of giving to them, not only the Bible in their own language, but also such religious instruction as would be possible in the case; and further realizing the impossibility of this Conference assuming the responsibility this year, we would respectfully request the Upper Canada Bible Society to appoint colporteurs at as early a date as possible, and that to make this resolution effective, we appoint the President, Secretary and Revs. J. Dyke, S. Cleaver and T. L. Morden to draft a letter and forward it to the office of the said Society, so that immediate action may be taken.

*Re* TWENTIETH CENTURY FUND.

On motion, it was resolved that this Conference, having read with deep interest the proposal to mark the opening of the twentieth century by the raising of "a Million Dollar Fund" for church purposes, heartily endorses the scheme, and trusts that the General Conference will formulate a plan for the working of the same and place it before our people.

*Re* DECISIONS OF THE COURT OF APPEAL.

On motion, it was resolved that this Conference memorialize the General Conference to add an appendix to the Discipline containing the decisions of Court of Appeal and the General Conference on the questions of law

*Re* COURSE OF STUDY.

On motion, it was resolved that this Conference memorialize the General Conference to so amend the course of study that English Bible will be required in every year including the preliminary, and that some suitable commentary be designated as a help in said subject.

*Re* COURSE OF STUDY.

On motion, it was resolved that this Conference memorialize the General Conference to add to the course of study for students attending college the subjects of physics or chemistry, allowing the student to choose between these.

*Re* APPOINTMENT OF WESLEY COLLEGE BOARD.

On motion, it was resolved that, in the judgment of this Conference, it is desirable that at least one-half of the members of the Wesley College Board be appointed by this Annual Conference, and we memorialize the General Conference to enact such legislation as will secure this end.

*Re* NOTICE OF MOTION CONCERNING THE DIVISION OF CONFERENCE.

On motion, it was resolved that the following resolution, introduced by Rev. O. Darwin, be regarded as a notice of motion for the Annual Conference of 1899:

That whereas, this Conference has grown to such proportions that it is becoming difficult to find places large enough to accommodate it; and whereas, a resolution was passed by the General Conference at the session of 1890, authorizing the organization of a North-West Conference under certain conditions, we believe therefore that the time has now come when such organization of a Conference for the North-West should take place.

*Re* COMPENSATION TO THE JOURNAL SECRETARY.

On motion, it was resolved that Rev. W. P. Goard receive the sum of \$20 in recognition of his faithful discharge of the duties of Journal Secretary for the past three years.

*Re* RESPONSIBILITY FOR WORK.

On motion, it was resolved that ministers changing this year shall be responsible on their old fields for the remaining Sabbaths in June.

*Re* BILLETING NEXT YEAR.

On motion, it was resolved that the standing resolution in the Minutes of Conference of 1897 be reaffirmed.

### CONFERENCE ANNIVERSARIES.

The Conference Prayer Meeting was led by the President from 11.30 to 12 o'clock on Friday, June 3rd.

## PASTORAL ADDRESS.

DEARLY BELOVED BRETHREN,—We greet you with loving gratitude to our Father in heaven, for the many mercies which, by His gracious providence, have marked the past Conferential year. The blessings of life, physical health, mental faculties, a Christian land, wherein exists the principles of civil and religious liberty, second to no other land in the world, should fill our hearts with devout gratitude to the "Father of all mercies and the God of all grace."

It is right and beneficial for us to clearly recognize these advantages, and use them for the ministry of humanity, the enlargement of culture, and the wider development of character after the pattern of our risen Lord. But whilst we express our heartfelt thanks for what may be termed temporal mercies, we exhort you to be increasingly mindful of those spiritual obligations and attainments which are the express command of God, and obedience to which are absolutely necessary to secure Divine favor, growth in grace, and the possession of eternal life. We have great reason to rejoice that as a Church we have been permitted to take so prominent a part in the intellectual, moral and spiritual development of this great western land. Within the space of a few short years we have acquired property valued at \$531,519, and a membership of 17,692. But whilst the tendency of the age is to emphasize material results, let us never cease by prayer and consecrated effort to experience and manifest those spiritual forces, without which the greatest human organization is but a "valley of dry bones."

We ask your prayerful and active co-operation in the several departments of Christian efforts. We desire that the necessity and privileges of early conversion to God be kept prominent in our Sunday School work. Whilst great attention is given to the knowledge of the letter, let us seek earnestly to receive that spirit which enlightens the mind, cleanses and gives life to the soul. In this work let parents, teachers and pastors so blend their efforts that our young people may become "pillars in the house of our God." The Home Department of the Sunday School for the study of the lessons is earnestly commended as an interesting and useful branch of biblical study, the faithful practice of which will not only prove a blessing to adults, but will enable them to interest and assist the younger members of the Church and Sunday School.

Let the officers and members of our Epworth Leagues carefully guard the subtle danger of giving undue attention to machinery routine, and underestimating or neglecting a growing culture and a deepening spiritual life. We respectfully urge that catechumen classes be formed wherever practicable, and our new catechism be diligently and wisely used.

In association with these agencies for the young it is imperative that all the members of our Church give close attention to the sacraments of

baptism and the Lord's Supper. The baptism of our children is not merely the giving of a name, but the solemn dedication of the child to God, and its public acknowledgment as a member of the body of Christ. The observance of the sacred ordinance of baptism should not be allowed to deteriorate into a mere social custom, or an empty formality. Let all baptisms, wherever practicable, be performed in the public service, where the minister shall explain the duties, privileges and responsibilities of parents, teachers and guardians. The influence of home upon the young life of our Church is of vast importance, touching as it does the springs of life and influencing the future career. We urge our pastors in their exalted work to give due prominence to doctrinal teaching, evangelistic work, and in their pastoral visits labor diligently to develop piety in the homes of the congregations.

The observance of the Sabbath as a day of rest and the worship of Almighty God is of vital importance to the individual and the nation. While there is a tendency to manifest considerable latitude in the matter of amusements on the Lord's Day, let our people do all they can to foster and develop a faithful observance of the sacred day of rest and devotion. During the year it is expected that the plebiscite will be submitted to the electorate of the Dominion. Whatever others may do, we trust that every voter in the Methodist Church will stand loyally for God and humanity as against that Satanic octopus—the liquor traffic.

We congratulate you upon the deepening sympathy and support which is being manifested for our Connexional Funds, and the growing interest the Church is taking in Wesley College and the missionary activities of our domestic and foreign fields. Let us be true to the principles, practices and doctrines of our beloved Methodism. Let us not depart from the simple teachings of the New Testament, a cultured and converted ministry, a saved and sanctified people whose time, talents, energies and entire life are consecrated to the salvation of men and the glory of God. "Then God, even our God, shall bless us, and cause His face to shine upon us."
